HANUKKAH

Hanukkah begins in Kislev, but spills into the month of Tevet. Its centerpiece is the 10<sup>th</sup> of Tevet, a fast day which commemorates the beginning of the Babylonian siege of Jerusalem which led to the downfall of the city and the destruction of the Temple. How strange that only a mere 7 or 8 days after we celebrate the joyous rededication of the Temple by the Maccabees (at a much later date),

we immerse ourselves in mourning for the first and second Temples' destruction. Generally, we think of the rhythms of Jewish life leading us from sadness to joy. What, then, do we make of this juxtaposition which seems to move in the opposite direction?

The kabbalistic work, *Sefer Yetzirah*, associates each month with a different Hebrew letter and part of the body. Tevet is associated with the Hebrew letter *ayin* and with the liver. The *ayin* leans back at the top right, the beginning of the letter, which is topped by a crown that looks like a flame. The bold line then moves diagonally – forward and down to the right. The crown/flame at the start of the letter symbolizes the light of Hanukkah. The bold diagonal line sweeping downward and forward symbolizes our taking that light and planting it deep within ourselves. It also symbolizes that we must always be able to move forward. The liver, according to Kabbalah, is the seat of our negative reactive emotions: sadness, fear, anger, jealousy. As the light descends within us, it illuminates and washes away those negative emotions, filling us instead with peace and joy.

This is why only Hanukkah crosses over from a month of joy to a month of sadness. If we internalize the light of Hanukkah, it becomes the antidote to the darkness that lies ahead. The Kabbalists taught that the light of the Hanukkah candles continue to burn within us for the entire month of Tevet and beyond, for a full 30 days after the conclusion of Hanukkah.

Our task is to nurture that light within us by focusing on the miracle of God's redemptive love, letting it wash over us, and seeking to let go of those negative emotions. Like the central line that forms the core of the *ayin*, we must hold on to the light of our past blessings while always seeking to move ourselves forward.

At the end of December, we read the last portion of Genesis. This portion is called *Vayechi*, translated as "and he (Jacob) lived." Jacob was in a deep depression for the years that Joseph disappeared. He was mourning the loss of his son due to a scheme that Joseph's brothers

crafted. They sold him as a slave and then dipped his multi-colored garment in blood, leading Jacob to assume Joseph was killed by a wild animal.

Our sages tell us G-d gives us the ability to overcome grief, and while we will never forget our loved ones, over time, the pain diminishes. Jacob was unable to move on emotionally for the simple fact that Joseph was not dead. In that entire time period, Jacob never received a prophecy and despite all efforts by his family to uplift him, he remained in a dark place.

This entire episode is troubling. Not only did Joseph's brothers deceive their father, but Jacob favored Joseph above his siblings, and Joseph himself did not reach out to Jacob during his absence while he lived in Egypt. Our sages explain that Jacob was punished for tricking his own father and brother, Esau. Joseph returned the favor to his brothers by imprisoning one of them and toying with them. While he realized they did not recognize him, he engaged in psychological warfare, making the brothers appear inept in their father's eyes and duping Benjamin to become a part of his plot.

What is abundantly clear is the power of family and how it can reinvigorate people's lives. Relationships are complicated and, like everything in life, actions have consequences. The brothers acted as judge and jury, bringing much suffering to Joseph and Jacob. Jacob brought suffering to his children by favoring Joseph. As a result of these events, Joseph was promoted to secondin-command and saved Egypt from famine. When he did reconnect with Jacob, vigor and happiness returned to Jacob. The power of love and *nachas* can give us purpose and the will to overcome all obstacles.

#### The "Real" Light of Hanukkah

When we were first taught about Hanukkah, we all learned the story of how one lone jar of oil was found in the Temple, enough oil to last only one day but miraculously lasted for eight. Yet there was another miracle that always spoke to

me more than the miracle of the oil. A small band of people who wanted the freedom to practice Judaism fought against assimilation and against being forced to adopt everything from the Hellenistic world that surrounded them. The Maccabees fought for the right to be who they were when so many around them, including many Jews, were adopting a Greek way of life.

The truth is, that the time in which the Maccabees lived is not so different from our own. We constantly feel the pressures of a society whose values don't always match ours. We need to choose whether to send our children to school or come to the synagogue on Jewish holidays. We need to choose whether they should go up to Santa and ask for a gift at the mall like other children do during this season. And we need to choose whether or not to take a family trip over school spring break on Passover like other families even if it means sacrificing our own ability to observe the holiday. The main point, however, is that because of the Maccabees, we do have a choice. The Maccabees fought valiantly and successfully to make sure we have the right to practice our religion in the way we choose, giving us the opportunity to live a life guided by the Torah. Just as we add a candle for each night of Hanukkah, let's add to the light that the Maccabees left for us by striving to ascend in holiness each day in our own lives.

# A Kabbalistic Tu B'Shevat Seder for Adults Tuesday, January 30 • 7 pm
