







On Sunday, June 3rd, The Men's Bagel Club hosted an in-depth discussion of the promises and controversies of cannabis, now that it's legal in California. Panelists included moderator Jerry Newman, Jeff Hergenrather, MD, Yarrow Kubrin and Captain Alan Vernon of the Sonoma County Sheriff's office. We learned that nothing is simple in the cannabis world and, as the controversies continue, there are potential benefits to the new status of cannabis.



Greening our Synagogue Solar production aids in meeting energy goals

Members of the Environmental Action Committee have been hard at work over the past year or so to reduce the overall energy consumption at CST. We are happy to report that our efforts have borne fruit. The most significant measure that we have undertaken is the conversion to LED lighting throughout the synagogue. This effort was accomplished with the help of volunteer members working alongside licensed electricians. Hundreds of bulbs and tubes have been replaced, resulting in the lowest annual energy consumption in our building since 2011. A share of this effort was paid for through a JUSTY grant.

Here at CST we have a mix of power available to us, with nearly 2/3 of our electricity coming from our leased solar generating system. To help sustain our output, the array of 104 panels has been cleaned twice in the past 12 months, both before and after the wildfires. Having clean panels accompanied by many sunny afternoons, our power production for the fiscal year ending June 30 was 53,325 kilowatt hours, which is an increase over the last fiscal year's output by more than 5%.




