# Old North Church Pulpit Exchange

Rabbi David Meyer, together with the Rev. Dennis Calhoun and members of Temple Emanu-El and Old North Church, are delighted to renew our tradition of sharing in a Pulpit Exchange weekend. Welcoming one another to address our congregations is a practice going back nearly sixty years between Temple Emanu-El and Old North.

Although circumstances during the pandemic prevented us from taking part in the exchange last year, we plan on continuing the beloved tradition in January of 2022. So on Friday evening, January 28, 2022, Rev. Calhoun will be the guest speaker during our Friday evening Shabbat service. Then, on Sunday, January 30th, Rabbi Meyer will address the congregation of Old North during their Sunday morning worship.

For clarity's sake, these are not "interfaith services." Rather, each congregation will worship according to its own customs. But having the opportunity to welcome one another into our communal "homes" will expand and amplify the ongoing, special relationship of Covenant between our two communities of faith; a relationship that dates to the earliest years of Temple Emanu-El here in Marblehead.


Services on Friday evening will still be held both in person and streamed on Facebook Live.

# **Memorial Park**

Where it all began - How we got here today

"For the past several years, we've identified three fundamental elements to our Temple's mission, summarized in the words: "Connect. Create. Belong!" Going well beyond even the accomplishments of being the founder of the first Reform congregation on the North Shore, Alfred Gross, Jr., our Temple's first president, already understood the value of belonging, of creating, and of relationships.

Throughout his life, he continued to take such pride in the vibrancy of this congregation, and stood always at the ready – even in his later years — to be of help and support to the Temple."

## The following is an edited version of Alfred Gross' Oral History on the origins of the Temple and the Memorial Park:


This was 1964. The cohesive committed group who started the Temple in 1954 said they wanted to have a cemetery. I wanted a cemetery too because there was a need, unfortunately.

We started to work on establishing a Cemetery Committee and getting the thing started. We thought it would be a simple thing, that you just go and buy a piece of land and there it is. Well it wasn't that simple. We went after a piece of land and finally, after months, we were to be sold a piece of property up in Hamilton, Mass. But it had to be approved by the Board of the Town. So the time came that we had to make presentation to the Town which we did, to the Town Board.

There was a mob there for this meeting. One man got up and he said I am not going to see that land sold to Jews. And it started a real brouhaha up there. So finally I stood up and I said ladies and gentlemen, we withdraw our request. And we got out. It really was the first experience that we had had (since the formation of the congregation) of Anti-Semitism and it was very tough.

Finally we found a place over in Danvers...


## Family Shabbat (via Zoom)



### Memorial/Yahrzeit Wall

It is a widely observed Jewish tradition to commemorate the passing of a loved one by remembering them on a dedicated Memorial Wall. The Temple Emanu-El Memorial Wall contains a plaque with the name and date of passing. Additionally, and in keeping with the ancient Jewish custom of honoring departed ones with a stone on a marker, each plaque also has a carrier where you can place a tumbled stone on anniversary dates, or anytime at all! Your loved one's name is read at time of yahrzeit in perpetuity.
