The legendary Disability Civil Rights Activist, and recent Temple Sholom guest, Judy Heumann teaches: "Any story of changing the world is always the story of many. Many ideas, many arguments; many discussions; many late night, punchy, falling-apart laughing brainstorms; many believers; many friendships; many failures; many times of almost giving up; and many, many, many people."

As our Passover Story tells us, we are a mixed multitude—and our varied gifts, perspectives, and opinions can be our strength. Here we are again, getting ready for Spring and our Passover Seder. We do so amidst the continued pall of the pandemic. With intermittent and staggered access to the vaccine, we face the reality that last year's virtual seders were NOT an anomaly. Many of us will again connect with family through our imperfect Zoom Seders (as opposed to our imperfect in real life seders).

Hence, it is not the grand story of the Exodus from Egypt that resonates this year, but the stories of our people wandering in the wilderness. That's why I appreciate the singing of Dayeinu (meaning: for us, it would have been enough) whose stanzas take us through the totality of our story and do not merely focus on one moment. Of the fifteen verses, the middle five bridge the grand story of the exodus with the wilderness experience:

- If God had split the sea for us-Dayeinu!If God had led us through on dry
- land-Dayeinu!

 If God had drowned our
- If God had drowned our oppressors-Dayeinu!
- If God had provided for our needs in the wilderness for 40 years-Dayeinu!
- If God had fed us manna-Dayeinu!

We, as a Temple Sholom community, continue to wander, yes, but we do so with purpose. We understand that miracles today, big and small, are wrought not by God alone, but through our efforts guided by Divine — and human — inspiration. We continue to improve our community and change the world with many, many, many people.

This year, we all have a common experience of trying to feel at home in places that are difficult to access — cast as we are to an online wilderness in which human connection can feel illusive. That feeling compels us to make every aspect of our synagogue community more accessible. You, no doubt, will notice the ways in which our congregation is becoming increasingly accessible to those of us with disabilities due to the extraordinary efforts of a small group of dedicated congregants. Yet, to do this holistically, we need the energy and experience of our entire mixed multitude.

On Passover, as we celebrate the mixed multitude coalescing into a sacred community, Temple Sholom's Second Night Seder will be an oasis for feeling at home in this virtual desert. We are in the process of getting delicious Passover meals to our homebound congregants at no cost. We will sing songs that are familiar and introduce some new traditions that will bring laughter and meaning to our homes and our hearts. And, together, we will continue to make Temple Sholom — our building and our online spaces — more accessible in tangible ways that you will notice at our Seder as our circle of embrace grows. You will find ways to

register for our Second Night Seder in these pages and online. Bring yourself. Bring your family. Bring your friends. All are welcome!

Wishing you and yours a Zissen Pesach — a sweet and meaningful Passover!

As we approach mid-March once again, it's easy to focus on the challenges of the past twelve tumultuous months. But in recent conversations with our Wednesday study group, as we focused on our 5781 theme text, "A Time To Embrace," we discussed how important it is to focus on the positive. I was reminded of an exercise from AJ Jacob's' book, "Thanks A


Thousand," in which he describes making an A-to-Z gratitude list - a fun challenge for the whole family! Here are seven things (a nice Jewish number) I'm feeling grateful for these

- 1. Our new Lifelong Learning team where would we be this year without Rachel Lipson, our Religious School Administrator and Esther Fishbein, our Youth Engagement Coordinator?
- 2. Our Religious School faculty from outdoor fall classes to online learning, our teachers show grace under pressure, bursting with new ideas for keeping students connected to each other!
- 3. Our Crown Family High School teens many of whom are volunteering in our Madrichim program this year - who continually help to craft their own program, spending the early weeks of 2021 focused on exploring "How To Be An LGBTQ+ Ally" with Esther and Rabbi Gellman.
- 4. Our Adult Education Committee members, who have created and supported an inspiring lineup of guest speakers which has yielded unprecedented turnouts of over 50 attendees regularly on Sunday mornings.

- **5. Our Religious School parents**, who support their children's spiritual development, helping them log into Zoom (often sitting side-by-side during classes), and sticking with us through these tough times.
- 6. Our JUF Education "Shifting the Paradigm on Hebrew Learning" cohort with Tal Pendo and Rabbi Gellman, which has yielded our 6th Grade 1-on-1 Hebrew Boot Camp Mentorship Pilot among other innovations to our Hebrew program.
- 7. My first week back at work in 2021, when I got to teach Introduction to Judaism on Monday night, work with small groups of 6th graders during Rabbi Singer's Tuesday Midweek Hebrew class, lead our Wednesday study group and Crown Family High School t'filah (prayer) in the same day, and sing Shabbat songs with Gan Shalom students on Friday morning - what a way to start the year!

This hasn't been an easy time, but my work in our learning community continues to inspire and energize me, with so much appreciation for the contributions of our clergy, staff and lay leaders.

Healing Your Brain After Loss: A Neurologist's Perspective

Fruits of Freedom, the Torah Flora Haggadah

Much of the Pesach Seder is rooted in the history of Jewish food and agriculture. Dr. Greenberg will present some of this forgotten Pesach lore that he recovered during his research for this unique and important new Haggadah.

Come learn about the German rabbi who reversed the meaning of maror by replacing it with vermouth herbs; how ancient rabbis used botany, physics, and sophisticated culinary techniques to explain the Paschal lamb barbecue; and how the potential conflicts between Torah and science over leaning left at the seder and baking matzah in the southern hemisphere have been resolved.

Dr. Greenberg received his bachelor's degree with honors in biology from Brown University and his Master's and Doctorate in agronomy from Cornell University. He has also studied with Rabbi Chaim Brovender at Israel's Yeshivat Hamivtar and conducted research on corn, alfalfa, and soybeans at Cornell, the US Department of Agriculture, and the University of Pennsylvania's Institute for Cancer Research.

Since 1989, he has been a science teacher and educational consultant. Dr. Greenberg was Senior Editor of science textbooks at Prentice Hall Publishing Co. Previously on the faculty of Yeshivas Ohr Yosef, the School of Education at Indiana University, and the University of Phoenix, he has taught at the Heschel School since 2008. He is a frequent speaker at synagogues, schools, and botanical gardens.

Tikkun Olam and How it Fits into Remix Judaism

"Remix Judaism" is about carving out a space for consistent and meaningful Jewish practice, even if that practice does not completely follow Jewish law. But how does "tikkun olam" (repair of the world) fit in? This talk explores the

origins of tikkun olam and its current role in Jewish continuity.

Roberta Kwall is the Raymond P. Niro Professor at DePaul University College of Law and an internationally renowned scholar and lecturer who has published over 30 articles on a wide variety of topics including Jewish law and culture, authorship rights, and intellectual property. She is the author of several law casebooks that are used nationally as well as two monographs: "The Myth of the Cultural Jew: Culture and Law in Jewish Tradition" (Oxford U. A five-time Grammy-nominated producer/performer, Sapoznik has been featured on over fifty records including having reissued over 30 anthologies of Yiddish, jazz, old-time, cantorial, ragtime, blues, Italian, swing, blackface minstrelsy and bluegrass recordinas.


