# A LETTER FROM OUR FUNDRAISING DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

With the High Holidays and Sukkot officially behind us, you might be wondering about the current status of the High Holiday Fundraising Campaign. We stressed the need to raise our collective giving levels and to raise our ultimate fundraising target to \$150,000. You might be wondering how we are doing. Are we close??

I am very, very happy to report that to date we have raised \$154,392!! Not only have we met our target, we have exceeded it! A great deal of thanks and gratitude goes to you, fellow congregants, who said yes to being involved and to making our goal a reality.

And as fantastic as this is, and it truly is, an equally significant result of this campaign is the number of families who made the decision to increase their gifts. We had 21 families contribute \$2,500.00 or more to this campaign. This is a 31% increase from families who gave at that level last year. Overall, of the families who participated in this year's appeal, 74% participated at a level above that which they have given in prior years. 74%!

These numbers reflect more than a monetary achievement. They represent a commitment to the PJC, our community and to each other. On behalf of the Board of Directors, I can tell you we are all deeply grateful to everyone who helped make this campaign so successful. Our shul is vibrant with study, programs, prayer and social action because of the generosity and care of so many of our families.

**THANKSGIVING-IN-A- BOX**



The annual Thanksgiving-in-a-Box food drive for needy families, now in its 8th year, has become an interfaith Pelham event. This year the drive will be coordinated through the Pelham Jewish Center, Huguenot Memorial Church, Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Christ Church, St. Catharine's Parish and the Community Church of the Pelhams. The Pelham volunteers will be partnering with Family Services of Westchester and providing boxes of food to families in their Port Chester, Tarrytown, Mount Vernon, Yonkers, White Plains and Pelham locations.

**It is halachically permissible to purchase non-kosher food in order to donate it to an impoverished family. If one is interested in learning the halachic sources about this, feel free to contact Rabbi Schuck.**

**We are asking volunteers to assemble a box of food for a family of 6-8 people.**

**HOW CAN YOU PARTICIPATE?** It is really simple!

**STEP 1:** Contact: Rachel Collens at [rachelcollens@optonline.net](mailto:rachelcollens@optonline.net) and let her know you'd like to put together a box.

**STEP 2.** Pick up a box at the Pelham Jewish Center is marked with your name on it . This is important as we need to keep track of how many boxes we are delivering.

**Boxes will be available for pick up beginning Friday, November 7, 2014**

**STEP 3.** Buy the food items (outlined next column) and pack the box.

**STEP 4.** Bring the box to the Huguenot church library by 5pm Tuesday, November 25, 2014.

**Boxes may be delivered as early as 9:00 AM on Sunday, November 23rd but not before.**

**Thanksgiving-in-a-Box items include:**

- 1 pre-cooked sliced spiral ham (8-10 pounds – you will find these in the meat section of your grocery store. Please, no canned hams)
- 2 (28-32oz) bags of rice
- 3 (15 oz) cans corn
- 3 (15 oz) cans peas
- 1 (5 pound) bag of potatoes –approximately 12 potatoes
- 1 (3 pound) bag of apples - approximately 8-10 apples
- 1 (1 pound) box of pasta –any kind
- 1 (24 oz) jar of tomato sauce
- 1 bag/container of cookies
- 2 (64oz) containers juice (please no cider or anything that needs to be refrigerated!)

**NOTE:** Everything will fit inside the box except for the ham.
