MYTHS AND FACTS:

May someone with a tattoo be buried in our Memorial Park?

What do the Jewish sources teach?

A study of our sources, from the Torah through the Talmud,
Commentaries and Codes, makes it rather clear that Jewish tradition
opposes tattooing, the making of elective and permanent alterations on
the skin. The earliest reference to such opposition comes from Leviticus
19:28, where we are told that one should not slash the body as a mark of
mourning for the dead, and one shall not make tattoos on one's skin (the
term used for tattoo is יְבְּתַבֶּח קַעְבֶּח ketovet ka'akah). Later sages maintain
the principle, even though its origins may have been part of the Bible's
ongoing opposition to idolatry, as such markings and gashes were often
associated with allegiance to a god or idol.

But even an in-depth exploration of the customs (Minhagim) of Jewish practice shows no evidence that the transgression of tattooing would disqualify one from burial in a Jewish cemetery. As Rabbi Solomon Freehof wrote in Today's Reform Responsa (1990) "[T]he idea seems so absurd that I doubt if it can be seriously meant even by those who say it. What if a person does tattoo his skin? He has committed a sin, one sin among the 365 negative commandments. Is there any rule that a man who commits a sin may not be buried in the Jewish cemetery? If that were a rule, the cemeteries would be virtually empty."

Taking it a step further, were such a prohibition in force, what would that mean for Holocaust survivors, whose numbers were inscribed in the flesh of their arms by the Nazis upon arriving to the camps? And likewise, what would be the sense in probititing burial in our Jewish cemeteries for those who have had tattoos as part of certain reconstructive surgeries?

In conclusion, the idea (or "urban legend") that having tattoos disqualifies one from burial in Jewish cemeteries, including our Memorial Park, may be dismissed as one of those myths that seem to find their way into the popular imagination.







PAPA's NUT GAME

A Fundraiser for Temple Emanu-El

Did you know that playing with walnuts at Passover has been a common practice for centuries? The walnut after all, is a traditional part of the Seder plate, used in making the charoset. The Talmud mentions that Rabbi Akiva handed out nuts to the children at Pesach so that they would play with them and not fall asleep during the Seder. In an essay by Yiddish scholar Itzik Gottesman, titled Nut Games for Passover, he described 8 different traditional nut games that were played at Passover in Eastern Europe. A well known song by contemporary Israeli children opens with the line, "We will play with walnuts, Pesach is here." Larry Block's family grew up with the tradition of playing the "bret" nut game that his Papa played as a child in Dvinsk, now part of Latvia. In this game, walnuts are

rolled down a board and onto the floor, with the goal of hitting one of the nuts previously rolled. A fun, "good old fashioned" family game, toddlers can play against grandparents, and win!

Larry has hand-crafted, and for \$35 is selling "Papa's Nut Game," complete with a folding wooden box that becomes the board, rules and terminology, and of course, bags full of walnuts. Between now and Passover, all proceeds from the sale to Temple Emanu-El members will be donated to the Temple. 

Your loved one's name is read at time of yahrzeit in perpetuity.
