An Appetizing Tale

Almost two thousand years ago, the Roman emperor was wandering in disguise through the Jewish quarter on a Friday evening. He peeked into houses and saw Jews enjoying their

Shabbat evening meal with such evident relish that he decided he must find out what they were eating that gave them such pleasure.

So, the Emperor summoned the great Rabbi Yehoshua ben Chananya and told him that he wished to try some Jewish cooking. Chananaya invited Emperor Caesar to dine with him at his own home the following Friday evening. And Caesar came and feasted with the Rabbi- and it wasn't just the soup, and artichokes, and chicken, and challah- they lit candles together, and sang songs, and drank wine for kiddush. And the Emperor enjoyed the meal so much, he insisted the Rabbi send recipes for each and every one of the dishes he had tasted. The Imperial cooks were summoned and learned how each dish was prepared and as they learned, they diligently noted down every word and went back to the palace to prepare an identical meal for the Emperor.

The following day the imperial cooks prepared a banquet for Caesar in accordance with the instructions they had received, but after a few mouthfuls, the Emperor rose from his table in anger and ordered that his cooks be brought before him. "Why did you not follow the instructions you were given?" he demanded.

"But indeed, we did, mighty Caesar," they protested, trembling. "Down to the last pinch of salt."

"Then the Rabbi must have lied to you and kept something back," replied the Emperor.

A few hours later, Rabbi Yehoshua ben Chananya was summoned urgently to the palace where he was brought before an extremely angry Emperor.

"The meal which my cooks prepared tastes nothing like the meal I had at your house. You cannot have given them full instructions. Something is missing."

"Something is indeed missing," replied the Rabbi.
"A very special spice."

"What spice is that?" asked the Emperor, curiously.
"I must have that spice. I order you to give it to me."

"That spice is called *Shabbat*," replied the Rabbi. "It cannot be given, nor can it be bought. It comes of itself to those who love and celebrate Shabbat. So

powerful is that spice that when food is prepared lovingly, for the Sabbath, by those who cherish the Sabbath, everyone can taste a hint of it in the food."

It is true that our holiday food is delicious not simply because of its ingredients, but because of the way we enjoy sharing it and all the love and joy it represents. Shabbat is not our only secret spice. Anytime we gather together, every time we share a meal, and whenever we let our Jewish memory lead to modern celebration, we can taste and feel the special joy of togetherness.

At the end of March, we will be celebrating our second Passover affected by COVID. We will be virtual. We will be separate. And yet, we will still find the "Passover spice" that makes this holiday meaningful. We may find it in song; we may find it in words; we may find it in laughter or tears. Quite often, I find it in our holiday food.

I've been thinking about food a lot lately, and how it sustains us, how it brings us comfort and pleasure, and how the act of preparing food has defined so much of our time sheltering in place. While we try to virtually deliver the sense of community and joy with Zoom, the true secret to all during Passover is especially tasty foods. I am eager to share some of the best Passover recipes we have on my family's table. Maybe you can make one of them and from a distance, we can enjoy the holiday together. And remember, for them to really taste their best, you need to feel the joy of the holiday as you prepare them.:)

When I'm discussing Passover recipes, I have to begin with charoset. While American charoset is apples, nuts, cinnamon, and a splash of wine, there are other ways to make this delicious dish. Here are two of my family's unique charoset recipes.

Delicious Hamishah Passover Recipes

Rossett Douek, my cousins' Nona (grandmother), was a kind, beautiful and wonderful lady who prepared amazing charoset. Here is her recipe:

Rossett's Recipe (Sephardic/Egyptian)

(everything is "about this much"...)

10-15 pitted dates, chopped

1 apple, peeled and chopped

10 pitted prunes

dried fruit mix (apricots, pears, cherries, whatever)

3/4 cup sugar

1 small jar of honey

1 small jar of apricot jam (really, and fruit flavor)

1 box golden raisins

1 cup Maneshevitz wine

1 cup pomegranate juice

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

2-3 teaspoons candied ginger, chopped

zest of one lemon

ground walnuts

Combine fruits, wine, cinnamon, ginger, (well, everything but the walnuts) in a pot over low heat. stir. Bring to a slow boil and keep checking and stirring. Add more liquid (wine, juice, water) if needed. Mush it down. Either continue to cook or put it in a food processor to make it smooth.

Place in Tupperware in the refrigerator.

When ready to serve, sprinkle the ground walnuts over the top .

My Israeli Uncle, Herzl Shaltiel, is from Iran. He is an incredible person and chef who graciously shared his family recipe with me. In my opinion, this is the charoset that looks most like cement that might build pyramids!

Herzl's Haroset (Persian)

3.5 oz/100 g pistachio nuts (roasted)

3.5 oz/100 g cashew nuts (roasted)

3.5 oz/100 g almonds (roasted)

3.5 oz/100 g walnuts (roasted)

3.5 oz/100 g peanuts (roasted)

2 oz/50 g raisins

7 dates

2 oz/50 g prunes

2 pears

2 green apples

1 pomegranate (optional)

Grind/blend above ingredients into a spread consistency.

Add 1/2 t black pepper, 1 T sugar, sweet wine, juice or water to thin/moisten the mix but don't

make it too watery. Let stand for 2 hours and then taste and fix the taste or consistency.

Another idea is to stick to the classic American charoset but to put out all ingredients, salad bar style, and then have guests mix and make their own!

My next favorite category of Passover food is desserts! Here are two of the easiest, and yet most delicious, matzah-based desserts I love to make and eat.

First - a simple classic that is always a crowd pleaser, my mom's Passover candy bars.

