Hamantaschen

Ingredients:

3/4 cup unsalted butter, room temperature

2/3 cup sugar

1 large egg, room temperature

1 tsp vanilla

1 tsp grated orange zest

2 1/4 cups flour

1/4 tsp salt

1-5 tsp water (if needed)

Directions:

- Slice room temperature butter into small chunks and place in a large mixing bowl.
- Add sugar to the bowl. Use an electric mixer to cream the butter and sugar together for a few minutes till light and fluffy.
- Add the egg, vanilla, and orange zest to the bowl. Beat again till creamy and well mixed.
- Sift flour and salt into the bowl. Mix with the electric mixer on low speed till a crumbly dough forms. (I didn't sift)
- Begin to knead dough with hands till a smooth dough ball forms. Try not to overwork the dough, only knead till the dough is the right consistency. If the crumbles are too dry to form a smooth dough, add water slowly, 1 teaspoon at a time, using your hands to knead the liquid into the dough. Knead and add liquid until the dough is smooth and slightly tacky to the touch (not sticky), with a consistency that is right for rolling out. It can easily go from the right consistency to too wet/sticky, so add water very slowly. If the dough seems too wet, knead in a little flour till it reaches the right texture.

• Form the dough into a flat disk and wrap in plastic wrap. Place in the refrigerator to chill for 3 hours to overnight.

Q&A with Rabbi Meyer

In just a few days the Temple will be hosting its very own online Telethon on January 31st starting at 5pm. This will be a first for the Temple and it will be an exciting mixture of talent from inside and outside of our Temple community. With COVID preventing us from gathering, the Temple's critical fundraising efforts have been greatly restricted. We hope that this unique idea will be both a place of community and entertainment as well as a vehicle to meeting our fundraising goal. We sat down recently with the Telethon's emcee, Rabbi Meyer, to ask his thoughts on this upcoming fun event.

Q: We are told that the initial idea for this unique event came from you! What sparked it?

A: For many years during my childhood, like millions of others, our family would watch the Jerry Lewis Labor Day Telethon raising funds for fighting Muscular Dystrophy. I was remembering that very successful, national event. I also recalled how singers, comedians, dancers and movie stars would donate their time and talent, believing in the cause of "Jerry's Kids". And considering our own circumstances and limitations, I considered how it was very much a model for how we might create an event both entertaining and engaging in the cause of our congregation.

Q: Is this the first time you have hosted a Telethon?, Are you excited? Any nervousness?

A: I've never hosted a Telethon before. The closest I've come was hosting a segment on WGBH for a PBS Telethon some years ago, where I spent about 15 minutes going over the gifts available for donations of certain levels. And of course I've got some butterflies going into the Temple's event – I get nervous before every service I've ever led, and any lecture or speech I've done! But knowing that I'll be working alongside our Music Director, Jon Nelson, who of course is also my musical partner, makes me feel more at ease and excited. He brings a wonderfully joyful and even playful attitude to these sorts of occasions, and I know it will be fun hosting with him.

Q: The list of acts in entirety is not being released prior to the show, but is there an act or acts that you are particularly looking forward to?

A: There are several acts I'm excited to include. We have some marvelous talent among our own Temple kids – including some teens who will surprise many with the level of their musical talent. Some even have their own YouTube channels! We'll also have professionals sharing talent, such as comedian (and my colleague), Rabbi Bob Alper. And we're most grateful to Christopher Williams, who will perform his song, "Gather", which we've included in our musical rotation for a couple of years now, and which has become a favorite in the congregation. Another musician I'm looking forward to having with us is the talented jazz vocalist, Cassandre McKinley, who performed here at Temple just last year. Jon Nelson and I also plan to share one or two of our music videos which many haven't yet had the chance to see!

Q: How does this Telethon align with the Temple's mission to Connect, Create, Belong?

A: This will be another way to keep us all **connected**, even if only on-line (like our classes, meetings and services). We will share in the **creation** of a novel approach to that, as well as to our most necessary fundraising. And by giving one another a new way to offer tzedakah, we will all reinforce our sense of **belonging** to our cherished Temple community.

Q: Why is the Telethon's success important for the Temple?

A. Fundraising during these pandemic times has been a challenge; not only for us, but for so many worthy organizations and causes – including synagogues. We're hoping that support for the Temple will come from online donations, call-in donations, a great online auction, and sponsorships (which are still available!) We know it will be special event!
