
On the Doorposts of Your House — Learn About and Buy Your Own *Mezuzah*



During this season, we are commanded to dwell in a temporary dwelling, exposed to the elements. A sukkah, which is, by design, less than stable or sturdy than a typical house, is assembled and disassembled rapidly. With only three walls and a shoddy roof, so you can see the stars, the sukkah is adorned with produce.

A typical sukkah is contrary to everything that most Americans strive for.
Rabbi David Schuck, a Conservative colleague of mine, sarcastically mocks, "Our notion of home is deeply rooted in the fantasy of home. We fetishize our houses, pouring money and time into them in the fantasy that if we can just find the perfect couch, we will achieve domestic bliss,

perfection. We romanticize the notion of home so much so that it's as if home is a place in which relaxing yoga music plays while the sun shines into a room where an angelic child is peacefully sleeping." (Isn't that exactly what your home is like, all the time?)

And yet no matter how much we build up this fantasy of home, it is always temporary. Even if we spend years perfecting the intricate details around our house, things beyond our control can happen. Temporary might be a very long time, but complete permanence is never guaranteed.

We might move, and the furniture and trimmings don't fit aesthetically into the new environment or can't physically come with us. Over the past few months, we have been reminded on the television and social media of the realities of entire cities being devastated by raging fires, tidal waves, earthquakes and hurricanes.

Seeing the rubble and ash left behind by these catastrophic events, I am reminded of ancient buried cities. I remember walking through the streets of Pompeii, in awe of the magnitude of destruction. In an instant, countless hours of hard work and resources, along with all of your security, could vanish.

Yet ringing through the streets, behind tears of loss and tears of gratitude, people "We gather with those that matter most to us: our family, friends and guests that we invite in, offering shelter, food and rest to all who are nearby."

who have lost everything keep reminding themselves that "it's just stuff." This trope has been repeated by people in utter shock and devastation, clinging to what is most important—their lives.

That is what Sukkot is all about. We gather without the mask of granite countertops, hard wood floors or indoor plumbing. We gather with those that matter most to us: our family, friends and guests that we invite in, offering shelter, food and rest to all who are nearby.





Landscaping Project: Ongoing and Underway

If anyone has noticed, the landscaping at our main entrance and around the front of our building (near the Kolbo and in front of the play structure), has been looking pretty good lately. This is the result of a very small committee of "crazy weed-whackers" who have been pulling weeds, applying mulch, trimming trees, cutting out shrubs, and cleaning up our landscaping.

It's a fun job, but a little overwhelming at times, so Ira Glasser has jumped in and helped out by getting the executive committee to approve the costs for landscape maintenance. This is part of our ongoing effort to service our 10-year old building and grounds.

A tree service company has completed the first phase of the project which is to "limb-up" and clean-up our trees. They have taken the tree trimmings and run them through a grinder, resulting in piles "arbor mulch" which will be spread out across various targeted sections of the property to help keep the weeds in check.


