A NOTE FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

Dear Shalom School Families,

I am pleased to share with you that we heard yesterday from the Sacramento County Department of Public Health. They have reviewed our application for a waiver for on-campus elementary

instruction, and after requesting a few changes, have submitted it to the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) with the recommendation that our school receive a waiver. We hope to hear back from the CDPH tomorrow or early next week, and we are continuing our planning for oncampus instruction.

We will be holding two meetings next week to share additional information. The first meeting, at 5 pm on Tuesday, September 29th, is for K – 6 families. We hope to have a reopening timeline to share with you, along with other details regarding on-campus instruction, safety protocols, and transition plans.

The second meeting is for ECE families and will take place on Wednesday, September 30th at 5 pm. At this meeting, we will share information about updated health and illness guidelines as well as about the transition on campus as we welcome our elementary students back.

As we use the days between Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur to reflect on the year that has passed and plan for the one to come, I am mindful of our tradition to use this time to apologize and make amends. No matter how hard we work or how good our intentions might be, we know that we still sometimes miss the mark. I want to share again how much I appreciate your patience, flexibility, and partnership, and I am especially grateful for all the times that each of you has given me or our school the benefit of the doubt or accepted our apology when we've made an error. May we all be forgiven for anything that is weighing on us, and may we be inscribed for a year of peace, health, and happiness.

PARENT PARTICIPATION HOURS

The Parent Participation Program policy requires that each family contribute **25 hours** of service per school year. Every family is responsible for completing these hours, and, at the end of the school year, any family who has not fulfilled all their hours must pay the difference between the hours worked and the 25 hour commitment at a rate of \$15.00 per hour. <u>Please note</u>: Parent Participation hour requirements will be reevaluated and possibly adjusted as we assess the COVID-19 limitations.

We recognize that the pandemic will make it difficult to fulfill hours as we have in the past; therefore, we are providing more opportunities for tasks that can be completed at home. Grandparents and family friends can also earn family hours.



Ways to earn Parent Participation Hours:

- Check your emails. Volunteer opportunities will be posted in the E-news and your child's teacher(s) will also email opportunities as they arise.
- Attend PTF Meetings to learn about upcoming events and volunteer opportunities; receive one hour for each meeting attended.
- Refer a friend to Shalom School! Parents can earn 5 hours if the friend tours and an additional 10 hours if they enroll.
- Purchase requested supplies from teachers \$15 = 1 hour. Purchases must be approved in advance.

The Parent Participation Program has been an important part of Shalom School for years and has helped to increase family involvement, build community, enhance parent engagements, and strengthen our school.

He was born in Kibbutz Hephzibah in Israel to Holocaust survivors and he later served as an officer in an elite IDF unit where he was wounded in battle.
