#### Leil HaSeder (Wed Night)

**Ma'ariv** for Yom Tov with the proper insertions for Pesach.

**Hallel** after Ma'ariv: For those with a strong minhag to recite hallel in Shul on the Seder night, they may do so if they wish, even with a brachah. According to some, however, this custom is reserved for davening with a minyan only. Anyone without this minhag should not recite hallel.

**Kiddush** should not begin before tzeit hakochovim which is at 8:51pm. It is preferable to complete afikomen by halachic midnight which is at 1:34am.

#### First Day- Daytime (Thursday)

**Shacharit** Yom Tov Shmoneh Esrei is best said as an individual at hanetz hachamah, at 7:01am, with the proper Pesach insertions followed by complete Hallel with berachot.

**Torah reading** for the first day is "משכו" (Shemot 12:21-51), the maftir is בחדש הראשון (Bamidbar 28:16-25) and the haftarah is from Yehoshua 3:5-7, 5:2-6:1, 6:27.

**Tefilat Tal** which is recited on Pesach was only instituted when davening with a tzibur and not when davening alone. One can certainly recite it if they wish, but there is no mandate based on the existing custom to do so.

**Mussaf** One can follow their typical practice and omit mashiv haruach or begin saying morid hatal during the Shmoneh Esrei.

**Mincha** should be said before sunset, 8:08pm.

#### Second Day of Pesach (Thurs Night)

**Candle Lighting** & preparations for the second night and Seder can be done after nightfall is after 8:52pm.

**Ma'ariv** for Yom Tov with the proper insertions for Pesach. (Same instructions regarding hallel on the first night)

**Sefirat Ha'Omer** begins. It is recited after the Amidah before Aleinu.

#### Second Day- Daytime (Fri Morning)

**Shacharit** Yom Tov Shmoneh Esrei is best said as an individual at hanetz hachamah, at 6:59am, with the proper Pesach insertions followed by complete Hallel with berachot.

**Torah reading** for the second day is "שור או" (Vayikra 22:26-23:44), the maftir is בחדש הראשון (Bamidbar 28:16-25) and the haftarah is from Melachim II 23:1-9, 21-25.

**Mussaf** for Yom Tov with the proper insertions for Pesach.

**Mincha** should be completed before sunset, 8:08

If one prepared an eiruv tavshilin before Yom Tov, one may cook on Yom Tov for Shabbos. If one forgot to make an eruv tavshilin, you can rely on Rabbi Katz's, but only in a case where one forgot.

**Friday night candle lighting** should take place after plag, 6:48pm, and no later than 7:51pm. Once the candles are lit, all of the stringencies of Shabbos are in effect.

#### Friday Night

**Kabbalat Shabbat**- An abridged שבת קבלת is recited that begins with מזמור שיר ליום השבת. We also omit מדיקין ויט. במה מדליקין.

**Ma'ariv** Shmoneh Esrei is the one for Shabbos with Ya'aleh V'Yavo inserted for Pesach.

Vayechulu is recited afterwards followed by Sefirat Ha'Omer and Aleinu.

If one accepted Shabbos early and it is not yet sunset (8:09pm), one should omit Sefirat Ha'Omer in Ma'ariv and recite it after 8:53pm.

#### Shabbos Day

**Shacharit** Shmoneh Esrei for Shabbos is best said as an individual at hanetz hachamah, at 6:58am, with Ya'aleh VeYavo for Pesach. Half Hallel is recited afterwards.

**Shir HaShirim** is traditionally recited with the tzibur at this point — The custom to read Shir HaShirim on Pesach was clearly instituted only for a tzibur. Nonetheless, there is nothing prohibited about reading Shir HaShirim on Pesach without a tzibur.

**Torah reading** for the second day is "ראה אתה" (Shemos 33:12-34:26), the maftir is והקרבתם (Bamidbar 28:19-25) and the haftarah is from Yechezkel 37:1-14.

**Mussaf** for Yom Tov with proper insertions for Shabbos and Pesach. **Mincha** for Shabbos should be said before sunset, 8:10pm, with Ya'aleh V'Yavo for Pesach. Shalosh Seudos should be eaten after Mincha, best started before sunset as well.

#### Motzaei Shabbos

Weekday Amidah should be recited including Atah Chonantanu and Ya'aleh V'Yavo. Additionally, please note the change to ונתן ברכה. We do not recite ויהי נועם. After the Amidah, Sefirat Ha'Omer is recited followed by Aleinu.

Havdalah is the standard Havdalah for Motzaei Shabbos.
