From the Rabbi's Desk

Dear Friends,

Mark Spitz, the Jewish American Olympic swimmer, has been on my mind. In fact, I woke up one recent morning singing a made-up song about him.

Spitz won seven gold medals in the 1972 Olympics, in Munich. His achievement was unparalleled -- until Michael Phelps came along.

Spitz's ascent up the podium to receive his seventh gold medal occurred on the evening of September 4, 1972. Hours later, as he was returning from dinner, he walked right past the apartment in the Olympic village where Palestinian "Black September" terrorists were holding innocent Israeli Olympians hostage. They had already killed two. The other nine would be killed in a shootout at the Munich airport.

There is so much to this story, including the mind-bogglingly lax security and the fact that there were very likely people within the Olympic village who facilitated the terrorists' easy access.

Authorities feared that Spitz may have been in danger, so they whisked him quickly out of Germany. He was first flown to London, where he posed for the famous picture of him – mustached and in a bathing suit – with the seven gold medals around his neck. He has said that he remembers feeling that terrible incongruity of posing victoriously, while eleven fellow Jews were dead. The terrorist attack in Munich has had an indelible effect on Spitz, now 70 years old. In an article in Ha'aretz 20 years ago, he said:

"It made me aware of my responsibility to acknowledge that, yes, I am Jewish. You know, before Munich, that issue hardly ever came up. I think most people knew I was Jewish but there were no consequences to it - I was a 22-year-old kid. ... After Munich... I felt an obligation to affirm my ties as a Jew."

As the fiftieth anniversary of that horrific tragedy nears, may we all recognize that, despite our different beliefs and political opinions, we cannot sever our ties as Jews. May we, then, affirm those ties – to the Jewish state, to our culture, to each other.

CANTOR'S NOTE



"...for at every moment we are renewed" - (Reb Nachum of Chernobyl)

Me'or Eynayim ("The Light of the Eyes") is a mystical text written by Rabbi Menachem Nachum of Chernybol. Reb Nachum, as he is known, was an early Hassidic master and disciple of the Baal Shem Tov, founder of the Hassidic movement.

Like other Hassidic masters, Reb Nachum believed that making a personal and spiritual connection with God is the ultimate goal of religious activity. (The Hassidim called this relationship *d'vekus*", or *devkut* – cleaving to God.) R. Nachum counsels us to keep our religious lives spontaneous, receptive and fresh. He teaches that religious experience must not "grow old, depriving you of the impression it should make". Instead, we must endeavor to keep our religious and spiritual activities fresh and spontaneous – whether in prayer, the study of Torah, or in the performance of *mitzvot*. Reb Nachum writes in *Me'or Eynayim*:

Consider this illustration: one who is regularly in the king's presence does not feel [the same] awe and reverence for the king as one who does not see the king often. Therefore, the Torah warns, "Let the words of Torah be new to you as if they were given today"; that is, don't let your experience of each moment grow old, depriving you of the impression it should make...In this manner, we do not remain the same from moment to moment; for at every moment we are renewed...we are continually filled with passion for our lives.

As we enter the secular New Year of 2022, may our days be filled with an ever-renewed striving for spirituality and openness to God's presence in our lives.

Thank you to everyone for all you have done this past year. Thanks to committee chairs, volunteers, the office crew, and so many more. We are a village, and everyone is contributing! A special EHNTJC thanks to our Sisterhood and Men's Club!

Rabbi and Cantor, I can't say enough, you have both been wonderful for us all. Our bima team have offered services 7 days a week, our Shabbat and festival services have been exceptional. They offer regular classes that so many enjoy. Both the Rabbi and Cantor assist with our school. The Religious School, small yet mighty, offers classes for grades K-7 including our Lehrhaus/Confirmation grades 8-10 offering.



Our annual Shpiel continues with a new and exciting theme on an old tale. This year it will be a congregational effort to promote, sell sponsorships, sell tickets, fill seats and get folks logged into our virtual offering.

Looking forward, we need to reenergize our committee chairs, provide goals and targets, and be sure we meet with our committees regularly. We have had an extended break, a Covid break. As we move forward with in-person and virtual offerings, we need to be creative to **provide value** through both channels. Committee chairs need to work with Jeanette to schedule meeting times today.

We continue to struggle with custodial assistance through the entire week and Shabbat.

Dennis Feinberg, the congregation's legal eagle, and I met with Gershon Bassman in November. The meeting was very cordial, friendly, and positive. We looked at several parts of the building regarding maintenance issues and Gershon indicated they would be taken care of as well as catching up on any past-due monthly amounts due. It was clearly acknowledged that another two years remains on the initial portion of the agreement and one "option" year. Gershon did not indicate that any alternate use of the building was considered and/or likely. Our time left in the building is somewhat open and several scenarios of our remaining in the building beyond the 6-year term remain viable and will be explored.

EDUCATION CORNER

Tu B'Shvat (= Rosh Hashanah for the Trees) by Dr. Esther Javetz - Education V.P.

The name of the holiday means the fifteenth of Shvat (the 5th month in the Jewish calendar). All Jewish holidays were planned for the land of Israel, so they look weird in other countries. In the northern hemisphere, it is winter (snow and rain) and in the southern henisphere, it is mid-summer (hot sun), so are those good planting seasons? No. But in the Middle East it is!

In Israel it is a rainy season, but with sunny days in between. There are good planting days, and after planting, one can expect rainy days to nourish the new baby trees.

