September 18: Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are two High Holiday days that occur every fall. Rosh Hashanah is referred to as the birthday of the world, and Yom Kippur, the day of saying I'm sorry. Let's learn more and of course have a special sweet treat of apples and honey!

November 13: Shalom Bayit (peace in the home) - Do you remember a time when you wanted something that somebody else had? What was it? How did it make you feel? Learn about compromise, teamwork and problem solving through fun games and activities.

December 11: Chanukkah, also called the Festival of Lights, is a time to recall the miracle when a small amount of oil lasted for 8 nights. A time to give and share with others, light the menorah and play dreidel.

February 5: Tu B'Shevat, the New Year of the trees, marks the beginning of spring in Israel when the trees begin to flower and bloom.
