FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS



Every year we look forward to celebrating Chanukah. We exchange gifts, we eat special food and we sing different music. Most of all, we take special joy in the lighting of the Chanukah candles.

We remember the miracle of how one cruse of oil lasted for eight nights. As we add a new candle each night to the menorah, there is one detail that we often overlook and that is perhaps the biggest miracle of all.

That one cruse of oil did not light itself. In the face of hopeless darkness, someone had to take action. Someone needed to strike a flint in order to create the flame that would light the oil. This is true for our Chanukah candles as well. Every time we light the Chanukah candles, we carry on the tradition of taking action in the face of desperate times because of our faith in God. This is where the miracle really begins.

Just as we learn in the Midrash, it was only after he saw that Nachshon had enough faith in God to walk head high into the sea that Moses held up his staff and parted the water. It was that same faith in God that helped the Maccabees prevail against all odds returning the temple to the Jews.

May we all remember as we light the Chanukah candles this year that there is nothing we cannot overcome. Take the light of the holiday into your hearts so that you can carry the lessons of action, courage and faith with you all year long.

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear friends,

As I sit at my desk contemplating my monthly message to you, I'm reminded of things just passed and things to come. At our November 4 Erev Shabbat service, Chazzan reminded us of the anniversary of Kristallnacht, thought by many as marking the beginning of the Holocaust. This morning, I was deeply moved by our Holocaust Survivor Speaker Series when presenter Helga Melmed told of her personal experiences surviving the hate and persecution of the Holocaust. And then there was last week's news of the successful interception and suppression by the FBI of a threat against a synagogue in New Jersey. These are all painful reminders that our Jewish way of life cannot be taken for granted. We must learn from the lessons of the past and speak up about the atrocities happening today.

Now, more than ever, we also need your financial help! Our staff and volunteers work tirelessly to curate events that match our values and interests and which take time and money to implement.

"A Night at the Theater" on December 10 and the "Sarasota Jewish Food Festival" on January 29 are ways to showcase our synagogue, provide creative and entertaining programs AND raise much-needed funds. "Hands on Hanukkah" December 18-23 gets us out into the community, reaching unaffiliated families in Sarasota and Manatee counties. It is free to attend but not to produce; your donations help us to fund that program and many others.

Many of us recently attended a Veterans Day Erev Shabbat service recognizing each of our synagogue members who served in the military, honoring the sacrifice they made to keep our country safe and preserve our freedom. Now we ask each of you to make a financial sacrifice to sustain our synagogue and protect our Jewish religion and culture for future generations. Faced with the recent and continuing wave of antisemitism in our country and around the world, we need your help by contributing to the Annual Appeal to keep us financially strong and enable us to thrive now and into the future.

There will be a Lego menorah building contest, face painting and dreidel cookie decorating, which will be fun and tasty. The week kicks off Sunday, December 18, at 4:00PM at the Mall at University Town Center (UTC) in front of Saks Fifth Avenue with activities, a performance by Florida Studio Theatre and candle lighting by Temple Sinai's Senior Clergy, Chazzan Cliff Abramson.

Monday, December 19, at 5:00PM at Selby Gardens, Lights in Bloom, the Players Centre for Performing Arts will present Hanukkah dances, and candle lighting will be by Erik Arroyo, Mayor of the City of Sarasota.

Tuesday, December 20, at 4:00PM at St. Armand's Circle, Rise Above Performing Arts Centre will entertain, and Sarah Wertheimer, Executive Director of Embracing Our Differences, will conduct the candle lighting ceremony.

Thursday, December 22, from 4:00PM to 6:00PM at Waterside Place at Lakewood Ranch, sponsored by The Jewish Federation of Sarasota-Manatee, features Booker High School Modern Band and Shep Englander, CEO of The Jewish Federation of Sarasota-Manatee, will be conducting the candle lighting ceremony.

Friday, December 23, at 6:00PM the week will conclude at Temple Sinai with a festive service, a concert performance by the Sarasota Jewish Chorale, and Chazzan Abramson leading the candle lighting ceremony. Dinner open to the community follows the service, \$18 for adults and \$5 for children 12 and under.

