

Beineinu - Between Us

Last month's activities epitomized both our congregation's vibrancy and core values. Among them, we had one of the largest, most festive Purim celebrations ever. Our weeklong celebration had more events and ways to celebrate the holiday than any other in town.

We also celebrated Shabbat Together, an extraordinary initiative undertaken by our current Fellows in the Edna and Nat Marcus Leadership Institute. Shabbat dinners were simultaneously held in the homes of congregants throughout the area, with other congregants as their guests around the table. In all, more than 170 members shared in the founding experience of this "happening." The Marcus Fellows chose to create this event as their group project because they believe the most fundamental thing we can do as a congregation is to build meaningful connections with each other, and because the Shabbat experience is so central to who we are. Yashar Koach and deep thanks to our Marcus Fellows for this gift to the congregation.

Our congregation again sent a delegation to the AIPAC Policy Conference. Over 18,000 people of all backgrounds learned about Israel's successes and challenges. We heard from leading politicians and heads of state, explored issues with top political, military and strategic analysts and immersed ourselves in Israeli culture. Together, we blanketed Capitol Hill and lobbied for the \$3.1 billion in aid included in the US-Israeli memorandum of understanding, additional monies for missile defense, anti-BDS legislation and increased sanctions against Iran. Passover ranks as a favorite holiday for our family to get together. Our older son's birthday often falls during the hag and it is not a culinary delight to celebrate with a kosher for Passover birthday cake – cake meal just doesn't do justice to his favorite carrot cake. This year, though, our birthday

celebrant won't be visiting, so that problem unfortunately vanishes.

Long in advance of the holiday, we know which of our children, grandchildren and extended family members will join us for seders. We miss those who cannot join us, but are delighted that our children are now creating their own traditions. We welcome old friends who are like family and also include new friends. We strive to make our Passover seders both meaningful and inclusive.

With its symbolism and ceremony, the seders are a feast for our senses, as we engage in the sights, smells, sounds, tastes and feel of the holiday. We delight in the visual cues of the seder plate with the iconic symbols of the haq that help demonstrate and tell the story of the Exodus. We relish the aromas of the hearty and delicious festive meal that follows the first half of the seder, enjoy the first crunch of matzah, count our blessings when enjoying the sweet melody of a child singing the Four Questions and enjoy enthusiastic and spirited singing at the conclusion of the meal. There is always a moment of hesitation when sampling the sinus-clearing sting of marror, which can be dulled by a chaser of savory or sweet charoset. Of course, there is always the children's favorite - the hunt for the afikomen.

After all of the cleaning, planning, shopping and cooking are complete, I look forward to joining with all of you at our Passover Festival Services. Mark joins me in wishing you and your loved ones a happy and kosher Pesach.

"In every generation a person is obligated to see oneself as though one had gone forth from Egypt." (Passover Hagaadah)

The Haggadah is not an ancient history book that we dust off each spring and read as a foreign history. We are

required to encounter the Exodus story each year as our own unique stories. Not simply as a nation saved from Egyptian oppression more than 3,000 years ago, as if looking in a mirror, the Passover liberation is our story of freedom. Perhaps at seder, we engage in discussion to share stories of how our families left their lands and immigrated to America. We may share our own personal struggles with illness, insecurity or difficulty in the context of a personal Exodus. The above line in the Haggadah isn't meant solely for us to look internally to our own struggles, but also outward.

The seder prompts us to look at our community and our world to confront today's enslavements. Certainly, we can discuss how technology, social media, political discourse and other topics "enslave" us, hampering our daily lives. At seder, we can also discuss the realities of the "slavery" that still exists - the societal ills both in America and across the world - for example, the opioid epidemic and human trafficking. The Haggadah reminds us that even though we may be a small group sitting at the seder table (or on the floor) as we hold our sedarim, we open the door to remind us not only of the coming of Elijah and G-d's redemption, but also that we are part of the larger community and world. At our seder, we pass around a mirror when we come to this line, so we can look inside our own struggles and revel in our redemption, but we also look at each other and open our door to the world. May we all work to bring our world closer to redemption, freedom and equality.

Education



"Whoever repeats a statement in the name of the one who said it brings redemption to the world." (Pirkei Avot 6:6)

When news outlets report, how do they determine the facts of the case? How do they ensure their reporting is accurate? We always want to know whether we

can trust what we hear, whether from a friend, teacher, website or anywhere else. And while these questions are particularly resonant in today's world, they are by no means new questions. Our sages have always believed in the importance of citing our sources and giving credit for another's statements or ideas. In the Talmud, statements of Jewish law are always spoken in the name of one's teacher (or student!), *B'shem Omro*.

At B'nai Jeshurun's Youth & Learning Center, we are endeavoring to show our students how to understand Jewish values, not only in the classroom, but also throughout the community. One way we do that is by bringing our classes to new places to discuss and think about how Jewish values can be applied in different settings. Last month, our 7th and 8th grade students had the opportunity to explore the Jewish value of B'shem Omro with a visit to NBC WKYC Channel 3 studios in downtown Cleveland. We toured the studio, had a conversation with the news director and reporters about how they verify their sources and how they choose what to report. We also discussed how the Torah and Talmud deal with quoting sources. We then had the unique opportunity to watch the news live in-studio and to see the news production control room in action.

All in all, this was a very successful trip and we look forward to many more opportunities for our students to learn about Jewish values in action throughout the city!




