

FROM YOUR CLERGY



SHALOM BAYIT

While we are taking steps to make this year's High Holy Day season everything it can be, one thing becomes clearer and clearer as we work toward the best possible end.

Regardless of the project, the holiday or the special circumstance, there is one element that everyone needs to think about as they approach a special day and as they leave that special day. That special element is *Shalom Bayit*. Shalom Bayit simply means *Peace in the House*.

Why is this so important now? My love for this place comes from my love for the congregation. Sure, there may be times when we disagree on something but the larger understanding behind keeping the peace in the house is what keeps us together and what I love most about our congregants.

I learned a great lesson about this recently from a host of congregants who taught me another valuable lesson about people and music. A dynamic occurred no less than three times during the month of May from members of a particular Chavurah at temple. They were looking for slightly more uptempo new music during the service, while another group, simultaneously was requesting the more familiar classics of the synagogue. Both groups were right; but how can that be the case? The time was right to incorporate some new music of this sort and those services were very well received by many from outside that particular chavurah. Although the inclusions were new to the congregation, I saw to it that the service did not provide a steady diet of new music. It was simply a matter of a few changes. Also, as time has passed, some very favorite classics have been brought back into the mainstream.

As for Temple Sinai's music in general, I should share with you that for about the last 20 years or so ordained HUC graduates have been charged with the responsibility of teaching, introducing and composing new music for our liturgy. According to Rabbi Larry Hoffman and President Rick Jacobs, this is how the new music of today becomes the familiar music of tomorrow. However, as important as music is, *Shalom Bayit* is even more important and applies to Shabbat Services, the High Holy Days, live streaming and just about anything else of which you could think. A recipe of timing, listening and balance are the watchwords for keeping

things working like a living organism which is what our temple is.

So, should you find that your live stream is a bit out of kilter or that the sound was not loud enough, just let us know. The more we know, the better we can address what needs to be done to keep our vital organization more and more receptive to the needs of our community.

Your comments will never fall on deaf ears. That is a promise.

At its most recent meeting in July, the Board of Trustees was pleased to finalize the contract extending Rabbi Samantha Kahn's employment another three years until June 2025,. We are delighted she will continue to serve our congregation and look forward to what the future will bring. A ketubah was signed by the Board and Rabbi Kahn, celebrating the ongoing relationship between us.

The board has continued to discuss and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, including the recent decision to re-institute mask wearing for all inside the temple. The Advisory Committee has continued to provide excellent guidance and advice to the board as we continue to address this everchanging situation.

The temple's gun policy was discussed in light of a new state law recently passed. The board affirms our ongoing policy, which is that firearms are prohibited on the property. Signage to that effect is posted at all entrances.

The board has decided to make Juneteenth (June 19th) a holiday for temple purposes, particularly now that it is a federal holiday. The office will be closed in observance.

A new Teen Engagement Membership category was created, allowing teens past B'nai Mitzvah age, whose families do not wish to be involved with the temple, to continue their Jewish life with us at a reduced membership rate. We believe that by engaging with these young people now, we will set them on a path to have a meaningful, engaged relationship with Judaism for the rest of their lives.

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT



Que sera, sera...

Do you remember this song? Doris Day sang it in a 1956 movie, *The Man Who Knew Too Much*. Neither Spanish nor Italian nor English, it is an English language phrase in the song written by

Ray Evans and Jay Livingston in 1955 to loosely convey the idea that we have little or no control over the future. What will be, will be...

You may wonder why this phrase has captured my attention just now. Could it be the reinstatement of a mask mandate just as we felt safe enough from COVID-19 to re-open the temple, and start traveling and seeing family and friends again? Could it be that sense of "oh no, here we go again"? Maybe...

Or maybe it is the sense of frustration and futility and anxiety that swirls around me as I read and listen to the news, as if such an impartial reporting vehicle exists anymore. We seem to be a world in great physical and emotional distress. To name just a few: Glaciers are melting at an astonishingly rapid rate. Fires are out of control in the western US. Heat has broken records around the world. School children in the hundreds are being abducted by fanatics in Africa. Dictatorships and authoritarianism are on the rise and democracies on the demise. Extremist groups of every race, color, nationality, and creed appear to be gaining strength in numbers. Millions of people are suffering the loss of family members due to this pandemic. Could these alarming events be the connection I am feeling to Que sera sera? Maybe...

But sitting in the Sanctuary during a recent Erev Shabbat service, I felt the tremendous power of *Haskiveinu* as Chazzan sang this beautiful evening prayer:

Hashkiveinu Adonai Eloheinu I'shalom V'ha'amideinu Malkeinu I'cha--yim Spread the shelter of Your peace over us Guide us in wisdom, compassion, and trust Hashkiveinu...

Save us for the sake of Your name Shield us from hatred sorrow and pain Hashkiveinu... I'cha--yim L'cha--yim, I'cha--yim

Meant as a prayer to be said before going to bed, it asks God to watch over us as we sleep. But I felt the beauty and power of it and the need to say this morning, noon, and night to give me the strength to remember the good in the world, in the people of the world, and in the compassion and love we share with others.

