FROM YOUR CLERGY

In the doing

Tor those of you who know me, you know that I do not often write about political issues. But there are some issues that just hit too close to home to go without comment. It is not my intent to offend anyone. However, it is just far too important to our congregation and the community at large not to offer these few thoughts.

It is no small wonder that one of the most quoted lines from the Torah is 'Justice, Justice You Shall Pursue". While the idea behind this line is both profound and universal there is a deeper meaning that bears examination. This deeper examination I believe has great relevance to our community today.

The sentence "Justice, Justice Shall You Pursue" means not just that justice is something we all must strive to have. It also means on a deeper level that a world of justice does not exist; not in days that the Torah was written, not today and in all likelihood, not in the days to come. This may seem like a depressing message, but there is a lesson of hope in its deepest meaning.

On Sunday, February 20 I attended a rally held by The Jewish Federation of Sarasota and Manatee County. The rally was held at Bayfront Park in Sarasota and was very well attended. All the speakers were committed in their messages, but very few had anything new to say about the wave of anti-Semitic activity that Sarasota had been experiencing in recent days with the clandestine distribution of hateful, anti-Semitic flyers that had been dumped overnight on the lawns of homes in several of our communities.

The spirit of the rally and its intent to create a sense of solidarity in this matter was very successful. It reminded people that we are not alone and that law enforcement is very well aware of what is happening and that we need not be afraid. Every rally I have ever been to has been like this one. It was successful in raising awareness of the problem but spent very little time on what to do next.

There was one speaker however, who introduced a concept that I believed opened a new door. I cannot remember who the speaker was, but he opened the group up to the concept of "Open Solidarity". The



idea was that this was not just our problem. He said what we all know but seldom act upon: that an act of hate against one group is an act of hate against us all. And as a result, all must be involved in not just the response to an act of hate, but rather to behavior that will keep these acts from happening as much as we can. It is one thing to talk about solidarity, but it is another thing to act on it.

Upon hearing of this rally, my friend and colleague Pastor Steven McConnell of the Church of the Palms informed me that he would be attending this rally with many from his congregation. He was not asked to come, but he knew it was the right thing to do. This kind of solidarity between communities of our own and communities of our friends brings about change.

We have already seen changes in law enforcement, but not enough for prevention. We have seen the very beginning of discussions among our law makers about this issue, but it is only in its infancy if at all. The long march through the institution can take its lead from the Religious Action Center in Washington, DC that understands that solidarity means votes and votes mean significant change.

Will there ever be a time when we don't have the need to pursue justice because injustice no longer exists? It is highly unlikely. This does not mean that our goal should be and must be this lofty. Our religion is one of doing. It is in the doing that we have survived so long and will continue to thrive.

FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

Planted

The other day I passed by a small sign that caught my eye. It said, "Grow Where You are Planted". I don't know why, but it set me to thinking. It is a simple concept. Wherever you find yourself, by choice or not, take stock of your surroundings and look at the directions in which you could invest yourself and grow some roots.

Perhaps you moved to our area because of a job opportunity for you or your spouse. Perhaps it was to be near elderly parents. Maybe you just wanted to be out from the cold weather. It may make a difference if your move is by choice or not. You may find that even when a move is by choice, the result is not as expected or hoped.

Or, perhaps, no physical move is involved. Take, for example, the pandemic scenario. In the last two years, our world has been turned upside down and inside out. The ground has shifted beneath us, but for most of us, we have not moved anywhere. Perhaps quite the contrary, we have moved around less than ever. Yet, our roots have been stunted. Our connections to family and friends have become less in-person and more virtual. We missed seeing the birth of a grandchild or celebrating a b'nai mitzvah or attending a wedding. We have seen far less of the friends with whom we used to share meals and bake bread. Eating out is now a considered risk and some of our favorite haunts are no longer.

A sense of isolation, the breaking of familiar routines, the concern over being exposed to this virus and resulting complacency has essentially caused us to re-plant our lives while remaining in place. We are developing new routines and perspectives on what is necessary to have or to do and what is not. We are re-thinking our definition of socializing and we are evolving new ways of staying in touch.




Our Temple Sinai community as a whole has experienced much the same as we, as members, have. We are thirsty for our in-person events, the laughter, the hugs, the communal meals and Welcome Receptions, the freedom to sing with heart and soul without masks and without concern for possibly spreading Covid-19.

I think it is time; time to re-plant ourselves, to let our roots find new sources of water to quench our thirst. It is time to re-root our core values to ensure we remain true to them, time to rededicate ourselves to what we hold dear. Complacency and fear cannot, and should not, be driving forces directing our regrowth.

That small sign, "Grow Where You are Planted", hung outside the door of an assisted living apartment, says there is hope, there is life to be lived, and roots to be spread, no matter what stage of life we are in or what changes we face.

