# Creating Sanctuary Everywhere

When I first interviewed at Temple Sholom of Chicago, I marveled at its history as seen through its architecture. In 1867, a few Jewish pioneers forged a new path on the north side of Chicago, supporting one another through the effects of the Civil War and later the Chicago Fire. With the Great Depression looming, the congregation of a few hundred people broke ground on our current building in 1929 with the sanctuary at its center. They constructed a bimah with a physical

height to match the caliber of speakers who would preach and pray from it including Eleanor Roosevelt, Elie Wiesel, and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Most innovative, its platform was built on tracks to accommodate hundreds of additional worshippers during High Holy Days. Several years ago, I noticed that when we move the bimah backward to embrace more people in our community, we allow the Ner Tamid (the Eternal Light that represents God's Presence over the Torah Ark), to rest in the center of the congregation. I believe that future generations will judge our community and its leaders by how we help all who are touched by Temple Sholom to create firm yet flexible foundations of their faith that expand to allow Divine inspiration to rest at the center of their lives.

In this time of the pandemic, we have been challenged to create these firm and flexible foundations. In Jewish tradition, the *Shabbat* dinner table is called a *Mikdash Me'at*, a mini-

Temple. During this time, we make our living rooms, our kitchens— even our back porches and balconies a sanctuary for the holiness of our Temple Sholom community to enter. We miss gathering regularly in the magnificent sanctuary— and we will greatly miss sitting together in the awesome expanded sanctuary during these High Holy Days. Yet, the original architects of our building on Lake Shore Drive could not have imagined that their ingenious design would inspire us to expand our sanctuary all the way into our homes. During our holy days, you will notice many opportunities to enter the sanctuary of the spirit and connect with congregants and clergy in intimate ways. These High Holy Days will be both historic and holy. I look forward to praying and connecting with you this season.

## Remarks From Temple Sholom's 152nd Annual Meeting (Cont. from Page 1)

These past few weeks have given us such an opportunity - to lead and to shine. Recent protests calling for justice, equality and reform that stem from the horrific murder of George Floyd in Minneapolis have forced us to evaluate how we engage as a community partner and as a leader on issues of social justice. These are challenges we must face head on, and I am proud of our response.

Since the middle of March, the building at 3480 North Lake Shore Drive has remained closed but the Temple has been very much open! Religious School pivoted quickly to an online format, as did Shabbat worship. Gan Shalom teachers engaged with their students from a distance and our clergy created new and creative ways to be a part of our members' lives.

We are weathering this new normal and I am pleased to share that on July 6, barring any change in guidance from the city and state, children will return to Gan Shalom for Summer Camp, bringing laughter and learning back into our building!

The last 12 months have been both challenging and rewarding. To think, at this time last year, we were in the process of assembling our search committee for our next Senior Rabbi and in advance of that, we surveyed the congregation and held 90-minute group meetings with our affinity groups, members, lay leadership, staff and clergy. Over 115 people participated, and an additional 130 logged on and completed an online survey to determine what qualities and characteristics we are looking for in our next Senior Rabbi. My sincere thanks to all that participated!

And what we heard from you was that we are looking for a warm, approachable, inspiring leader who is a community builder, a teacher and a visionary.

While we held a national search, our number one candidate was right here at home and I could not be more proud that Rabbi Conover was chosen to be our next Senior Rabbi.

A surprise to no one, she stepped in and stepped up over the course of the last three months to help us determine our path forward under the shadow of COVID-19. I assure you that we are in good hands and I am looking forward to this next year of working closely with Rabbi Conover to firmly put Temple Sholom on the path to a very bright future.

I would be remiss if I did not take the time to welcome Rabbi Rena Singer to our community as our next Assistant Rabbi. Rabbi Singer is the star of her Hebrew

Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion class who stood head and shoulders above all other candidates for this role. We are fortunate that stars aligned, and that Rabbi Singer will round out our great clergy team.

But as we open a new chapter, so too must one end... as Rabbi Rossoff's year as our interim Senior Rabbi ends. As shared during the Shabbat at which we honored Rabbi and Fran - over the past year of working closely with Rabbi Rossoff, I benefited from his experience, his intellect, his demeanor and his spirituality. I always looked forward to our breakfasts at Julius Meinl because I knew that, in addition to discussing pressing Temple matters, I would come away a little wiser, a little smarter or a little more comfortable in my role as President of Temple Sholom.

We have been blessed to have in Rabbi Rossoff, a mensch and a leader and we are a better community for having had him a part of our community for the past year. Thank you again for all you have done for Temple Sholom.

I'd like to finish with a question, as I did last year, because I think that is the Jewish thing to do. I'd like you to ask yourself what you want from, and what you need from, Temple Sholom of Chicago. Help us chart the course to our future. This is your community and it is only as good as you help make it.

To our outgoing Board Members - John Bremen, Steve Fadem and Jeff Luchs - I thank you for your ongoing support and service to Temple Sholom and, personally, for your friendship and guidance.

To all, I wish you health and happiness and a wonderful year ahead.

The committee is focused on raising the voices of Jews of Color in our community, expanding our community's knowledge of racially diverse Jewish experiences, and building our skills as a congregational community so we can continue to live our values and be a synagogue that embraces all people.


In light of the murder of George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, and countless other Black Americans who have lost their lives as a direct result of systemic racism and inequality, the "Embracing Racial Diversity" Committee saw a timely need for spaces in our community to talk about the civil unrest happening in Chicago and across the nation. Over two weeks, the committee, supported by Rabbi Conover, facilitated five small group discussions where Temple Sholom members and

teens could get together to process the experiences of the last few weeks, grapple with the realities of violence and social change, and begin some necessary discussions about how we can work to be anti-racist within our own communities.

We're incredibly proud of this new and growing initiative that will make Temple Sholom a safer and more embracing community for Jews of Color. 