Customs of Tu B'Shvat:

There are various customs around eating fruits, but one of the common ones is eating the 7 species that are indigenous to Israel. They are eaten in the following order: Wheat (could be cake); Barley (could be beer); Olives; Dates; Grapes; Figs; Pomegranates.

Why in this order? Because we take the fruit of one kernel to fruit more and more kernels.

Mystical Interpretations:

Throughout history, all holidays received more and more layers of interpretations. Tu B'Shvat is a holiday during the rainy season; well water is a metaphor to the Torah; the way the water is nourishing the little trees step by step until they become mature trees which bear fruit. The same is learning, which is step by step accumulating and creating a knowledgeable adult. The tree is a metaphor to an adult person (in the Bible: Ki Ha-Adam Etz Hasade).

Our next BOOK CLUB will be on Wednesday, January 19th at 10:30 a.m. on ZOOM to discuss "The Color of Love" by Marra B. Gad

Winner of the 2020 Midwest Book Award in Autobiography/Memoir, *The Color of Love*, by Marra B. Gad, recounts the journey of a mixed-race Jewish woman from adoption and prejudice to helping the members of her extended family who once shunned her.

Marra B. Gad's biological parents were a black man and a white, Jewish woman. In 1970, at three days old, she was adopted by a white, Jewish family in Chicago. For them, it was love at first sight—but the world was not ready for a family like theirs. In black spaces, Marra was considered "not black

enough" and encountered anti-semitism. In Jewish spaces, she was mistaken for the help, asked to leave, or worse. She even faced racism within her own family.

Marra's family cut ties with relatives who refused to accept her—including her once beloved and glamorous Great-Aunt Nette, who was like a "third-parent" to Marra's mother. But after 15 years of estrangement, Marra discovered that Nette had Alzheimer's, and that she was the only one able to reunite Nette with her family. Instead of revenge, Marra chose love, and watched as the disease erased her aunt's racism, making space for a relationship that was never possible before.

The Color of Love explores the idea of yerusha, which means "inheritance" in Yiddish, such an important concept that it was the original title of the book. At times heart-wrenching and heartwarming, this is a story about what you inherit from your family—identity, disease, melanin, hate, and most powerful of all, love.

On the first day of spring in 1911, a terrible fire broke out in Manhattan's Garment District. When it ended half an hour later, 146 workers, mostly young immigrant Jewish women, were dead. This horror capping years of worker protests against intolerable conditions propelled a powerful coalition New Yorkers to enact factory safety legislation that would become a model for the nation.

Professor Pamela Nadell holds the Patrick Clendenen Chair in Women's and Gender History at American University where she directs the Jewish Studies Program and received the university's highest award, Scholar/Teacher of the Year. Her books include "Women Who Would Be Rabbis: A History of Women's Ordination, 1889-1985". A past president of the Association for Jewish Studies and the recipient of the American Jewish Historical Society's Lee Max Friedman Award for distinguished service. Her consulting work for museums includes the National Museum of American Jewish History and the Library of Congress.





Three Day Itinerary for EHNTJC Virtual Tour of Petra & Spain, January 23 to 25, 2022 from 7:30 PM to 9:00 PM CST:

Day 1: Petra, Jordan - The Red Rock

The Nabatean people built the city of Petra. They controlled the trade route from the bottom southern parts of the Arabian Peninsula to the shores of the Mediterranean. Their capital city was Petra or the rock, a beautiful city carved out of the local red sandstone complete with temples and buildings. The Nabateans controlled almost exclusively the trade of myrrh and frankincense to the Roman empire and became extremely wealthy and successful. They built this incredibly beautiful capital city in the country of Jordan today. Petra is a world heritage site recognized by UNESCO and made famous by Indiana Jones movies.

Day 2: Spain: The North: Madrid, Toledo and Girona

Explore with me the modern capital of Spain today, the city of Madrid. Madrid is a relatively new city and the seat of the king and the government. Visit the Royal Palace and the beautiful gardens that are typical of this modern city. The city of Toledo was the original capital of Spain, for many centuries. It is less than a two-hour drive to the south. Situated on the banks of the Tagus River with breath taking views, Toledo is a beautiful ancient city surrounded by old walls. Hiding in them are ancient synagogues alleyways that tell the stories and connections to Jewish life that was once here.

Visit the northern city of Girona, another major Jewish city of the Spanish Golden age. We will visit the beautifully preserved Jewish Quarter and walk down the alleyways to the Jewish Museum housed in a building that used to be a synagogue. Girona is the hometown of the famous Rabbi Nachmanidies, Rabbi Moshe Ben Nachman (Ramban).

Day 3: Spain: The South: Granada, Seville and Malaga

The Muslims who controlled the Iberian Peninsula for a brief time were the most important developed and advanced empire during the 8-15 centuries CE. Even more than in Europe during the Middle Ages. After losing the northern part of the Peninsula to Charlemagne in the early 800s, they controlled the southern part for several centuries and allowed culture, science, medicine, philosophy and more to flourish. The Jewish population of this region produced great rabbis, writers, thinkers, doctors and lawyers who lived under the rule of the Muslims. We will visit the great cities of Spanish Jewish life during the Muslim control of the area and visit highlights such as the Alhambra Palace, the Generalife gardens, the Mesquite, the Seville cathedrals, the Synagogues and Jewish remains. We will follow the stories of famous rabbis such as Maimonides, the Rambam, Rabbi Yehudah Halevi and Solomon ibn Gabirol just to name a few.

No passports needed! Leave the sunscreen at home! Bring snacks and wine for a l'chaim at the end!
