Where it all began – How we got here today

10 THINGS

We bet you didn't know about the Memorial Park!

- The Memorial Park is hidden on a residential street in Danvers, at 16 Buxton Road.
- The Memorial Park was once an apple orchard.
- The first person to be buried at the Memorial Park was a child.
- Both Rabbi Katzenstein and Rabbi Shapiro are buried at the Memorial Park.
- There are currently 439 people buried at the Memorial Park.
- The Memorial Park is exclusive to Temple Emanu-El and privately owned and managed by us.
- Our Memorial Park is the only cemetery in the area with its own water source.
- There is a reflection area and meditation garden in the Memorial Park.
- There are no headstones at the Memorial Park, only flush to the ground markers, based on the premise that we are all equal in death.
- There is a Task Force working on the beautification and enhancement of the Memorial Park, including provisions for expansion to ensure its availability for future generations.

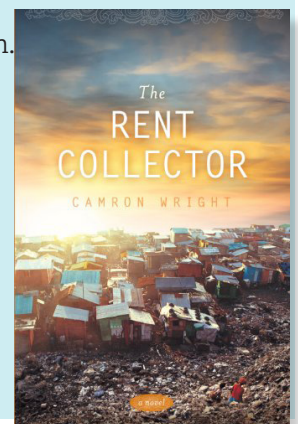

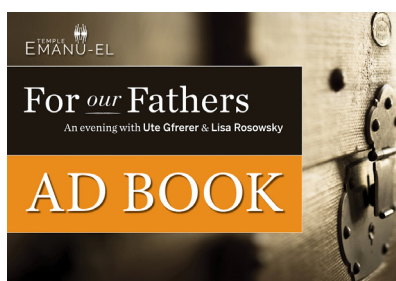

Additionally, and in keeping with the ancient Jewish custom of honoring departed ones with a stone on a marker, each plaque also has a carrier where you can place a tumbled stone on anniversary dates, or anytime at all! Your loved one's name is read at time of yahrzeit in perpetuity.

Memorial plaques ask for a donation of \$750.

Tree of Life

Located in our lobby, the Temple's welcoming Tree of Life gives all who wish an opportunity to celebrate life's joyful blessings in perpetuity by inscribing them on one of its beautiful leaves or rocks.