Let us turn to each other for support, return to our community of shared values and seek together the direction our roots need to grow. We can do it better together.

THE WOMEN OF SINAI HEAR ABOUT ARCHITECTURE SARASOTA FROM WELL-KNOWN MUSEUM FOUNDER, ANNE-MARIE RUSSELL

omen of Sinai did it again with an outstanding presentation by Anne-Marie Russell at the Women of Sinai Zoom meeting on February 3. Anne-Marie Russell is an art historian with a B.A. in Cultural Anthropology, UC Boulder, and an M.A. in Art History, UA Tucson. Anne-Marie is the co-founder of one of the first art sites on the internet. She has produced and directed awardwinning art documentaries, taught graduate and undergraduate courses in art history at the University of Arizona while serving as Executive Director and Curator of the Museum of Contemporary Art in Tucson. Most notably, in our area, Anne-Marie created the Sarasota Art Museum along with the help of others. She served as the inaugural Executive Director and is currently Executive Director of Architecture Sarasota, which stewards

Sarasota's important architectural legacy and promotes principles of good design in the region.

At the Women of Sinai meeting focusing on Arts in Sarasota, Anne-Marie spoke about the global recognition, educational programs, lectures and tours that have made Sarasota a well-known cultural center. The concepts of living harmoniously with nature and preservation of architectural design in Sarasota have been two major guiding principles. The meeting was both educational and enlightening for the Women of Sinai. Suzanne Weinstein and Judy Feldman, Women of Sinai programming cochairs, were commended for bringing this topic to us.



BOARD BRIEFS

In January, the Board heard from Rabbi Melissa Stollman, who is heading up marketing and communications for the temple. Rabbi Stollman explained to the Board the timeline needed to market events effectively, and the best ways to contact the marketing and communications team.

The Board also discussed security issues in light of the recent event in Texas. Continuing to encourage congregants to wear their name tags was discussed. The need for additional greeters was also mentioned. The Board talked about the

importance of balancing the desire to create a warm, welcoming community with the security needs of the congregation.

Additionally, the Board voted in early January in favor of temporarily reinstating some previous Covid-19 precautions in light of the Omicron variant. Those included asking for proof of vaccination at most services and suspending serving food in the atrium.

Scholar in Residence: Prepare to Be Shaken Not Stirred!

n March 4 and 5, we will be welcoming Rabbi Jeffrey Salkin as our guest Rabbi and Scholar in Residence. Rabbi Salkin has a national and international reputation as one of America's most quoted rabbis and thought leaders. His words have been cited in *The New York Times*, *The New* Republic, and USA Today. He has appeared on television and radio programs, and has spoken in more than a hundred communities, including Israel, Great Britain, Cuba, and Poland. Several of his books have won national awards. He is the author of Putting God on the Guest List: How to Reclaim The Spiritual Meaning of Your Child's Bar or Bat Mitzvah. Rabbi Salkin serves as senior rabbi at Temple Israel of West Palm Beach. Rabbi Salkin's timely and relevant theme will be "tikkun," Hebrew for mending or repairing.

The weekend kicks off with a welcome reception in the atrium at 5:15PM, followed by Erev Shabbat services led by Rabbi Kahn and Chazzan Abramson at 6:00PM in the sanctuary. Participation in all three presentations is free of charge and you may join in person or virtually:

Friday, March 4 7:00PM: Tikkun HaNefesh (Repairing the Soul) featuring Rabbi Salkin's presentation: "Fixing the Broken Hallelujah," an intimate encounter with the theology and poetry of Leonard Cohen – through Christian,

Jewish, and mystical imagery.

Saturday, March 5 11:00AM: Tikkun Elohim featuring Rabbi Salkin's Presentation:

"The Hidden Meaning of Kaddish." Judaism's greatest hidden truth has been staring us in the face for almost a thousand years. You will never experience Kaddish the same way again.

Saturday, March 5 1:00PM: Tikkun Olam featuring Rabbi Salkin's Presentation: "How Jews Get Woke:" A Master Class in Talmud. If you've never studied Talmud before, this funny and inspirational session is all about how to seek social justice in our communities.

MISHLOACH MANOT BASKET PICK-UP INFORMATION:



Erev Shabbat services on March 18 will honor our Life & Legacy members. Their continued financial support enables us to look forward to another strong 30 years of worshipping and studying together.



RELIGIOUS SCHOOL STUDENTS LEARN ABOUT MITZVAH-MAKERS

Sunday, February 6, Temple Sinai's Religious School fourth through seventh grade had a special treat to have visitors come during class to focus on the concept of *mitzvah* (commandment/good deed). The students are learning about Mitzvah-makers, how to become one and what it takes to be a Mitzvah-maker. 




