WHY DO WE LAUGH AT PURIM?



The question above may seem almost rhetorical to some. Shouldn't the answer simply be; because it's fun? This year we use the Marx Brothers as the vehicle to tell the story. It is a funny vehicle for a spiel but the actual reason for the holiday itself is more complicated.

The annual holiday celebration helped the Jewish people in the dark days of their history to maintain their trust in the ultimate deliverance from the dangers and difficulties besetting them. All of the merrymaking, feasting and masquerading during Purim served as a much-needed relief from the serious life the Jews led during most of the year. After all, the anti-Semitic trope of dual loyalty that Haman utters: "There is a certain people ... dispersed among the peoples in all the provinces of thy kingdom; and their laws are diverse from those of every people; neither keep they the king's laws", is an argument that has been used against the Jews for centuries. It relies upon a false claim - that Jews are incapable of devotion to their own community and their neighbors and fellow citizens. In the Purim story, the irony of this claim could not be starker: the king's life is saved by a Jew and his queen is Jewish as well. There are many "Hamans" in every generation. So why do we laugh, play and make merry? Perhaps we can learn a lesson from Mel Brooks.

Years ago, I was present at the premiere of Mel Brooks' Broadway production of "The Producers." When the characters in the play began to talk and sing about the show within the show "Springtime for Hitler," several couples got up and left the theater, not understanding the purpose of the song. When interviewed some months later, Brooks said "If you can make fun of Hitler, if you can have people laugh at him, then you win."

Isn't it better to defeat our enemies by weakening their power over us by laughing at them rather than fighting them? Yes, in our Purim spiels, we learn that Haman gets hanged. But Purim reminds us that he was a fool the first time we hear the grogger.

Just as things were reaching a crisis point in 1953, Stalin died....on Purim!

I hope every female member of Temple Sinai will consider joining the Women of Sinai and helping us to celebrate all the facets of our history and our future together.

MEETING SUMMARY

January 18, 2023

President Chalfin welcomed new board member Myron Bernstein who will be completing the term of Bob Handleman serving as VP of Administration.

Guest **Lucy Thomas** shared that her Girl Scout troop will prepare a five-course meal for thirty people before the March 15 board meeting. This will serve as a fundraiser for the synagogue and the troop will earn a badge.

<u>Kitchen and Catering</u> – **Myron Bernstein, VP of Administration and**Jerry Thomas, Kitchen Manager, stated that they are working on guidelines to ensure events held at the synagogue are profitable. Jerry will perform a cost analysis to review the cost of air conditioning, consumables, lights, etc. before finalizing the guidelines. A closed-circuit camera system has been installed to allow the kitchen manager to observe activity in the kitchen. The list of approved caterers is being reviewed and will be expanded.

<u>Line of Credit Drawdown</u> – **Marvin Rosen, VP of Finance** is completing the paperwork required to obtain a drawdown of funds from a line of credit before the February 23 deadline. He has received a verbal acceptance from the bank.

<u>Proposed Purchase of Cemetery Lots</u> – **Myron Bernstein**. First, Myron conveyed that Temple Sinai's location in the cemetery was in disrepair and he negotiated a commitment from the cemetery to clear debris and replace broken headstones. Next, Myron proposed the purchase of additional plots since Temple Sinai is running out of space in the cemetery. The board discussed and decided to first try to sell the remaining plots to generate some revenue to purchase additional plots.

New Caterer Approval – **Pearl Perlinski** motioned to approve Atria Café as the caterer for the upcoming Casino Night fundraiser. He has collected the required licensing from them and will schedule an orientation in the kitchen for them as per synagogue bylaws.

<u>Member Resignations</u> – **Alan** discussed the non-payment of outstanding dues balances when a member resigns mid-year. Discussions continued regarding updating the policies and applications during members' annual renewals.

<u>Weekly Welcome Receptions</u> will be resumed beginning February 3. **President-Elect Sherry Thomas** requested volunteers and sponsors. The fee for a basic reception is \$250. A reception will run from 5:00pm to 5:45pm, allowing fifteen minutes for clean up before services begin.

Good and Welfare mentioned that the Temple Sinai website redesign is underway and that Rabbi Huntting will assist Chazzan Abramson in leading the Passover Seder.


Please help us spread the word and invite your friends!


