

High Holyday Sermon "Sampler" 5781 / 2020

LIVING IN AN UPSIDE-DOWN WORLD: EPIDEMICS PAST AND PRESENT Rosh Hashanah Morning 5781 (2020)

...[F]rom the outbreak of the plague in the 17th Century Italian Jewish ghetto, to the yellow fever epidemic in Memphis in the 19th Century, to the Warsaw ghetto typhus scourge during the 20th Century, we can certainly perceive lessons so essentially relevant to us both now and for the future.

We have learned the importance of strong and brave leadership when life and death are in the balance. We have learned that the scientific insights of the period play a key role in determining the broad and ultimate impact on the affected community and nation. We have learned that times of crisis such as these demand unity, not dissension. Perhaps most importantly, we have seen how the caring acts of individuals, when accumulated into a massive response, can be the most important ways to sustain healing and recovery both during and following such times of pandemic.



RESTORING OUR "DEPLETED SURGE CAPACITY" – AND REPAIRING OUR SOULS
Yom Kippur Eve 5781 (2020)

...The disruptions of the past six months have challenged all our resources and resiliencies. Of course, at the heart of it all is our current pandemic, but it is not COVID-19 alone that is taking its toll on us. It is also the political season with its amplified divisiveness and discord; even more so in the aftermath of the passing of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsberg; it's been the inflamed expressions calling out racial injustice, with accompanying protests and violence; it's been economic downturn and uncertainty; wildfires in the West, hurricanes coming up the East Coast and the Gulf Coast; it's our need to care for and even home-school our children, or our looking after elderly parents and neighbors, all the while trying to keep up with life's normal craziness, demands, and obligations.

I see it - the angst and fatigue - throughout the congregation and community. I am certainly not personally immune to the feelings of uncertainty, disruption, isolation, and loss.

We come to this Yom Kippur suffering from a depletion of what has been called "surge-capacity." Ann Masten, a psychologist, and professor of child development uses that term. She defines "surge-capacity" as our ability to adapt, mentally and physically, drawing upon internal resources necessary for short-term survival in acutely stressful situations, such as natural disasters. But natural disasters occur over a short period, even if recovery is long. Pandemics are different — the disaster itself stretches out indefinitely. Masten writes, "The pandemic has demonstrated both what we can do with surge capacity and the limits of surge capacity. When it is depleted, it has to be renewed. But what happens when you struggle to renew it because the emergency phase has now become chronic?



RACISM, JUSTICE AND THE DAUGHTERS OF TZELOFCHAD
Yom Kippur Morning 5781 (2020)

...Recently, I helped write a declaration on behalf of the Marblehead Ministerial Association, echoing some of these same sentiments, and calling upon our clergy colleagues to explore within our local congregations the issue of systemic racism, in addition to antisemitism, homophobia, and other bigotries. For in order to affect society, to bring about systemic change, we, as individuals, need to listen, to learn, to examine our own lives and behaviors – which is, of course, the dominant theme of Yom Kippur, our Day of Atonement. Combatting systemic injustice is teshuvah writ large, repentance on a grand scale, yet the change needs to take place as individuals.

So allow me to share my own, personal considerations, some of what I'm learning, as I seek to become an accomplice and ally for racial justice.

First, I would have to say that I was raised to be "colorblind", and to see the common humanity of all created in God's image, regardless of race. I have to smile recalling when my African American college roommate and his family and my family would gather for a meal at some restaurant in Lawrence, Kansas. We may have been colorblind, but certainly those around us—staring at what was still an unusual sight—were clearly NOT.

But I am learning that being "color-blind" may not be as helpful in addressing racial injustice as being coloraware! For when I don't take race into account in my acquaintances or friendships, then I'm perpetuating the false sense that we're all really just the same; I do a disservice by not recognizing the unique situation and challenges facing minorities of color in predominantly white America. In the same way, in the realm of interfaith relations, I hope that we have grown, matured beyond the thought that all faiths in America are basically the same, just with different calendars. I want my non-Jewish friends to be aware of the challenges that I face as a minority, as a Jew, because then they will know more deeply what is important or what is of concern to me.

Dear Religious School families,

We are glad that October cooperated enough to have some in-person learning. We hope that all the students who came to the building for classes enjoyed being with their Jewish peers. The students made decorations for our Sukkah and enjoyed looking at them when they shook the lulav during Sukkot! We have pictures of our Hebrew school (grades 3-6) learning outside with their teachers and friends.

We launched our Sunday program with a rotation of students in person and others on Zoom.

The classes were a success and we are glad that Madrikhim are able to take larger roles in helping teachers with technology, planning lessons, and working with students.



In November, our learning will continue—the Hebrew students will have a couple of breaks from mid-week learning with Veteran's Day and Thanksgiving, but we will have several weeks of Sunday classes. This helps establish a routine for the remainder of the year. Each class will also finish at least one art project, with all the supplies being sent home for projects over Zoom.

Hopefully you all saw the SMARTY event that will be taking place on November 15th. Families are invited to paint a desk that will be donated to children who live in the area. Please sign up for a 20 minute time slot. In case we need to be inside, we are limiting the number of people who will be in the space at a time. This will be a good way to contribute to those who are less fortunate than our students and a nice way to spend an afternoon as a family. Don't forget to sign up!

We will complete our first session of Pre-Confirmation. Seventh graders will work with Jill and Heather to discuss what it means to be a "Jewish teen." Harriet will guide our eighth-grade students through a young adult book that conveys some Jewish experiences of the Holocaust. During the last session of the four week program, all seventh and eighth graders will determine the course offerings for the two Pre-Confirmation sessions (four weeks each) in 2021. Check back in a couple of months for their ideas!

We hope that everyone will start using their "Mishkan T'fila for Youth" prayerbooks during Sunday morning t'filah with Rabbi Meyer. Make sure you pick up a copy if you don't have one at home already!

We look forward to seeing you online and/or in person soon!


Kits will be ready within 48 hours for pick up at the Temple during Temple Business hours.