Nona Jodi's Matzah Crunch

Prepare matzah by melting ½ a stick of butter/margarine in a jelly roll pan. Cover with matzah (doesn't really work with egg matzah - any other kind of matzah can be used).

On the stove top:

melt one stick of butter/margarine

and a pinch of salt

1 cup of sugar

½ cup brown sugar

Cook over medium heat for 3-5 minutes, stirring often.

Add 1 cup crushed pecans.

Cook 1-2 more minutes.

Immediately pour over matzah (already on a jelly roll pan).

Bake in a 350 oven for 8 minutes.

Option: sprinkle a 12oz package of chocolate chips on top and then return it to the oven for 2 minutes.

And finally, the easy and always delicious no-bake seven-layer cake. This recipe I learned from a friend's mom when I was in college. We went to Jacksonville one night of Passover and this incredible family welcomed me and even shared the recipe for the dessert I completely devoured. She told me the recipe came from someone named Janet Husney, but for me, it will always be:

Kathy Osterer's Passover No Bake 7 Layer Cake

3 1/2 oz bittersweet chocolate

1/4 lb margarine

I cup fine sugar (beat dry with mixer)

3 eggs separated

8 whole egg matzah

½ cup chopped walnuts (leave some whole for top)

Melt chocolate, allow to cool.

Beat egg whites until stiff, set aside. Cream the margarine with the sugar until fluffy and sugar is dissolved. Add the egg yolks one at a time, and beat well. Fold the chocolate into the egg yolk mixture and then fold in the egg white mixture. Add the nuts.

Dip the matzah one at a time in wine but do not soak. Place one matzah on a serving plate. Cover with approximately 1 ½ tablespoons of the chocolate nut filling, and continue this process until the 8th matzah is on top. Cover the top and sides with the rest of the filling. Decorate the top with walnut pieces. Cover with plastic wrap and let the cake mellow for 24 hours in the fridge. Cut into thin slices

**Please note that the eggs in this no-bake dessert are raw.

You may use pasteurized if concerned.

Let me know if you try and like any of these favorites of mine. Whatever you choose to make or buy, make sure you enjoy it with a joyful sense of the holiday, for this is the true secret to every recipe.

The month of March begins in the middle of the Hebrew month of Adar and moves into Nissan. So that means it is time to start preparing for **Passover**, which **starts the evening of March 27**. Pesach, or "Yom Tov" is a "festival of

freedom", which recounts the exodus from Egyptian slavery over 3000 years ago.

Last year, we were at the beginning of the pandemic, and observed the holiday at home away from our families and friends. Chef Adam prepared a delicious "seder in a box" for us to enjoy. Unfortunately, this year, we are still unable to gather in the temple for our festive meal.

No worries. We here at Temple Sinai have again developed an alternative to our Congregational Seder. It will once again be held on Zoom with Rabbi Kahn and Chazzan Abramson. This year, as we have become more adept with the Zoom technology, we plan to make the seder more interactive.

Because our temple kitchen is still closed, we are unable to prepare our "seder in a box". In its place, we are providing a **list of area restaurants and caterers** that will be offering seder meals to go. Just click on the links provided for each restaurant, order and pick up the meal on your own. Temple Sinai is not endorsing any facility; we are providing the list as a service to our members. Look for the information on our website.

As I write this article in early February, we are closely monitoring the COVID-19 numbers. We have opened the temple on Erev Shabbat for a limited number of attendees following strict COVID-19 protocols for your protection. You must register using the link on the website and weekly virtual connections. As this continues to be a fluid situation, we will be making any necessary changes as the data is published. You can also sign up for honors on the same link.

This month continues to have a full schedule of services, which are available online and limited in person by registration. Our first **Erev Shabbat on March 5 is our "Sinaiversary" Service** when we will honor our charter members and past presidents. On **Saturday, March 20**, we will celebrate the **Bar Mitzvah of Tamen Prada**. On **March 26**, the **5-7**th **grades** will participate in the service. We also have our intimate Saturday morning service and Torah study which is by Zoom only.

As we once again reimagine our Passover celebration, let us make our home our own sanctuary, and rejoice in the beauty of the season and the strength of Temple Sinai.

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT



A "New Normal"

My daughter in Columbus, Ohio, called me to say that if all the teachers in their school are vaccinated by the end of February, school would resume inperson fulltime beginning March 1st.

That would end a year of educational chaos and untold stress and anxiety. It would be eventful, almost cataclysmic. The world would suddenly be turned right side up after a shocking year of "this cannot be happening." Also shocking, but hopefully, in a positive way.

Progress has been made in the battle to conquer this COVID-19 virus. Better treatments, greater understanding of the nature of transmission and how to safeguard against it and certainly, the arrival of vaccines, all herald a promise of a new tomorrow. The question is, what will tomorrow look like? How will the "new normal" look for each of us, for businesses, for society, for Temple Sinai? Can we re-imagine the definition of "normal?"

It has been just about a year since we shut down inperson events, services and activities. Had you said to me last April that in 2021, we would not have a Food Fest or a Gala, I probably would have thought "That's ridiculous. You must be a pessimist." But such was not the case.

As the proverbial light at the end of the tunnel begins to grow brighter, we are starting to re-think what experiences we will take with us and what lessons we have learned from this year of COVID.


This re-imagining is an opportunity, not necessarily to return to old practices, but to glean what has worked and determine how new ones were successful. To that end, I hope to assemble a taskforce to do just this. Your generosity has supported us as we manage the loss of revenue needed to maintain our community, our staff and our
