

Temple Isaiah Accessibility for All

Temple Isaiah welcomes individuals with all abilities to our services and programs. It is important that everyone is able to participate fully as a member or visitor.



The building is fully wheelchair accessible. A wheelchair (kept in the coatroom) is available for use in the Temple.



A handicapped-accessible all-gender restroom is located opposite the chapel. Handicapped-accessible restrooms are also located in the Religious School wing on the first floor and on the second floor (via elevator).



Large print prayer books are available outside the entrance to the sanctuary and chapel.



Assisted listening devices are available for use in the sanctuary, social hall or meeting room and are located outside the entrance to the sanctuary.



Ask our Temple board host about courtesy seating for people with wheelchairs, walkers, visual or hearing impairments, or other special needs.



The Temple Library is open for anyone who needs to take a break from a service or other activity.



Highchairs for young children are available for all family meals in the social hall. If they are not already out, they can be found in the coatroom.



Refreshments after services and for programs are labeled if they contain nuts or if they are gluten-free or dairy free. The religious school wing is allergy sensitive.

We use grape juice for Kiddush.



Feel free to borrow a "sensory or thinking tool" at any time. They are kept in a basket on the prayer book cart.
