### They got it from us!

The evidence: Things they don't teach you in school, like the Pilgrims modeling their autumn thanksgiving holiday after the Jewish harvest holiday of Sukkot, celebrated just a few weeks earlier.

This is actually not surprising considering that the Pilgrims - goofy hats and al - modeled their society after the ancient Hebrews. To the point that they actually learned Hebrew, including while afloat on the Mayflower.

"Look on the back of a draft of the Mayflower Compact. You see the English-Hebrew worksheets they were studying at the time," says author, historian, commentator Sha'i ben-Tekoa. In fact, says ben-Tekoa, the Pilgrims saw themselves in distinctly biblical terms. "They believed that in settling the new land, they were like the Israelites crossing into the Promised Land."

Here in the United States, Thanksgiving is one of the few legal holidays without paganism or other religious overtones," says Rabbi Chaim Wolosow, co-director of the Chabad Center of Sharon, Mass., "so all those who are wary of the other Christian holidays can truly enjoy this one since it's completely pareve."

And because the holiday has no overt religious overtones, Americans of varying faiths are able to celebrate it together.

### FROM YOUR CLERGY



November 2020 has arrived - and this will be an important month. While I sit here writing this article weeks before we know what our election results will be, I know 5 facts that are positively true.

#### #1 - It's important to Vote

As proud Americans and proud Jews, we know it is our right and responsibility to participate in the democratic process. Rabbi Dara Lithwick writes, "Judaism teaches us that voting is not just a civic duty. In fact, throughout Jewish history, many of our rabbis and sages have framed voting as a mitzvah, a Jewish imperative." And let's be clear: it is a mitzvah to vote no matter your political affiliations. Judaism embraces everyone's right to hold their opinion and to work to elect those who they believe best represent their understanding of what is most needed. So, if your plan is to stay at home and not participate, I hope you will change your mind and go out and vote.

#### #2 - This is an important moment

Whatever happens will be historic, and we are excited to be participating in this moment of history. Writer for TheHill.com, Reid Wilson, explained back in January that, "This year's election is the most important in our lifetime. It is a tired cliché, one parroted by presidents and politicians every two years in hopes of driving their voters to the polls. But clichés become clichés for a reason: They tend to be true. This year, the decisions voters make in November will reverberate for a generation to come, through all three branches of American government and across the world. The presidential contest alone will represent perhaps the starkest choice between two competing visions for the nation's future since the elections of 1860 that set the Union on course for a civil war."

#### #3 - We are divided

And while I have no way of knowing what the election results will be, I do know for certain that whatever the outcome, approximately half of our nation will be excited while the other half will be sad, or angry, or disappointed. #### #4 - We must come together



### **AUGUST BOARD BRIEFS**

The Temple Sinai Board of Trustees meeting was held on August 12, 2020 via Zoom teleconference. Rabbi Kahn led us in a beautiful opening prayer, reminding us how important and fortunate we are to be able to virtually come together. Chazzan shared how excited he was for everyone to see the amazing service that Temple Sinai has been preparing for the High Holy Days. He, Rabbi Kahn and many others have been working tirelessly to give our temple members a meaningful and beautiful service, despite not being able to physically be all together.

President Ellyn Bender updated us on the arrest of Vincent Martinez, who defaced the temple. He has been charged with three crimes and is currently awaiting trial. Since these acts are hate crimes, he is facing up to 15 years in jail. Ellyn shared that as horrible as these crimes are, it has been profoundly moving, connecting, to get the support of so many different people locally as well as throughout our county.

Ellyn Bender asked the board for approval for the change in signatories for the Allegiant bank account for the new board positions: Ellyn Bender, President, Alan Chalfin, President Elect and Marv Rosen, VP Finance. The board approved the change in signatories.

Gary Kravitz shared that the extension of the eight week period of to spend the PPP loan has been a lifeline for our temple.

Marv Rosen, VP Finance, shared that it is exceedingly difficult to predict what the next few months for Temple Sinai will look like, as membership, membership donations, and religious school are up in the air. Membership and religious school enrollment are significantly down from last year. Since membership, religious school enrollment, Food Fest and many other events will not happen, so in spite of the fact that the clergy have been working tirelessly to find creative ways to keep our temple connected, membership and religious school enrollment are down.


Judy Swerdlow, VP Ritual, discussed that due to the pandemic, it has been an especially difficult process trying to navigate what to do for our High Holy Day tickets. Due to technological as well as economic feasibility, it will not be possible to charge for the services online. Temple Sinai is working on creating beautiful and moving High Holy Day Services, because it is especially important to us to still find a way to have these beautiful services and remain connected to the temple and each other. Although High Holy Day tickets are being waived, it is important to remember that supporting the temple is

helping ensure the future of Temple Sinai for years to come.

Laura Friedman has taken all measures and necessary procedures to ensure the safety of the children and teachers at The Gan. They are finding ways to live and operate this "new normal". Laura also addressed the unfortunate incident of the temple being vandalized. There have been families who have pulled out from The Gan due to security fears. The Gan has taken swift action and hired an armed police officer to stand outside of school during the school day. Laura is having to ease concerns and worries everyday due to the incident and to ensure the safety and protection of everyone there.

Bethany Leinweber shared updates on the religious school. There are many challenges facing us today. Enrollment and payment for the children is at an all-time low. Although providing both in-school and online programs, it has been difficult to get families to commit and pay. Bethany and Sherry have been reaching out to families. Both of them are willing to work with and help any family in need.
