Beineinu - Between Us



Join me to explore the rich Jewish history of Poland this summer June 28 - July 6. Stand as witnesses to the Holocaust and discover the vibrant rebirth of Jewish life. This trip has a special component for bicyclists of all ability levels. We will join the <u>Ride for the Living</u> from the gates of Auschwitz to the JCC in Krakow, celebrating the vibrant resurgent Jewish culture, which represents a victory over Hitler. But, this amazing trip is intended for non-bikers as well, so read on!

Journey through "pre-war Warsaw" along the Royal Route featuring many castles and palaces. Walk through charming Old Town with its 15th century Jewish roots. Visit Grzybowski square, for centuries, the heart of the Jewish community. Visit the Nozyk Synagogue, the only Warsaw synagogue to survive World War II and the Communists. Meet with the Chief Rabbi of Poland and members of the Jewish community. Explore the Emanuel Ringelblum Jewish Historical Institute, the largest repository of Polish Jewish material heritage in the world. The Institute's archives document daily life and death in the Warsaw Ghetto. Stand at the Umschlagpaltz Memorial commemorating the deportation of 300,000 Jews to Treblinka. Walk the Route of Martyrdom and Struggle, which includes Mila 18, the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising Memorial. Tour the new Polin Museum, which memorializes the past and honors 1,000 years of the Polish Jewish experience.

In Krakow, share in a private tour of Auschwitz-Birkenau and a memorial ceremony with other <u>Ride for the Living</u> participants from around the world. Then, spend the evening with Krakow Jewish community members. Partake in Jewish Cultural Festival events or a selection of tours of the Old Town in Krakow, the Jewish Quarter of Kazimierz, the former Krakow Ghetto, or local food establishments. Enjoy an openair musical concert and havdallah.

The <u>Ride for the Living</u> is a flat, easy ride of 60 miles with a 14-mile option as well. Non-riders have a separate track of educational, historical and community programming. Cyclists must raise \$1,000, or \$500 if 29 years old or younger. By the time you receive this, pricing and registration should be in place. Contact Diane Dronzek in the synagogue office. I look forward to journeying with you into our past and our future!

Smart End of Year Giving

- Individuals who are at least 70 1/2 years old may distribute up to \$100,000 per year tax free from their Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to the synagogue or other qualified institutions. These distributions may count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and may exceed your RMD if they total less than \$100,000.

President's Message



For those who think the age of miracles has past, I recommend Dr. Sima Goel's book, "Fleeing the Hijab, A Jewish Woman's Escape from Iran." Listening to her speak recently at a Federation women's event was a reminder that miracles still happen in our lifetime. Sima

shared the incredibly moving story of her clandestine escape from Ayatollah Khomeini's Iran. In 1982, as a 17 year old girl, she was forced to flee from her home and loving family and make her way across the Iranian desert with the help of untrustworthy smugglers. Her successful arrival in Pakistan was miraculous as was the rest of her journey to freedom in Canada. Sima's story moved many of us to tears as she reminded us that the Jewish people are a "people of miracles" and that her survival is a miracle, as is the survival of Jews from the Holocaust as well as the existence and survival of the State of Israel.

Jewish history has many miracles, including the burning bush, the parting of the Red Sea and even creation itself. We have heard so many times that they have lost their sense of awe. Yet, when Sima shared her story, we all realized that her presence before us was a miracle in itself.

Let's all remember to appreciate the everyday miracles as well as the big miracles in our lives, especially as we approach Hanukkah. The story of Hanukkah is a story of miracles, when one day's supply of oil lasted for eight days and when the Maccabees fought and won against the mighty Greek army. As you light your own menorah, hopefully surrounded by friends and/or family, take stock of all the miracles with which we are blessed.

Happy Hanukkah! The first candle lighting is on Sunday evening, December 22. If you are in town, plan to join us for the synagogue Hanukkah party on Monday evening, December 23. RSVP requested.

Cantor's Corner



Two miracles occurred leading to the creation of Hanukkah. The Hasmoneans defeated the Greek army even though vastly outnumbered. The second miracle was finding one last jar of oil. This oil had the seal of the high priest. Upon lighting the menorah, the expectation was that it

would last for one day. However, it lasted eight days.

In the Babylonian Talmud, it only lists the burning of the oil as the miracle that took place. Furthermore, if there was enough oil to last 24 hours, shouldn't the holiday be seven days? Many scholars offer a variety of answers. The first day actually commemorates only the military victory. The other seven days are dedicated to the miraculous oil.

After the menorah was filled with oil, the jar remained full. One of the very harsh decrees of the Greeks was to circumcision. Upon the great victory over Greeks, the Hasmoneans rejoiced over the return of circumcision. The very fact that they lit lamps with an expectation of 24 hours of burning showed they did not despair. There was a commandment to have the Ner Tamid (permanent light) burn. They still went ahead with faith, seizing this opportunity to do a mitzvah. This is a wonderful lesson for us. While we do not know what the future holds, we should always jump at the opportunity to do a mitzvah. Lastly, while the Holy Temple was repaired after the Greeks, eventually it was destroyed. The miracle of the oil forever endured. This is why we light daily during Hanukkah. We also maintain the tradition of having a Ner Tamid in our synagogues.

