

Bagel Club on a Roll


Sunday May 4 - 9:00 AM

A Bright Soul Ablaze after a Dark Childhood

Sunday June 29 – 3:30 PM

Sponsored by the CST Social Action Committee, hear Joshua Safran, author of “Free Spirit: Growing Up on the Road and Off the Grid,” discuss the horrors and humor of a rootless childhood of wild adventures with a utopian mother victimized by violent abuse. Against all odds, Safran is now an attorney, Orthodox Jew, husband and father. Among the rave reviews, Gulf Stream Lit Mag wrote, “Poetic, and compelling...Safran offers up the wounds of a flower child, and every frayed petal is astonishingly beautiful.” Book signing to follow.

Safran is featured in the award-winning 2011 film “Crime After Crime” (that was shown in the Social Action’s documentary series last year) that portrays the years-long effort to free spousal abuse victim Debbie Peagler from prison. His work for victims of domestic violence and other forms of abuse is recognized nationwide.

Safran’s story will launch discussion by an expert panel of county leaders: Wes Winter, Executive Director, Family Justice Center Sonoma County; Gloria Eurotas, D.A.’s Domestic Violence Sexual Assault Unit; Detective Sergeant Ruben Martinez, Sheriff’s Domestic Violence/Sexual Assault Unit; and Dawn Silvera, Shelter Manager, YWCA Sonoma County.

Social Activist Rabbi Michael Lerner to Keynote Rabbi Robinson Service

Friday August 8 – 6:15 PM

The Oakland-based Rabbi Michael Lerner was an activist in the Free Speech Movement, Chair of the Berkeley chapter of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), roommates with Jerry Rubin, and marched with him and Tom Hayden at the Democratic National Convention in Chicago in 1968. He was later indicted as one of the Seattle 7 for his anti-Vietnam war work. He received the Martin Luther King Jr./Mahatma Gandhi Award from Morehouse College in Atlanta for his life of social activism and peace work. In 1995, Rabbi Lerner founded his own Congregation, Beyt Tikkun, in Berkeley. His books include “The Left Hand of God: Healing America’s Political and Spiritual Crisis.”



RABBI’S MESSAGE

Character

The Bible is filled with colorful personalities. We have the cynical Sarah, the hospitable Abraham, the mischievous Rebecca and the wishy-washy King Ahashuarus.

All of us have our favorite characters that are often the ones we most closely identify with or the ones we wish we could be like. We also have characters that we simply don’t agree with and therefore have little respect for.

I think that the vivid nature of character development found within the Bible is the single most relevant lesson for today.



We can still learn so much from each of the players and the way they interact with the people around them. We can cheer on our favorite victors or cringe at the brutality of some of our most adorned leaders like King David. But, still, we struggle with the same struggles as they did.

How can we treat our children fairly and justly? This question

is often answered with birthrights and blessings, but, today, it translates into the way we interact with our children and loved ones on a daily basis. How do we deal with sorrow and true despair? Many stories in the Bible focus on relevant timeless issues, like mourning a loved one or the gut-wrenching struggle for fertility.

But the characters that I find most appalling are the ones with little backbone, the ones that play mischievous roles to get what they want, and the ones with indirect personalities. I always like to know where I stand with someone. If there is a disagreement, I prefer to have both parties to discuss their differences in the open and

have a chance to clear the air. I constantly want Rebecca to have an outright argument with Isaac over the birthright rather than concocting a plan to have Jacob steal what is rightfully Esau’s.

We can learn so much about how to behave from our ancestors, through both positive and negative examples, while exploring the stories of our faith. Take a whirl at learning a little bit of text each day by signing up for ten minutes of Torah. Every week, you can receive a brief piece of Torah delivered straight to your inbox. JCC Chaverim News



Rabbi George's Friday Evening Remarks

Just inside the front door of our synagogue, you all passed a plaque, with a verse from Exodus: "V'asu li mikdash v'shchanti b'tocham/Make me a sanctuary that I may dwell amongst you." This was God's commandment to the Israelites to make the mishkan, the first synagogue.

I'm reminded of this verse now because for most of the past 18 years we've been builders together, not just of this building but more importantly of a community, a k'hilah k'dosha.

Note that the verse doesn't say, build me a sanctuary and I will dwell in it - v'shachanti bo - but rather, build me a sanctuary and I will dwell amongst you!

(Thank you to Margo Miller for this insight!)

God does not dwell in this building or in any other of the structures we have created to support our community; they are just means to an end. And, God doesn't dwell in me any more than God dwells in you. The purpose of the whole enterprise, everything we have worked so hard for, these past 18 years, has been that God would dwell amongst us, that WE would bring God down to earth as it were, and become the hands and feet of The Holy One ourselves.

This is what it means to be a k'hilah k'dosha, a holy community, and this is the force behind the commandment l'taken haolam, to repair the world. To build a k'hilah k'dosha --this was my dream when I set out on the path to become a rabbi 25 years ago, and together we've made that dream a reality.

Those that came before me - great lay leaders and exceptional rabbinic leadership, especially in Rabbi Michael - left a very strong foundation, and year by year we added to it, nurturing our community, the place where we can make God manifest in myriad ways: in our prayers, study, commitment to social justice, in our celebrations, in our care for each other...

"V'asu li mikdash v'shchanti b'tocham/Make me a sanctuary that I may dwell amongst you."

It's holy work and I am so grateful to have shared it with you these past 18 years. In addition to Laura, Levi and Sophie, you are my beloved and I am the luckiest rabbi in the world. Hazak, hazak v'nithazek/May we go from strength to strength!


