# From the Rabbi's Desk

Dear Friends,

I have been in regular contact with friends in Israel. One told me his young adult daughter has gone from funeral to funeral for the last three weeks. The family of another, on a kibbutz in the Upper Galilee, may have had to evacuate with their very infirmed father. The terrorist mass murder perpetrated against the Jewish state was – and is – a mark of sheer barbarity.

In 1951, Eric Hoffer, a longshoreman and self-taught philosopher, wrote in <u>The True Believer</u> that the fanatic is one "who claims all excellence for his nation, his religion, his race, or his holy cause." Central to this mindset is the worship of a corrupt, perverted version of "perfection," as well as a burning hatred for those who would stand in the way of achieving it.

Hamas comprises such fanaticism. It is such a totalitarian regime. And Israel and the Jews are the impediment to the achievement of Hamas's corrupt, immoral ideology. This is why Hamas terrorists had no compunction in the perpetration of unspeakable evil.

It is important to understand the mindset of the regime at Israel's border.

In a recent sermon, I stated that while Hamas is a death cult, Israel is a life cult. I steadfastly believe that. Still, I pray that Israel – as it pursues Hamas – will keep the protection of civilian life as a top priority. Images of Palestinian children – some alive, some dead – being pulled from the rubble in Gaza are horrifying. Some have said, "Well, they are already Jew-haters. They hate Israel. They are tomorrow's terrorists." Well, that just seems to me to be a desperate attempt to avoid the pain of what is simply true: They are just children. Yes, Hamas has put them in harm's way. Israel must now strive to keep them out of it.

I don't have an answer, really. I only have my prayers: May Israel eradicate the terrorist menace that has caused unspeakable pain within the Jewish homeland. And may all children – humanity's hope for a brighter future – always be protected from harm.

I am so very excited to present this year's EHNTJC Cantor's Concert, **SOME ENCHANTED EVENING: From Rodgers and Hammerstein Songbook** on Sunday evening, November 19<sup>th</sup> at 7pm. Joining me in this wonderful celebration will be the incredibly gifted soprano (and EHNTJC member) Elena Batman Levin, and the amazing Howard Pfeifer at the piano.



What I can I tell you about Rodgers and Hammerstein that you don't already know? Together, they revolutionized the American musical theater with productions like *Oklahoma!*, *Carousel*, *The Sound of Music*, *South Pacific*, *The King and I*, and so many more. Considered the greatest musical theater writing partnership of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, Rodgers and Hammerstein created the "Golden Age" of the American musical theater in the 1940's and 50's. Their work revolutionized the Broadway musical, transforming it from superficial, cheery, sentimental shows with songs often composed simply as show-pieces for major stars into serious theater treating serious topics. Rodgers and Hammerstein's shows frequently addressed such issues as racism (*South Pacific*), domestic abuse (*Carousel*), and even the *Anschluss*, the Nazi take-over of Austria (*The Sound of Music*).

And then there is the music. Songs like *Oh, What a Beautiful Morning, Shall We Dance, I Gotta Wash that Man Right Outta My Hair, My Favorite Things* are as much a part of our lives as any music we know. They still move us to tears and laughter (I still cry at the end of *The King and I*). They bring back memories and feelings from our past, even as they continue to inspire and amaze with each new hearing.

So please, join us on Sunday evening, November 19<sup>th</sup> for *Some Enchanted Evening* in person at EHNTJC or on ZOOM. And remember - even when times seem dark - *Whistle a Happy Tune*.

### Acting for Tikkun (Repair)

Dear Sisterhood Friends,

At this difficult time Israelis of all backgrounds must know we are with them. They must know we do more than pray and gather in solidarity. They must know that we will materially support them during their times of greatest need.

Hamas has destroyed, damaged, and stolen several MDA ambulances and they are in desperate need of additions to its fleet. EHNTJC has partnered with five other local Conservative congregations to purchase one new ambulance for Magen David Adom—Israel's national emergency medical service. We must raise \$115,000 by December 15<sup>th</sup> which will cover the cost of one fully outfitted ambulance and its transport to Israel. We hope Sisterhood members will contribute to this effort.

Our synagogues' names will be inscribed on the ambulance's doors, as will the names of individuals and families who contribute \$10,000 or more. There are two ways to contribute. You can send a check to the synagogue made payable to "AFMDA." You can also contribute through <a href="www.ehnt.org">www.ehnt.org</a>. Click "Online Payments" and in the "Payment Notes" field, type "AFMDA." (AFMDA stands for American Friends of Magen David Adom.)

