
Howard Raiken Wins Photo Contest



A New Year for the Trees

The American Rabbi published a Coronavirus story, that took place in Italy. It read:

A 93-year-old man was stricken with COVID-19 and in spite of his age, he somehow survived. Upon being discharged from the hospital, he was presented with a very large bill. Part of it was for payment for the ventilator which he had been put on for one day.

Reading the amount that was due, the old man began to cry. The hospital felt a sense of compassion and told him not to worry – surely something could be worked out to reduce the cost to something more manageable. What the old man responded made the hospital workers weep.

The old man explained, "I don't cry because of the money I have to pay. Thankfully I am able to afford it. I cry for another reason. I cry because I've just come to realize after all these many years on earth I've been breathing God's air for 93 years, yet I have never had to pay for it. It seems it takes over €500 to use a ventilator in the hospital for one day. Do you know how much I owe God? Why haven't I ever truly thanked God all the days of my life for the miracle of this divine gift which I took for granted?"

Many of us, just like this 93-year-old man, have been breathing air without considering the cost for years and years. We should not only be thanking God for the air we breathe but also God's majestic creations - Trees.



Trees have the ability to provide an essential of life for all living things on our planet – oxygen! The Jewish holiday of Tu B'Shevat (the 15th of Shevat) is a great time to pause and appreciate the gifts of trees. It is an amazing festival, an ancient celebration of the new year for trees, that has changed and evolved over 20 centuries, and has never been more vital or more significant than it is today.

There are many traditions for how to celebrate this "New Year for the Trees". At Sinai we engage in planting trees, donating money to organizations that plant trees, and hosting a Tu B'shevat seder. The Seder is a festive ceremony, featuring wine and other Earthgrown gifts, like fruits and nuts. On Tu B'shevat we stop to appreciate our relationship with land and nature, our relationship with our community, our relationship with the world at large, and our relationship with spirituality. And all of this is rooted in learning from the gifts and glamor of the life of the tree.

There will be a box set up in the Lobby of the Temple that will say "For HIPPY Books" throughout the month of January.



JEWISH ETHICS FOR TODAY, A PRESENTATION BY THREE RABBIS, DECEMBER 19

since America's Civil War, our country has never been more divided and polarized. Do Jewish ethics bridge or widen the divide among our Jewish population? From traditional Judaism guided by divine law to liberal Judaism guided by ethics, how can we bring all Jews together as one people? Are we still one people? A distinguished panel of rabbis from Modern Orthodox, Conservative and Reform backgrounds discussed these questions from their understandings of Jewish ethics.

The panel included Modern Orthodox Rabbi Dr. Eugene Korn of Jerusalem, Conservative Rabbi Dr. Stuart Altshuler of Temple Beth Sholom, Sarasota and Reform Rabbi Samantha Kahn of Temple Sinai, Sarasota. Cantor Murray Simon served as moderator and chanted some beautiful prayers, as well.

Rabbi Korn proposed that we are a holy people and justice, i.e., fairness and compassion, are foremost in Jewish ethics. We can disagree with each other and still respect one another. Rabbi Altshuler emphasized the need for the preservation of Jewish people and spoke about our rich Jewish tradition. Rabbi Kahn said Reform Judaism gives us the opportunity to interpret and make informed choices based on modern circumstances which sometimes outweigh Jewish legal code. Questions and discussion followed this stimulating and thought provoking presentation.

People attended this free program, co-sponsored by Temple Sinai and Temple Beth Sholom, in person at Temple Sinai and on Zoom.



Then my children were growing up in Bryn Mawr, PA., we spent many snowy January mornings listening to Radio KYW1060 to hear the list of school closing numbers. Since school district websites did not yet exist, you often had to wait until hundreds of numbers were called before the broadcaster got to your district. If that number was called, it meant school was either closed or opening late. Shouts of joy emanated from my kids if schools were closed, while working parents, like me, moaned because we now had to scramble for childcare.



January reminds me of contrasting perspectives on the weather. Those who dread the cold, dreary, gray days just want the month to be over. But many who view beauty in freshly fallen snow see it as a sign, as Paul Theroux said, that "winter is a season of recovery and preparation".

Nature has been preparing its trees to bloom anew, and the Jewish holiday of Tu B'Shevat celebrates the remarkable ability of trees to begin bearing fruit again. It is known as the New Year of Trees. Just as we celebrate the secular New Year by making heart-felt resolutions, so Tu B'Shevat celebrates nature's resolution to renew itself. In the Land of Israel, it is the beginning of Spring and the notion of rebirth embraces our sense that the glass is half full. The earliest blooming trees in Israel emerge from their winter "sleep" and begin a new fruit-bearing cycle. Many environmentalists look at the earth with a glass half empty attitude. From Tu B'Shevat, we can use our glass half full perspective to actively commit to conserving earth's natural resources.

Here at Temple Sinai, as we embark on the beginning of our 31st year and recover from COVID-19-related isolation, let's keep the spirit of the glass half full by attending a variety of innovative Shabbat services in January (including a Women of Sinai Shabbat and Jackson Thomas Mitchell's Bar Mitzvah) and volunteering to participate by signing up through SignUpGenius.

Happy New Year! I wish you all a January in Florida that's free from snow and full of brightness.
