

Talmud Torah 5th Grade (Hey) Curriculum Guide

Hebrew & Tefillah

At the beginning of the year, students in *Kitah Hey* will revisit the *tefillot* (prayers) taught in previous years with a focus on improving decoding skills and fluency. Teachers will assess students at the beginning of the year and assess them regularly to document their progress. In addition, new prayers will be introduced as students learn the *kavanah* (meaning) of each new prayer while learning how to read and chant them. As students progress in learning prayers, we encourage them to take part in our *tefillah*-based Gold Kippah program (Bronze and Silver Kippah) which follows the framework of the prayers we teach. Regular attendance of classes at Talmud Torah is critical to the advancement of your child's Hebrew. Engaging in Class Dojo and Enrichment Opportunities as provided by teachers, attending Shabbat services and practicing prayers and rituals at home will further strengthen your child's fluency and ability to recite prayers.

Hebrew & Tefillah Goals & Objectives

Each student will review prior knowledge at the start of the year and by the end of the school year be able to:

- Read with improved fluency and accuracy.
- Enrich their Hebrew prayer vocabulary.
- Strengthen knowledge of prayers taught in previous years.
- Learn and recite additional weekday and Shabbat morning prayers.
- Identify a connection between the *Kavanah* and *Avodah*, the meaning and the prayer.
- Read and chant new prayers with proficiency.
- Students will gain mastery of *Haftarah Trope*.

- Engage in the study of *Contemporary Jewish Life* with a focus on components of the Jewish wedding ceremony.
- Experience the modern land of *Israel* by studying Israeli art and artists.
- Delve into th*Biblical History* by considering the roles of prophets, judges, kings, and priests.
- Develop a rich, personal relationship with *Prayer*, *God*, and *Spirituality* through learning and discussion.
