



The Moving Traditions Teen Groups: Helping Jewish Teens Grow: New programs added for LGBTQ+ teens

Massachusetts residents are advised to **limit the risk of exposure to COVID-19** by following these steps to **1.) stop the spread of COVID-19** and **2.) prevent deaths**.

- If you have travelled out of Massachusetts, you need to follow the State's travel requirements and remain in quarantine for 10 days (or 7 days, if tested negative on day 5 onwards).
- If you gathered with people outside your household for New Year's Eve parties or in the past several days, we recommend a similar period of guarantine.
- Everyone should remain at home if you are feeling unwell with any condition.
- Our COVID-19 precautions and plan remain in place and we are staying informed on conditions within Sharon and the Commonwealth.

PLEASE: We want everyone to stay safe and healthy.

- Wear a mask
- Practice social distancing: stay at least six feet away from other people
- Wash hands often with soap and water or use hand sanitizer
- Get the flu vaccine
- Monitor for symptoms fever, cough, shortness of breath
- If you may be around those at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19, take extra precautions to keep them safe
- Monitor recommendations from your locality, <u>Sharon Health Department</u>, <u>MA</u>
 Department of Public Health, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.





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