TEMPLE SINAI PRESENTS “A NIGHT AT THE THEATER – BROADWAY AND MORE!”

You are invited to a special musical performance on Saturday, December 10, from 7:00pm to 9:00pm at Temple Sinai, by the outstanding husband-and-wife team, mezzo-soprano Sarah Nordin and bass-baritone Tyler Putnam. Nordin and Putnam have been delighting audiences across the country with a variety of American standards and opera, classical and musical theater songs. The two met while working on a production of Rodgers and Hammerstein's *South Pacific* in New Hampshire and have been touring the country together ever since.

Ms. Nordin has performed with the Metropolitan Opera and toured with the company in Japan. She is a specialist in operas by Mozart and Rossini. Praised by Opera News for the “clear beauty” of her voice and her “spot-on comic timing,” Ms. Nordin has charmed audiences at opera houses in Tampa, Orlando, St. Petersburg and St. Louis. Most notably, in 2021, Ms. Nordin made her solo debut at Carnegie Hall.

Mr. Putnam has performed with The Santa Fe Opera, Opera Omaha, and Manitoba Opera. Possessing a voice described as “robust and resonant” by TheatreMania and deemed a “standout” by Opera Magazine, Mr. Putnam is in high demand. World premieres, operettas and musicals further distinguish the broad scope of his abilities as a singer and actor.

We need to work together, including congregants and the marketing team, to get the word out regarding events. One idea was to schedule evening meetings (which are not religious or income-generating) only one day during the week to save money on running the building. This motion was passed. The building will be dark on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday evenings.



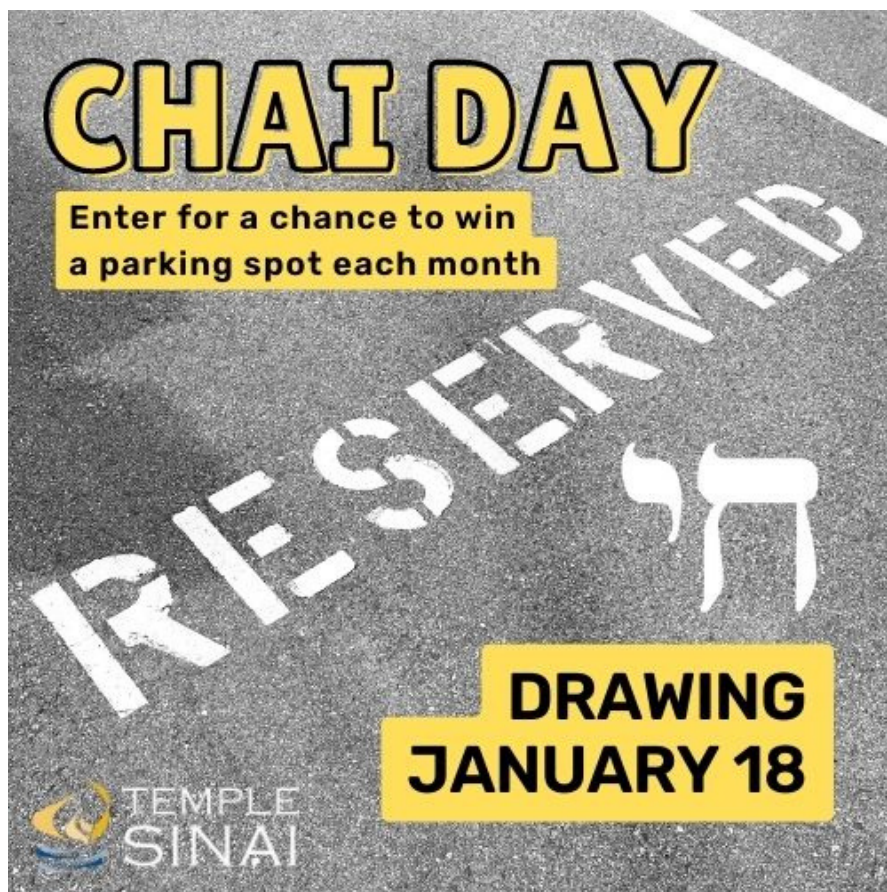
