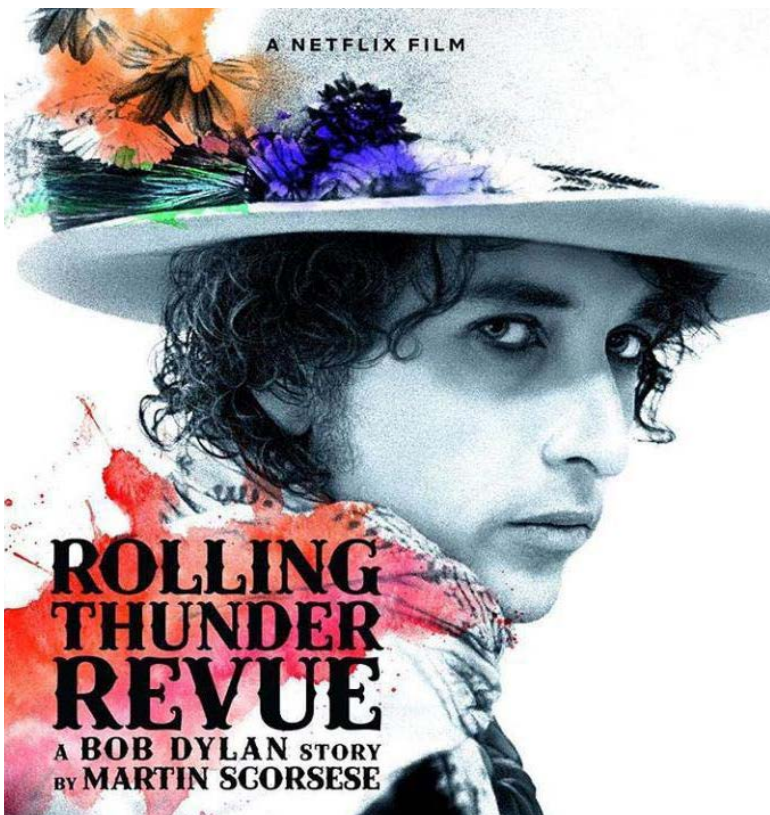
Fort Sewall Celebration and Walk

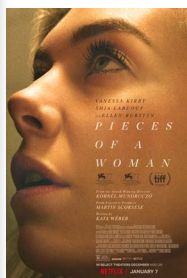


First Wednesday of every month. Watch the movie on Netflix or Amazon Prime, and then join us on Zoom for a discussion.

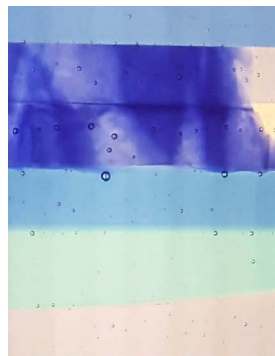
