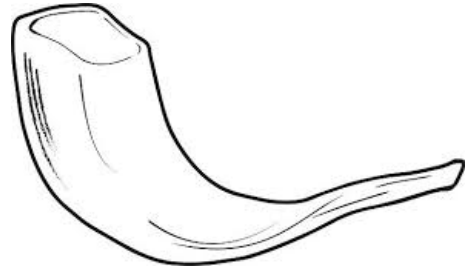


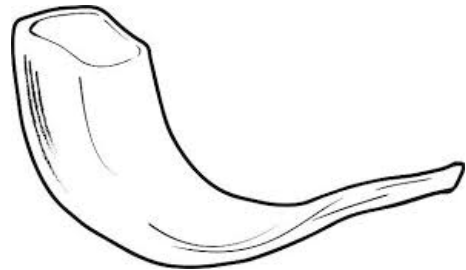
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- The Shofar is from the horn of a ram
- In the *Beit Hamikdash* its mouth was covered in gold (Mishna Rosh Hashana 3:3)



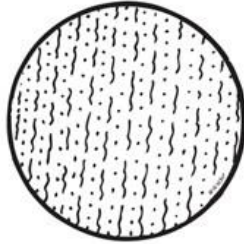
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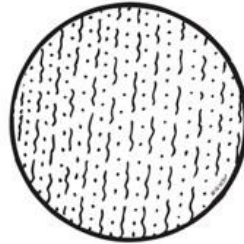
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- Matzah can be made from: wheat, barley, oats, spelt and rye. (Mishna Pesachim 2:5)
- Matza is the only food that the Torah explicitly commands us to eat.



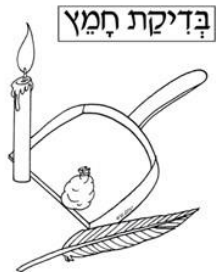
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- On the Night of the 14<sup>th</sup> of Nisan we search for Chametz (Mishna Pesachim 1:1)

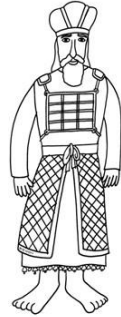


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## Kohen Gadol

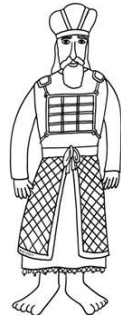


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- The Avodah in the Beit Hamikdash on Yom Kippur can only be done by the Kohen Gadol (Mishna Yoma 1:1)

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## Birchat Kohanim



- In Israel Kohanim "*Duchen*" every single day, twice on Shabbat, and three times on Yom Kippur!!! (Mishna Taanit 4:1)



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- We must daven to Hashem that it rains in Israel (Mishna Taanit 1:1)
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- One cannot use a lulav that is dried out (Mishna Sukkah 3:1)
- The lulav comes from the top of a palm tree



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## No Climbing Trees on Shabbat



- One may not climb a tree on Shabbat or Yom Tov because they may break a branch (Mishna Beitza 4:2)



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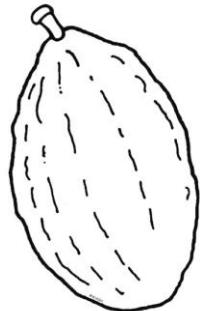


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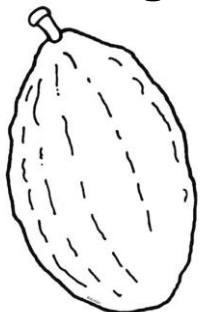
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- Some say an Etrog can't be smaller than a nut, but others say it can't be smaller than an egg (Mishna Sukkah 3:7)



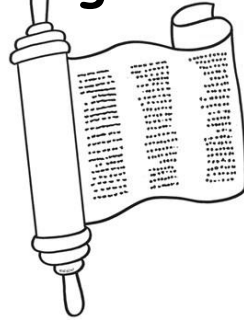
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## Megillah

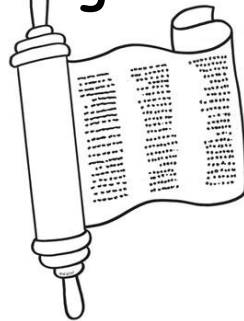

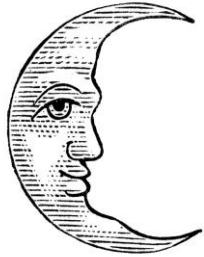
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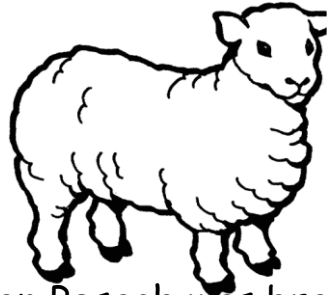
## Korban Pesach



- The Korban Pesach was brought on Erev Pesach and eaten at the seder (Mishna Pesachim 5:1)
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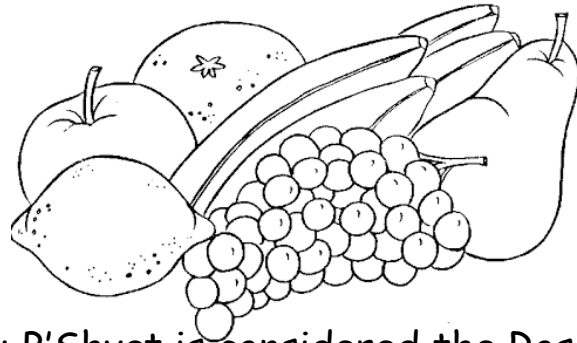
## Tu B'Shvat



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- We also don't wear leather shoes on Tish A'Buv



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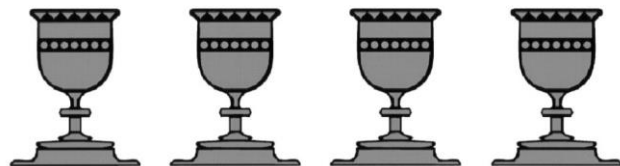


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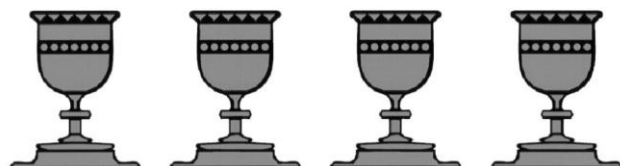
## 4 Cups



- Everyone must have four cups even a poor person. (Mishna Pesachim 10:1)
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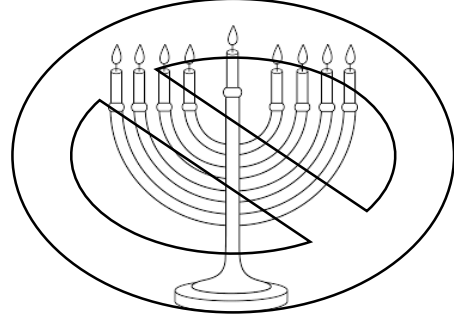
