
TORAH IN A BOX – KIDDUSHIN – THE (FAMILY) NEWLYWED GAME!

MESSECHET KIDDUSHIN

Seder Nashim, the book of Mishnah and Gemara that teaches all about Jewish marriage and family life, perhaps surprisingly, doesn't talk about marriage until the very end! We'll do it a little differently and our first day of traveling through Seder Nashim will be an adaptation of the Newlywed Game, for families!

HOW TO PLAY

As in many of our activities, even if you don't have a big crowd at home, if you'd like to connect to friends or family over the web then there is no reason not play together!

- Participants pair up and we'll find out: How well do you know each other? Just because you share a room doesn't necessarily mean you know everything there is to know; we'll find out!
- Separate teammates to opposite sides. Each needs a pieces of paper and pen (or some other ways of writing down their answers: iPad, whiteboard etc. work as well)
- The moderator will ask questions (in theory the moderator can also play) and both sides have to write down their answer.
- After the answers are written and completed, the pairs announce what they think their partner *would have* said.
- *Studio audience encouraged but not required.*
