I was taught to be a defensive driver, anticipating dangerous situations, the mistakes of others and reacting. Can we be a defensive driver on the road of life in 2019? Today, Anti-Semitism, hate, prejudice, Islamophobia, xenophobia, and violence are all on the rise. We are living

in a fractured world where hate, division and dissension reign. There are different lanes on a highway, we don't all have to agree with each other. We can be on the left, right, center or even going the other way, but we must come to the realization that we are on the same road together.

For guidance, I turned to Ariel Burger's Witness: Lessons from Elie Wiesel's Classroom where he answers the questions of how to turn suffering into a bridge for a better tomorrow, how not to be a defensive driver and how to be a witness to raise the alarm when moral amnesia takes hold and hate festers.

Ever the teacher, Wiesel reminds us of our responsibility to the other - even the other living in our home, on our street or in our neighborhood. Whether it is reaching out to strengthen personal relationships or getting more involved through our GCC, Chesed, Sunshine Committee and other social action groups, it's time to take the first

The First Step

This month, we will read from *Parashat Lech Lecha*, beginning with God's charge to Abraham, "Go out, leave your country, your homeland, your father's house, and go to the place that I will show you" (Gen. 12:1). To heed this call took tremendous

faith. Taking such a journey away from everything you know is no easy proposition today, let alone in ancient times. Where would he get food? Where would he stay each night? Traveling would force Abraham to stop working and thereby lose his income, and upon arriving at his destination, nobody would know who he was.

So how did God convince Abraham? In truth, by the time God tells Abraham *Lech Lecha*, 'Go Out', Abraham had already left his hometown with his family to set out for Canaan, and had already traveled half the distance (Gen. 11:31). God turned what Abraham was already doing into something holy, giving him the courage to complete the journey.

Abraham didn't count on God to intervene in his life. He had plans for himself, and while God sanctified those plans, Abraham took the first step. Before God calls out to Abraham, he is headed for Canaan, and after God calls out to him, he still heads to Canaan. Abraham's own impetus leads him to the place he was destined to come to all along. Just as Abraham didn't wait for God to intervene in his life, when we believe in something, we need to be prepared to take that first step, too. We can't expect God to help us, or for things to go our way, if we are not willing to act first. And, it is often only once we act, when we take the first step, that we recognize the great power it can have and see where it might lead.

May we all find the courage, in the spirit of Abraham, to take that first step – join a Chesed project, connect with others in the community at our Shabbaton, advocate for what you believe in. We often can't foresee all of the outcomes, but if we never take any action, we will never reach our destination.

GCC Update: Criminal Justice Reform

Wednesday, November 6 • 7 pm



Join us to hear an update on the exciting work currently being done by GCC. Get an inside look at GCC's ongoing criminal justice reform work and achievements. How do we act wisely, effectively and justly?

Overcrowding in the County Jail has led to inhumane conditions and inmate suicides with a disproportionate impact on the African-American community. Approximately 1/3 of those kept behind bars should be receiving help in a mental health or addiction treatment center, reducing jail overcrowding and addressing many inmates' primary needs.

Presenters Donna Weinberger, LISW, GCC Criminal Justice Coordinator, and Marcia Levine, LISW, GCC leader, will specifically address:

- How did we get here? What is the longterm and immediate history that has led to this situation?
- What is a Crisis Diversion program? How will Crisis Diversion Centers help with problems at the County Jail? What is currently going on in the community and what are next steps?
- How you can become a part of the solution.


