DAYS OF REFLECTION APPROACHING



The High Holy Days

Thoughts of the High Holy Days may begin permeating our minds as we approach the month of Elul which coincides with the Gregorian calendar date of August 18. It is during the month of

Elul that we prepare ourselves for the Yamim Noraim (The Days of Awe). This period of reflection means many different things to people but many prepare by studying and taking time for personal reflection. Part of this reflection includes looking back on the previous year to contemplate how we might have done things in a way that reflects our best selves. On Yom Kippur, we say two forms of a confessional. The long form begins with the words Al Cheit which loosely translated means "For the sin" and refers to a "sin" we have committed. But in fact, the word Cheit does not mean sin. It means "target," so when we look back at the year that has passed, we are not reflecting on how we may have sinned but rather on how we may have missed the mark of being our best selves.

As part of Elul, we ask for forgiveness from those we may have wronged. This is an important time in our community as it is a period that culminates in a prayer service often observed on the Saturday evening before Rosh Hashanah or a bit earlier, as is the Ashkenazic custom. This holiday is known as Selichot and during the prayer service, we ask for forgiveness from God, who we believe will forgive our transgressions from that target mark we try so hard to find the center of all year.

While the Selichot service is all about repentance and is similar in tone to Yom Kippur, it is also about purity. In many congregations, the Torah covers are changed to white covers to reflect the quote from Isaiah, which says that "through our repentance, our sins will be made white as snow." Traditionally this service would start at midnight on Saturday evening based on Psalm 119.62, "at midnight I rise to praise thee." Today in many synagogues, the service begins earlier, and the service and study session do not continue late into the evening but rather begin with a dessert reception followed by a thought-provoking study session culminating in the service itself. This service often has some of the most beautiful music and liturgy of the year, foreshadowing many of the themes for the Days of Awe. This year we will observe Selichot on Saturday, September 9, at 7:00pm with a dessert reception, service and program; I hope to see you all there.

May these days of reflection lead all of you to a deep and meaningful Yamim Noraim.

Please renew your membership as soon as possible and remember: what makes this congregation unique, warm and engaging is each one of YOU. It's your warmth, friendship and commitment to Temple Sinai that gives this congregation its soul. For your spiritual and worship needs, I want to assure you that Chazzan Abramson and the ritual committee are busy working on new and creative High Holy Day services... stay tuned!

MEETING SUMMARY May 17, 2023

Board meetings are open to all Temple Sinai members.

Our next meeting will be held on Wednesday, July 19 at 7:00pm.

Welcome and Board Orientation: President Alan Chalfin reviewed board guidelines, bylaws, standing rules, and "Good and Welfare" He also acknowledged and discussed meeting etiquette and protocol moving forward.

Review of BOT Meeting Dates and Board Retreat: President Alan Chalfin and President-Elect Sherry Thomas noted that all board meeting dates for next year were emailed out and reminded everyone that the board would be installed on Friday, June 23, at Erev Shabbat services and the Board Retreat on Sunday, June 25, will be held at the synagogue.

Billing for June: President Alan Chalfin, President-Elect Sherry Thomas, and Financial Secretary Amy Drachman stated that membership billing must go out as close to June 1 as possible and should include a statement about the security increase of \$200 but no dues increase. Motion proposed by Sherry Thomas to charge a service charge to all credit card transactions for the year for any payment made on ShulCloud. Daryl Worobow seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously.

Sanctuary Lights: VP of Facilities Chester Perlinski discussed his intention to change out sanctuary lights to LED bulbs. Once they are installed, they will last for many years. The project will be completed in June without having to move anything.

Tablet briefs: President Alan Chalfin initiated a discussion about the future of the Tablet. Questions were raised regarding possibly going back to the paper version as a potential revenue stream for advertisements. Questions were raised about who was going to produce it and sell the advertisements in it. A need to understand the pros and cons of digital production versus paper was identified and a committee was formed to review and analyze the situation. Rob Krasow, Florey Miller, Daryl Worobow and Wende Koslow volunteered to be on the committee.

Overview of the new website: President Alan Chalfin announced that the website redesign is complete and the site is live. He asked that constructive feedback be given to Andrea Eiffert for suggested modifications as there are certain elements of the website design that may be modified.


Introduction of URJ Congregational Code of Ethics: President Alan Chalfin provided a summary of his experience at the URJ Scheidt Seminar for synagogue presidents. He emphasized that a big focus of the seminar was to establish a congregational code of ethics, which is essentially a code of conduct established between congregants, staff and laypersons. The board will work on this together at the upcoming board retreat.
