- --Did you know we have an Inclusion committee that is working hard within our own synagogue to make sure everyone feels welcome, including those with disabilities of all kinds?
- --Did you know we offer programs to educate our congregation and community on issues affecting the community? For example, join us on Thursday, November 1st for Freedom Song, recovering Jewish addicts sharing their stories of struggle. Sponsored with community partners, we are hosting this performance and discussion from Los Angeles-based Beit Teshuvah Partners in Prevention.
- --Did you know we are a member of GCC, Greater Cleveland Congregations, a non-partisan coalition of faith communities and partner organizations in Cuyahoga County working together to build power for social justice?
- --Did you know we host the annual arts of thanksgiving event that brings together people of different faiths and cultures for an evening of music, art and dance? This year, it is being held on Monday, November 19th.

The Power of Yet

Last month, I attended the second retreat with my Rabbis Without Borders cohort, which focused on Positive Psychology, Character Strength Assessments and Innovative Design Theory.

Delving into our own character make-up, we identified our signature strengths (mine include fairness, kindness and forgiveness) and learned how these manifest themselves in our work and our relationships.

Rabbi Elan Babchuck, CLAL's Director of Innovation, led the seminar on Innovation, beginning with the famous Wizard of Oz quote, "We're not in Kansas anymore." In 2018, the concepts of community, affiliation, religion and connection are changing rapidly. Across all denominations and religions in America, affiliation rates are down, loneliness levels are rising and yet, surveys show there is an incredibly high level of Jewish pride (94% of Jews surveyed by Pew are proud to be Jewish). Rabbi Babchuk led our group through exercises and discussions, teaching us how to better shift to embrace these changes; to frame them positively as new opportunities for Judaism and our community.

We watched Dr. Carol Dweck's TED Talk, "The Power of Yet," and studied the concept of a fixed mindset vs. growth mindset. In her talk, she describes two children being given a difficult 3D puzzle to solve with few instructions. The first child gives up after only a few minutes saying, "I'll never be able to figure this out." The second child takes out all the pieces and starts experimenting with which fit together as he says, "I love a challenge!" Our seminar taught us to continue to embrace the challenges and opportunities of our ever-changing community and world by being open to new possibilities - to have a growth mindset for our congregation and my rabbinate.

I hope you will join me in seeing the exciting opportunities we have by using "The Power of Yet." Yet is my new favorite three-letter word that offers us hope and inspiration for today and tomorrow. I am working on a few new programs that we have not done YET. I'd also love to hear why you initially joined B'nai Jeshurun and what would excite you that we have not done "YET."




