RABBINIC REFLECTIONS

Anti-Semitism: Then and Now

Most of us have never witnessed the amount of anti-Semitism we have seen in recent months. It seems so pervasive, coming from so many directions and places, and without any end or limit in sight. Not only is it overwhelming, it also is surprising and unexpected. Especially unanticipated is its intensity.

Who would have ever imagined that in a post-Holocaust world anti-Semitism would still exist? Who could have ever

anticipated that such vile hatred and prejudice would be found in respected academic institutions and expressed by otherwise intelligent people, in many instances without any consequences? Who could have predicted that age-old disproven canards and absurd and nefarious accusations about Jews would gain an air of respectability and enter the mainstream?

And who would have conceived that after the unprovoked massacre by jihadists pouring out of Gaza to commit pogrom-like atrocities on Jews that we would be the ones on the receiving end of vicious, vehement pernicious attacks in the form of verbal assaults, physical attacks and intimidation?

When I first began as a child to learn about the Holocaust the thing that constantly baffled me was – how did people let it happen? How did people not see what was happening and object? The outcome of the trajectory of the isolation and dehumanization of Jews and of their being ostracized and excluded, as exemplified by the introduction of the Nuremberg Laws and other incremental acts of discrimination all seem so obvious when viewed in retrospect.

We see too many parallels between what happened to Jews then and what is happening now.

But there are some differences.

I recently lobbied members of Congress on behalf of Israel in a historic and unprecedented effort. The Zionist Rabbinic Coalition, which I head, joined with Christian allies to bring 70 rabbis and pastors to meet with our elected representatives to advocate for Israel. The ministers wanted us to know that we are not alone.

Another difference between previous attacks on Jews and what happened on October 7 is that we are not powerless victims. We have a country and that country has an army, the Israel Defense Forces, a force which can and is taking measures to eliminate the threat posed by Hamas on innocent civilians. And make no mistake about it, it is doing so in the most difficult of circumstances while doing its utmost, often risking the lives of its own people to limit civilian casualties.

We also have organizations, such as AIPAC, the Zionist Rabbinic Coalition, the Jewish Federations of North America and others who advocate on behalf of the Jewish state.

So while there are differences, one thing remains constant: the need to see to it that our enemies not prevail, and that the anti-Semites not win in their effort to suppress and eliminate Jews and Judaism. Wherever I went on my recent trip to Israel in January, from the moment I landed, I saw signs proclaiming, "Yachad nenatzeah: Together we will win." It can also mean, "Together we will prevail."

Later this month, a group from B'nai Tzedek will travel together to Israel to see first-hand what happened on a mission of solidarity, to offer comfort and support, and to help by volunteering with whatever needs to be done. We will also meet and hear from various sources about the current situation and the path forward. If you are able to join us, please do, as this will be a unique, memorable and impactful experience.

For those who cannot come, I urge you to give *tzedakah* to one of the many organizations helping Israel. I also encourage you to increase your participation in Jewish life and add a mitzvah to your routine. Come to a *Shabbat* service. Come and take advantage of the many programs we offer, including studying together. The weekend of March 8th will offer a special opportunity to study with one of America's most prominent rabbis and teachers of Judaism, Rabbi Joseph Telushkin. In fact, his first talk at Friday night dinner will explore the roots of anti-Semitism. Please come – I promise you won't be disappointed.

By taking actions to strengthen our community and your Jewish identity, we defeat those haters who seek to defeat us.


I hope that this *Tikkun* will elevate our worship and deepen our connection to the Torah text.

May our Torah reading be filled with inspiration, joy and a profound sense of spiritual fulfillment.







As a child who suffered growing up with learning challenges, it has been a priority of mine throughout my career to ensure that every child, no matter what their learning style, receive the best Jewish education that we can offer.

With this in mind, we hired our first Inclusion Specialist in November. Stacy Schlactus is an experienced educator who has worked with special needs

students in public, private and congregational schools.

Following several meetings to discuss our student population, staff and curriculum, Stacy began by visiting all of the Sunday Religious School classes and getting to know students and teachers. She observed classes with students who are identified with learning challenges and after a few weeks, spoke with teachers and students. Stacy then met with some parents and consulted with one public school special needs teacher regarding a student. When we meet weekly, Stacy and I share updates and discuss students and teachers who are struggling or need extra support and which students we need to focus upon.

As a part of our ongoing effort to train teachers, on March 3rd, Stacy will present a workshop to teachers about learning challenges and how to best support students with various needs. Stacy has also been assisting in the GECC by observing some students and making recommendations to the Director.

To say that Stacy's impact thus far has been a change-maker would be an understatement. Faculty and students are already reaping the benefits of her wisdom and expertise. This has all been made possible by our amazing Inclusion Committee and the Barbara Schifter Memorial Fund, which was created to support inclusion in our schools and congregation.
