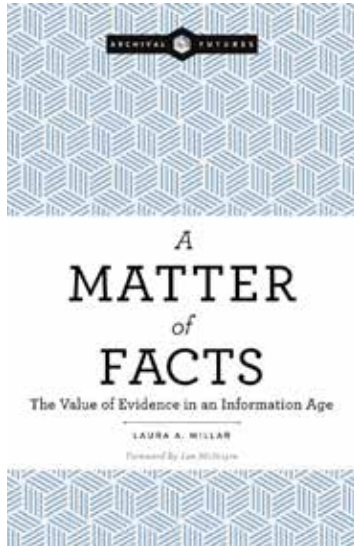

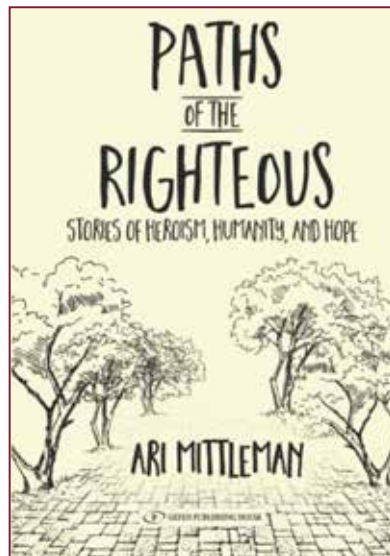

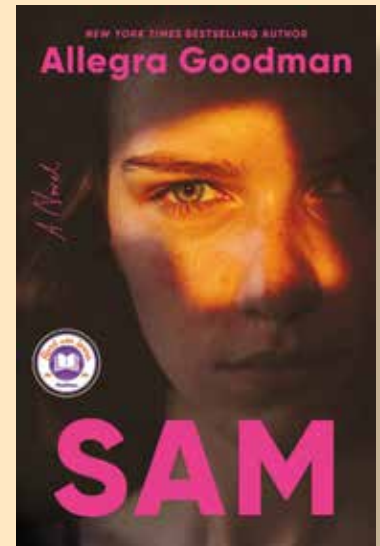
A Matter of Facts: The Value of Evidence in an Information Age

Rabbi Stephen A. Karol is a native of Kansas City, Missouri, and Rabbi Emeritus of Temple Isaiah in Stony Brook, New York. He was ordained at the Hebrew Union College in Cincinnati in 1977, and has served at Temple Beth Zion in Buffalo, New York, Congregation Sha'aray Shalom in Hingham, Massachusetts, and Temple Isaiah. He teaches for Temple Isaiah and for the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) at Stony Brook University. He has been a blogger for www.JewishSacredAging.com and for www.jewish-funerals.org. His book, ***Finding Hope and Faith in the Face of Death: Insights of a Rabbi and Mourner*** was given to the newly-ordained rabbis at the Cincinnati campus of the Hebrew Union College in 2019 and was on the reading list for a doctoral program course at HUC in New York for the Spring 2021 semester.

In addition, he has developed 40 talks (Zoom or in-person) about a variety of subjects for synagogues, Jewish Community Centers, Hadassah meetings, and churches. His new book, ***Embracing the Supernatural in Judaism: Signs from Our Deceased Loved Ones and Stories About The World-to-Come*** was published by Amazon in February. Rabbi Karol lives in Port Jefferson Station, New York with his wife Donna.

The effects of pet therapy can be positive on cognitive function, mood and perceived quality of life in seniors, according to a 2011 study from the University of Bologna in Italy. The study concluded that it is especially efficient in improving symptoms of mental illnesses, like depression or dementia, for residents in long-term care.

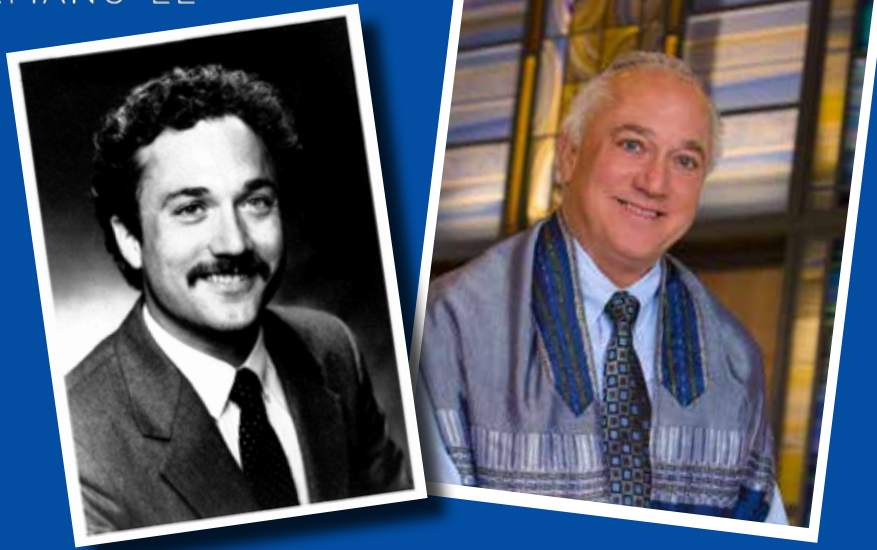

Your loved one's name is read at time of yahrzeit in perpetuity.

Memorial plaques ask for a donation of \$750.

Tree of Life

Located in our lobby, the Temple's welcoming Tree of Life gives all who wish an opportunity to celebrate life's joyful blessings in perpetuity by inscribing them on one of its beautiful leaves or rocks. 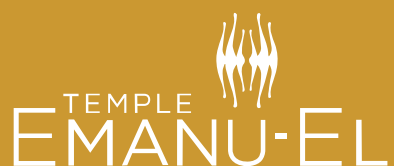