Even though we have suffered through traumatic periods, we will continue to persevere. We are living in difficult times where people harbor hatred towards us. They want to destroy us and extinguish our spirit. May Hanukkah be a reminder that we will endure forever under the protective care of G-d. Sabrina, Shaina, Abby and I wish you all a Hanukkah sameach. Have a wonderful holiday.

Jacob and Esau: Analyzing an Embrace

This month, we read *Parashat Vayishlach*, where we see Esau embrace Jacob after the two come together for the first time after years apart (Gen. 33:4). The last time we heard from Esau, however, he was intent on killing Jacob, so how are we to

accept that Esau actually embraced his brother? The Torah itself leads us to think something may not be right by placing dots above the letters of the word 'embrace.' These dots themselves serve as a type of *midrash*, commentary within the Torah scroll itself, with scholars debating the true nature of this embrace for millennia.

Rabbi Shimon ben Eliezer in the *midrash* nearly 2,000 years ago (Beresheet Rabbah, Vayishlach 78:9), believes that Esau "embraced [Jacob] with all his heart." A second rabbi, Yannai, questions his colleague, "If so, why is the word dotted? [The dots] teach us that Esau wished to bite him, but Jacob's neck was turned to marble and that wicked man's teeth were blunted and loosened. Hence, 'And they wept': one wept because of his neck and the other wept because of his teeth." Rabbi Yannai is unable to accept that this could possibly have been an embrace motivated by love, and in fact rejects the idea that this was a kiss at all, but rather a bite. Even Rabbi Shimon ben Eliezer is quoted as saying, "But surely all Esau's deeds were motivated by hate, except this one, which was inspired by love!"

Is it possible when reading the Torah to see Esau as a character who overcame his desire to kill Jacob, embracing him and regretting his earlier thoughts? Or must we view him as a wicked character bent on destroying his brother? Perhaps we can understand Esau's dislike for Jacob given the trickery Jacob used in order to obtain his father's blessing, even if it doesn't warrant killing him.

We often come to situations with preconceived notions about what people are like. As we navigate an increasingly complex and divided world, we must remember how easy it is for these notions to cloud any possibility of seeing good. Let us strive to always find the good in others.



Weingold Guest Scholar



The Dilemmas of Modern Israel: For much of the 20th century, the central challenge of Israel and its supporters was existential – to survive and hopefully thrive in one of the most hostile environments in the world. Today, those challenges have shifted. While Israel must always be vigilant, and dangers still abound, the Start-up

Nation now has the ability to expend more resources and thought not merely to questions of security and survival, but to questions of meaning and purpose. The issue is no longer exclusively to be, but who to be? We will attempt to understand where Israeli society now finds itself, and more importantly, where it can and ought to go. Rabbi Hartman is co-director of Israel's Shalom Hartman Institute. He holds an MA in Political Philosophy from NYU, an MA in Religion from Temple University and a PhD in Jewish Philosophy from Hebrew University.

What's Jewish in a Jewish Democracy?: Israel defines itself as a Jewish Democratic State. Since its inception, however, Israeli society has never developed a coherent theory, or reached a consensus about what this means. What is Jewish about a Jewish State? What is the relationship between State and religion? How do we define the Jewish dimension of Israel, when rather than uniting Jews, it is that which separates us?

Saturday, December 7

Nationalism and the Jewish Nation State: Zionism was founded in order to support and actualize the nationalist aspirations of the Jewish people. Israel is the realization of this aspiration – the Nation State of the Jewish people. What does Jewish nationalism mean? In an era where nationalism has become a partisan category, how do we understand and defend it? In an era where nationalist movements around the world are often associated with ultra-nationalism and even fascism, how does Israel maintain its identity and avoid the moral pitfalls facing so much of 21st century nationalism?

Israel's Nation State Law - A Careful Reading and Analysis: In 2018, Israel passed the Basic Law: Israel – The Nation State of the Jewish People. It was coined by its opponents as an Apartheid Law and a moral abomination, and by its supporters as a moral and legal necessity and an essential safety net for Israel as a Jewish State. In this session, we will analyze its components, and explore its strengths, weaknesses and challenges.

Israel, the Palestinians and a Future for the Peace Process: Jews have yearned for and prayed for peace since our inception. However, despite its enormous achievements, this objective still eludes modern Israel. Israelis and Palestinians seem farther away from peace than ever-negotiations are non-existent and the majority in both populations believe it is unattainable. How have we moved from the hopes of Oslo to the current statusquo of despair? Has Israeli society changed, and if so, why? Can Israel move peace from the domain of prayer to political policy?