As we are about to embark on the 10 days of prayer, self-reflection, and repentance we call the Days of Awe, I thought about how these holidays fit with the feeling of loss of control and future uncertainty exemplified by the phrase Que sera, sera. And then I felt relief reminding myself that, first and foremost, as we enter these days of reflection and repair, we turn inward. We find in ourselves the ability to forgive and to ask forgiveness of others. We are in control of ourselves, of our actions, of how we view the world and how we interact with it. Hatred, sorrow and pain will always exist. It is the wisdom, compassion, and trust within each of us that will allow us to spread peace over ourselves and others.

I wish each of you a meaningful time of reflection, forgiveness, and repair over these Days of Awe. And I am most grateful, above all, for your compassion and trust as we come together to welcome a New Year. May you be sealed, once again, in the Book of Life.







According to tradition, God judges us during the 10 Days of Awe between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. We seek, through "teshuvah" or repentance, to be inscribed in the "Book of Life."

There is also the tradition of visiting the graves of loved ones between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Since many of us have relatives who are buried in distant places, we will come together as a communal family on Sunday, September 12th, to remember and honor those who came before us. The site for the **Kever Avot Service** will be the Palms Memorial Park in Sarasota.

During **Tashlich**, we observe the tradition of casting off the sins of the previous year by tossing breadcrumbs or pebbles into flowing water. This year we will meet at Turtle Beach and, as a community, embrace the joy of symbolically ridding ourselves of transgressions.

Judaism places strong emphasis on learning and we'll be able to follow that tradition on Yom Kippur afternoon. In addition to the posted schedule in the *Tablet*, we have added the workshop, "Is Anyone Listening to Our Prayers and How Do We Get Answers?" that will be led by Reb Ari Shapiro.

And just about the time we're all thinking about the clock ticking down to breaking the fast, we follow tradition by attending the beautiful **N'ilah** service, with final prayers of repentance. The individual members of our congregation will join together as one with the final long blast of the Shofar (*Tekiah Gedolah*), instilling us with spiritual strength and renewed confidence in the future.

TEMPLE SINAI SANCTUARY

In December of 2020, in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, with the Temple essentially closed for inperson events, our Temple President, Ellyn Bender, received an email offering a very generous donation by an honored member and Past President of the Temple, to beautify the Sanctuary. Gwen Baseman Ziomek and her husband Joe Ziomek wanted to express their appreciation and love for Temple Sinai with a meaningful and enduring gift. "My husband and I wanted to have a project that we could give to. And this was my dream from back when the Temple was being built," Gwen said.

Ellyn contacted Allan Shavitz, the Temple's Chair of the Art and Aesthetics Committee, who, as a professional interior designer, has designed the interiors of many temples and synagogues. As Gwen, Allan and Ellyn explored various possibilities for enhancing the Sanctuary, it did not take long for each of them to enthusiastically embrace the idea of adding color and beauty to the space using stained glass. "I was inspired by the stained glass of Marc Chagall and I grew up in a synagogue with stained glass," Gwen said.

Allan, after speaking to several artists, recommended David Ascalon of Ascalon Studios in New Jersey to design and fabricate the windows. Once the Ascalon Studios contract was approved, Gwen, Allan, and Ellyn began working on the magical and creative process to design windows that would elicit a spiritual uplift to all who entered the Sanctuary. Gwen envisioned a design that would continue the look and feel of the colorful Torah covers. "I had two stipulations," Gwen said. "One, it had to be colorful to match the vibrant Torah covers, and two, it needed to be done by the High Holy days".

During the design phase that extended over several months, the three were in frequent contact, going through numerous cycles of reviewing and revising the designs submitted by David Ascalon. As Gwen did not want any specific imagery depicted, a modern design of Jerusalem was chosen. Although each of the versions presented were beautiful, much tweaking of color and detail ensued until the final designs met approval.

Once the two side window designs were finalized, Gwen commented that the window over the Ark "looked lonely." With another incredibly generous offer, Gwen and Joe provided an additional donation and asked David Ascalon to design the center window as well. After several iterations, the design chosen reflected the graceful and uplifting etching of the glass in the Ark doors and the space above behind the Eternal Light. Echoing the colors of the side windows, the center glass brought all three windows into harmony while emphasizing the simple beauty of the Ark doors.

The installation of the glass along with exterior Led lighting was completed the first week of August 2021 and a dedication was held during the August 6th Erev Shabbat service. Gwen expressed her love for Temple Sinai and gratefully acknowledged the love and support that she has experienced from the congregation over the many years she has been a member. This gift from Gwen and Joe will stand as an everlasting testament and legacy of that gratitude. Gwen and Joe said, "Neither of us dreamt we would be able to do something like this and especially during the Temple's thirtieth year anniversary. We hope that the Temple will grow and expand while keeping its warm and welcoming attitude, embracing the spiritual leadership and laymen because it feels like a home away from home."

A note on the Artist: David Ascalon. Ascalon Studios was started by David Ascalon's father Maurice who left his home in Hungary to become a sculptor and eventually immigrated to Palestine in 1934. David was born in Tel Aviv in 1945. The family moved to the United States in 1956 where David began his formal training to follow his father's talents. David's son Brad is an industrial designer known for his furniture designs manufactured by world leading companies such as Herman Miller, Knoll, Bernhardt and Ligne Roset.
