


6th Gr Kallah

During this retreat the meaning of becoming a b'mitzvah is explored through discussion. prayer, art and dramatics. This will build community among the participants and create shared memories.

In the fall of 6th grade students begin to learn how to chant from the Torah. In the spring, the students will lead a Shabbat morning service for the 6th grade families, during which each student will chant from Torah.

Individual & Family Meetings

| Initial Meeting | To explore the preparation process, distribute study materials, discuss methods of successful home study and begin to develop an atmosphere of cooperation with paired peer family (if applicable) Approximately 1 hr meeting 6 - 7 months prior to ceremony Cantor Doob meets with parents and student, and if paired, with paired family as well |

| Prayer Practice | To master the prayers of the Friday night and Saturday morning services Students meet one-on-one on Zoom all year for 15 minute prayer mastery sessions. |
| Torah Tutoring | •16 sessions of 30 minutes each beginning 5 - 7 months prior to ceremony •Student will meet with a Torah tutor weekly generally on Tuesdays or Wednesdays |
| Haftarah Tutoring | To work on Haftarah, review Torah and prayers to help your child finish their preparation for the Friday night and Shabbat morning services 8 sessions immediately following Torah tutoring, each 30 minutes Students will meet with Cantor Doob |

| D'var Torah Prep (Speech) | To assist your child in uncovering ways to apply Torah to "real life" and formulate those ideas in order to teach the congregation a life lesson drawn from their Torah portion Student will meet with Rabbi Battis for 30 minutes up to 3 times. |

| Rehearsals | To put the finishing touches on the B'Mitzvah service and ceremony Students participate in the first rehearsal with Cantor Doob (parents welcome to attend) The final two rehearsals are with Seniot Rabbi~ both student and parents attend the final rehearsal. It is generally, but not always, held the Thursday afternoon before the B'Mitzvah |
| Mazal Tov Meeting | To debrief the process, celebrate students' accomplishments and begin to plan next steps in the journey of lifelong Jewish learning Students meet with Director of Jewish Family Journeys 3 - 4 weeks after the b'mitzvah ceremony for about 20 minutes |

Ensuring Your Child's Success

Guiding Principles:

Our guiding principle is that every student will be successful at their B'Mitzvah without exception. If a student needs more sessions than we can provide within our typical tutoring, we will work with you to identify options which may include contracting for additional, privately-hired tutoring.

Please know that we are aware that everyone has unique needs and learning styles and we do our best to meet students where they are. We also encourage you to work with your child to develop homework strategies, time management skills, accountability for completing assignments and communication with the tutor throughout this process.

Our Shared Responsibilities:

As you can imagine, scheduling all of these sessions for the entire class is a challenging process for families and our professional staff. As we are all dedicated to your child's success, please follow these guidelines regarding your appointments.

- 1. <u>Please arrive punctually and keep your designated meeting times.</u> It is difficult to reschedule these meetings. Please cancel only in cases of illness or an unavoidable conflict.
- 2. If your child must miss a session with a Torah tutor, <u>please notify Jennie Goldfarb</u>, <u>Director of</u> <u>Jewish Family Journeys</u>, at least 24 hours prior to the session as the Temple is responsible for paying the tutor regardless of whether or not your child attends. Makeup for one missed session will be provided by Temple Isaiah. If we have not received 24 hours' notice and/or if make-up sessions are needed, it may be necessary to schedule private make-up sessions at your own expense.
- 3. If your child will be unable to attend a session with Cantor Doob, please call Jenny Keegan at least 24 hours prior to the appointment.
