## TORAH THOUGHT:

The majority of Parshat Titzaveh revolves around the instructions to create the Bigdei Kehuna, the Priestly garments. The Torah conveys intricate details regarding the material, embroidery, and appearance of each of the sacred garments. Four different articles of clothing were to be worn by each Kohein, and the Kohein Gadol, himself, dressed in eight unique pieces. In introducing these instructions, the Torah tells us that these garments are to be made “L’Chavod Ul’tifaret, for glory and splendor.” Many of the Meforshim explain that the Kohein’s wardrobe reflected the sanctity and the sacredness of the Avodah, the service, that was performed. The regal appearance would serve as a visual reminder to the Kohanim, as well as to the Jews visiting the Mishkan and Beit HaMikdash, of the holiness of their surroundings. Both the physical beauty of the structure, as well as the splendid clothing of the Kohanim, helped to remind everyone that this was indeed the place where Hashem causes His Shechina to dwell most prominently on Earth. In a similar vein, the Rambam reminds each and everyone of us how careful we must be when selecting our attire. Although, sadly, we don’t have a Beit HaMikdash, nonetheless, we understand that we are always standing before G-d. Our clothing should reflect that awareness. The Rambam specifically mentions that our clothing shouldn't be torn or have stains on them. At the same time, our clothes shouldn't be so outlandish that it causes us to stand out and draw public attention. Rather, they should be “Na’eh, V’naki, pleasant and clean.” Ultimately, they should assist us to feel the presence of Hashem in our lives.

### POINT TO PONDER:

Just about everyone is bothered by the following question. At the end of Parshat Titzaveh the Torah describes the dimensions and the material to be used to construct the Mizbeach HaKetoret, the alter used for offering the incense. What is troubling is this appears to be the wrong Parsha for this command. Titzaveh is all about the inauguration ceremony of the Mishkan and the Bigdei Kehuna, the garments for the Kohanim. The commandment surrounding the Mizbeach HaKetoret should have been placed in Terumah which discusses the other vessels of the Mishkan. What do you think? Why the odd placement?

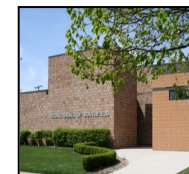
