
Come to the Passover Seder

Rabbi's *Tisch*: Reb Irwin Keller and Rabbi George Gittleman

"Love and Marriage In Today's Liberal Jewish Community: A conversation with two leaders in the Sonoma County Jewish community"

Friday, April 14, 6:15 PM

Intermarriage has been a flash point in the Jewish community since Rabbi George entered rabbinical school in 1991. The Jewish institutional response has typically been way behind the general behavior and attitudes of the Jewish community especially in the United States. Rabbi George will explore his own journey with this issue and the many intermarried families that he has served over the years.

Reb Irwin will discuss alternative families, non-monogamy and new models of kinship. How are these reflected in Jewish text, and how will they be held in modern Jewish practice? Reb Irwin Keller is the Spiritual Leader of Congregation Ner Shalom since 2008. He is a longtime LGBTQI activist, and until recently a performer and writer in The Kinsey Sicks, America's Favorite Dragapella Beautyshop Quartet. He is currently furthering his studies in the Aleph Ordination Program.



friendly service, lively music and movement, exciting stories, art activities, open play and pot luck dinner.



Gathering in Community and Gratitude

The Torah tells us more than once in Exodus that when times were tough for the recently-freed Hebrew slaves, our ancestors, they complained first ("Is God present among us or not?" 17:7). They only expressed gratitude later.

Parashat T'rumah tells the story of a huge outpouring of gratitude to God, as the people willingly worked together to build the portable wilderness Tabernacle, the Mishkan.

The URJ Press Women's Commentary edition of the Torah points out that the word *mishkan*, when used to refer to human beings, refers to a dwelling, abode or home. When

used to refer to God, "The Tabernacle is conceived of as a place on earth in which God will be readily accessible and from which God's protective power will emanate."

The directive from God to the people to build the sanctuary can be understood then not so much so that God can be given a special place on earth to reveal God's presence; rather, God wants us to have a gathering place, so that we may come together in community. And when we do that, God promises to be in the midst of us (25:8).

We are fortunate to be able to gather together frequently at Shomrei Torah on many occasions. And when we do, something special does, indeed, often happen. If we are still and listen, we can somehow sense God's very presence.

And that is beautiful. So, just how and when can we gather?

A great number of regular and special activities take place around our CST home base, with members of all ages and interests involved. It is such a joy to see, hear and partake in, of and with as many of these offerings and fellow congregants as time allows.


