# As I write this note while sitting in my sukkah, I'm reminded of our people's past resilience and brilliance.

Over 2000 years ago in the hills of Judea, the Jewish people fought for their freedom against the forces of Antiochus. During the fighting, the Jews could not celebrate the Festival of Sukkot in the Temple that Antiochus had desecrated. After a hard-won victory in December, the Jewish people had to choose whether to skip the week-long holiday entirely or to celebrate it late. They decided not only to celebrate that year's Festival of Sukkot in December, but to create a whole new holiday called Chanukah. While early celebrations focused on the miraculous military victory, later celebrations focused on light. In fact, the holiday is often called Chag HaOrim, the Festival of Lights.

This year, while we will not be able to gather in person at Temple Sholom to light our menorahs, we will continue to kindle the light of *Chanukah* together, honoring our people's resilience and brilliance in every age. Please join us every night of *Chanukah* at 7:00 PM for a community candle-lighting filled with festive songs

and fun stories. (We will light the menorah as part of *Shabbat* services at 6:15 PM on Friday nights.) After the candle-lighting, community groups will host special programming. See page 4 for details.

I hope to see you on Friday, December 18 just just after our festival concludes. We'll add an extra night of learning about our people's resilience and brilliance with notable speaker and author Marra Gad. Marra has written a memoir about her experience growing up in the Reform Movement as a Jew of Color. Her wisdom is hard-won and will be instructive to our Temple Sholom community as we work to celebrate, embrace with sensitivity, and grow enthusiastically our racial and ethnic diversity. In a recent interview, Marra said: "Every single person who comes to a Jewish space or comes to our Shabbat table should be greeted with the same level of respect, care and love. This is about the sacredness of our humanity. That work begins with individuals." The work begins with individuals, who then become a community where every time we come together we recognize the Divine light that each person radiates. As we learn to do this with greater acuity, we will make this season—and every season—a Festival of Lights.



How can we keep cultivating compassion in a time when we also feel so much anger and fear?

There is something deeply equalizing about the High Holy Days. They operate on the assumption that every single person on the planet is struggling and in need of improvement in one way or another. If this is true, then we have to try to keep a space for compassion for people we deeply disagree with alongside our anger and activism. When we treat another person as a complete "other," we deeply limit our ability to solve problems. We fall into the same trap that we ourselves condemn. This is not to say that we should give up on fighting for change, this is just a reminder that compassion can be an important part of our toolbox as we work towards change.