When the ambulance is ready, we will hold a ceremony, with the ambulance present. (MDA ambulances are produced in Elkhart, Indiana.)

### **Education Corner**

### New Archaeology on King David's Palace

Decades before Indiana Jones was a movie character, I was fascinated with archaeology. I even considered it as a college major, but my more practical side dismissed it as a possibility. A highlight of two visits to Israel was participating in "Dig for a Day" at the Beit Guvrin Archaeological Park. Visitors have the opportunity to climb through candle-lit caves located in the ancient city of Tel Maresha and dig for artifacts. I frequently read about archaeological discoveries. A recent article about the palace of King David particularly caught my attention.

First, a little helpful background information. The existing walls around the old city are relatively new, having been built by the Ottoman ruler, Suleiman the Magnificent between 1535 - 1542. There are other much older walls within the old city that follow a different path; their remnants can be found, if you know where to look for them. The back of the Etz Hayim Chumash provides a diagram of the area and where these walls might have been located. The Old City of Jerusalem is now divided into the Muslim, Armenian, Christian, and Jewish quarters. A fifth area, the Temple Mount, is the site of the Jewish temples built by Kings Solomon and Herod and the current location of the Dome of the Rock and Al-Aqsa mosque. On a southeastern hill, below and outside of the Temple Mount, is the City of David archaeological park. This Park includes Gihon Springs, an important ancient water source, the Pool of Siloam, and King Hezekiah's water tunnel

Classical theory is that King David's Palace is located at the City of David. The fortifications found there were built to protect the water supply and protect Jerusalem, so it would be a logical location for the palace. However, archaeologists have not been able to find pottery or other structures to support this conclusion. Recently, Prof. Na'aman has written about two tablet fragments, containing royal correspondence that was found on the slope below the Temple Mount. He argues that these fragments provide indirect evidence that King David's Palace was located on the Temple Mount and not at the City of David. However, it is likely to be a long time before there is conclusive evidence for this new theory as it will require currently prohibited excavations on the Temple Mount itself.

While everyone is focused on the war, those in Tel Aviv, Jerusalem and more central areas are trying to continue with some of their usual activities. The daughter of one of my close friends has a 14month-old baby. She sends me weekly pictures. One of the recent pictures included a note that read "We are also not forgetting to focus on the important things." That's when I decided to write about both. We will continue to show our support for Israel by raising money, attending rallies and programs and writing letters to our legislators to assure continued government support for Israel. But we will also not forget to focus on the other important things in our lives like being together on Shabbat, celebrating holidays and continuing to just spend time together.





# What Jews Think Part One



### "Philosophy and Leadership in Dark Times" led by Yaniv Feller Thursday, November 2, 2023 - 7:30 PM CST via Zoom

Yaniv Feller, Assistant Professor of Religion and Jewish Studies, University of Florida

This talk introduces the thought of Rabbi Dr. Leo Baeck (1873–1956), one of the most prominent Jewish public intellectuals of his era and the official leader of German Jewry under Nazism. After briefly discussing Baeck's biography, we will examine how his understanding of the essence of Judaism developed in conversation with Christianity, before moving to the impact of the rise of Nazism on Baeck's thought, and the moral dilemmas he had to face.

Yaniv Feller is an assistant professor of Religion and Jewish Studies at the University of Florida. He is the author of *The Jewish Imperial Imagination: Leo Baeck and German-Jewish Thought* (Cambridge University Press, September 2023) and a co-editor of *Covenantal Thinking: Essays on the Philosophy and Theology of David Novak*, to be published by the University of Toronto Press in March 2024. Yaniv published articles on various topics in Jewish thought and culture, including Jewish-Christian relations, post-Holocaust theology, and Christmas trees.

Discover the fascinating story of how men like Adolph Zukor, Carl Laemmle, Louis B. Mayer, Harry Cohn and others began Hollywood with their ambition, ingenuity and keen instincts.

Irv Slifkin has had a lifelong love for movies and popular culture. A native Philadelphian, Irv teaches film and journalism classes at Temple University and Rowan College. He is the author of the books Filmadelphia: A Celebration of a City's Movies and Groovy Movies: Far-Out Films of the Psychedelic Era. In addition to writing for such publications as the Philadelphia Inquirer, Entertainment Weekly, The Hollywood Reporter, Chicago Tribune and Los Angeles Times, Irv has lectured on film and popular culture, in person and on Zoom, for libraries, organizations and Jewish institutions throughout NJ and PA.


