# Rabbinic Reflections

As we approach the new year and make our way into 5784, this is the perfect time to think about how we can continue our own Jewish education. While we often think of kids when we think of Jewish education, the truth is that this is a life-long pursuit. Even I, after time in yeshiva followed by six years of rabbinical school, am still regularly seeking out new ideas and things to learn. There is a wide breadth of topics and depth of material to learn as adults.

While there are many opportunities to join classes or study sessions, both here at Beth Sholom and beyond, we have one resource in particular which is underutilized but so incredibly valuable. I am talking about our Beth Sholom Library. Tucked away in an upstairs corner of the building, our library contains all manner of Jewish books. Are you curious about Jewish theology and what Jews believe about God? Check. Do you ever wonder why Jews do what we do ritually? Check. Do you love literature? Historical Fiction? Yiddish literary culture such as Tevya the Milkman, better known as Fiddler on the Roof (translated into English, of course)? Check. Check. And Check. Perhaps you want to explore some of our traditional rabbinic texts such as the Talmud, Midrash, or rabbinic Torah commentaries? Well, our library would be a wonderful starting point. Or perhaps you are interested in ancient,

medieval, or modern Jewish history, including works on the modern state of Israel or American Judaism? All of that can be found in our library.

From light reading like books on Jewish humor to deeply introspective works of Jewish thought by theological giants like Rav Kook or Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel, our library can serve as a wonderful resource to your ongoing Jewish education. I urge each of us to at least make it a point to visit the library and check out what we have (literally, you can actually check books out and read them at home!). Perhaps you will find a book whose enjoyment can help ease your Yom Kippur fast, or alternatively you can test your resolve by reading a mouth-watering book of Jewish cooking on Yom Kippur afternoon!

The next time you're in the shul, head upstairs and take two rights. You will find yourself within an incredible trove of wisdom and entertainment. But why wait until the next time you happen to be in the shul building? You are invited to visit our library anytime the building is open.

As my study is situated right off the library, I am always happy to stop what I am doing and help you find the perfect book to guide you along the next stage of your own spiritual journey of Jewish growth. I look forward to hearing about your next read!

This month I am looking forward to celebrating our High Holidays together with each and every one of you in our Beth Sholom community!

Here are some highlights that I want to bring to your attention:

- Our high holiday webpage [www.bethsholomfrederick.org/worship/holidays](http://www.bethsholomfrederick.org/worship/holidays) is where you will find our full schedule of services, purchase extra tickets for friends and family, and RSVP for Children's Services, Rosh Hashanah second day lunch and Yom Kippur break fast
- We continue to embrace the beauty of the city of Frederick by utilizing Baker Park for our Rosh Hashanah Under the Stars on Friday evening September 15 and Tashlich ceremony on Sunday evening September 17
- Children's Services will be held for our younger kids aged 6-8 years old and older kids aged 9-11 years old (We encourage all kids 12 and up to be part of the services in the sanctuary)
- Baby sitting will be offered for children who are 2-5 years old (RSVP is needed for both children's services and baby sitting)

We continue to offer complimentary high holiday tickets to anyone who is new to Frederick, or who has never before joined us for High Holidays. I ask that you consider who among your friends and neighbors may need a place to spend Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. From my perspective, this is one of the greatest mitzvahs in which we can engage. You can help connect Jewish people in your life to our vibrant community at Beth Sholom. Whether folks end up formally joining our community, or simply having a meaningful Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, consider asking a Jewish family in your life to be together with us this year at Beth Sholom for the High Holidays. I am also excited to let you know that this year we will have name tags for everyone who has registered for our High Holiday services. This is a new initiative that I am bringing to Beth Sholom that I think will serve our congregation well. It will allow all our new members and guests to more easily meet and connect with our community. The nametags will also help me connect with each of you in my first year as Executive Director. We will consider keeping the nametags for some Shabbat services as well as other special programs. I do ask that everyone give this new initiative a try. We will have greeters at the door who will help you find your name tag as you enter the building for services.

Finally, as part of our continued commitment to inclusion and accessibility, we will have ASL (American Sign Language) interpretation at most of our services for the holidays. ## FAMILY EDUCATION CORNER

Elul, the month preceding the High Holy Days, is a time for Heshbon HaNefesh, a time of reflection, growth, and self-evaluation. Elul, which began on August 16th, is the last month of the Jewish year 5783. During Elul, it is customary to say Selichot, additional prayers for forgiveness, and these prayers are highlighted at a spe-

cial service the Saturday night before Rosh Hashanah. Selichot prayers are said to prepare oneself, to create a space for self-reflection leading up to the High Holy Days of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Rosh Hashanah, celebrated on the first two days of Tishrei, naturally lends itself to reflection and evaluation, hopefully leading to growth in the new beginning. This is where the tradition of making New Year's resolutions comes from.

Since Rosh Hashanah is the Jewish New Year, now is a great time to stop for a moment, as a family, and take stock of your Judaism. Is your family ready to make a Jewish resolution? Is there something additional you have thought about engaging in concerning your practices? Maybe it is lighting candles for Shabbat, sharing Friday night dinners with your family, attending Saturday morning Shabbat services, building a sukkah, dedicating one night a week to discussing current events in Israel, Tzedakah, or reading Jewish bedtime stories? What Heshbon HaNefesh will help prepare you and your family for the upcoming year?
