Reflection on Memorial Park

The Temple Memorial Park has become a place of sanctuary for me, similar to the Temple sanctuary in Marblehead.

It is the final resting place of my parents Of Blessed Memory. Mark and I have purchased our plots, as well. When my Dad died, without pre-planning, Executive Director Judith Emanuel, Rabbi Meyer and Assistant Rabbi Kassoff “carried me” through arrangements, funeral, Shiva, and unveiling. It was an amazing experience, being taken care of at such a confusing vulnerable time.

Losing my Mom during lock-down COVID, remains with me. An image of looking down from the sky, with clusters of my parents’ children and grandchildren spread out from the Meditation Garden throughout the lower cemetery.

As Memorial Park Chair since 2007, it was an honor to have members call to discuss the grass or water or plaque alignment of their deceased loved ones. Sharing precious tidbits of lost family members always touched my heart.

My involvement with the Temple Emanu-El Memorial Park continues to be a meaningful and rewarding collaboration. Our park-like setting in Danvers, within a residential neighborhood and close to Ipswich River frontage, Lebel’s Grove, is our “off campus backyard” (Rabbi Meyer). Temple Emanu-El is fully responsible for this peaceful cemetery.

The Memorial Park Task Force began over a year and a half ago. Taking care of our cemetery is a worthy endeavor. Landscaping has improved, we have a new sign on Route 114, and we are working with an architectural landscaper. Ten of us make up the task force, each bringing unique experience, skill, and passion for the Memorial Park. Our goal is to beautify and expand, involving the entire Temple community. It’s important to me and I hope it will be to others as well.

At Temple Emanu-El, there are many ways to honor, celebrate, and remember dear friends, family, and past loved ones.

Memorial/Yahrzeit Wall

It is a widely observed Jewish tradition to commemorate the passing of a loved one by remembering them on a dedicated Memorial Wall. The Temple Emanu-El Memorial Wall contains a plaque with the name and date of passing. Additionally, and in keeping with the ancient Jewish custom of honoring departed ones with a stone on a marker, each plaque also has a carrier where you can place a tumbled stone on anniversary dates, or anytime at all! Your loved one's name is read at time of yahrzeit in perpetuity.

Memorial plaques ask for a donation of \$750.

Tree of Life

Located in our lobby, the Temple's welcoming Tree of Life gives all who wish an opportunity to celebrate life's joyful blessings in perpetuity by inscribing them on one of its beautiful leaves or rocks. Celebrate your simcha - weddings, births, B'nei Mitzvah, anniversaries, graduations, milestones.

Honor someone you love - children, parents, family, friends, teacher.

Tree of Life leaves and rocks ask for a donation of: \$500 - \$10,000.

Bookplates

Temple Emanu-El also offers several opportunities to remember your loved ones with the dedication of a book to the Temple Library or prayer book used at our weekly Shabbat service, a High Holyday machzor or Torah commentary. All books contain a tribute bookplate honoring and celebrating your loved one's name.
