**ISRAEL UPDATE November 2, 2018****Israeli Experts on Scene in Wake of Pittsburgh Shooting**

Following a mass shooting at a Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, synagogue on Saturday in which 11 people were killed and six injured, volunteers from two Israeli groups stepped up to help, [Israel21c](http://Israel21c) reported. ZAKA International Rescue Unit Chief Officer Mati Goldstein reported in Jerusalem that he was in phone contact with ZAKA Commander in Pittsburgh Rabbi Elisar Adom overnight. Adom, who was an active ZAKA volunteer in Israel before moving to America, gathered ZAKA Search and Rescue USA volunteers at the Tree of Life synagogue to recover human remains and prepare them for a proper burial, in cooperation with the local emergency forces and FBI and in accordance with Jewish law. "We grieve together with the Jewish community of Pittsburgh and pray for the full and speedy recovery of the wounded," said ZAKA Chairman Yehuda Meshi-Zahav in Jerusalem. "Our volunteers will also work with the community to offer assistance in all matters related to this tragic and horrific attack."

**Profile: CBH  
Miles Ladenheim**

What appears today is the abridged version of Miles Ladenheim's personal interview. Miles will be the first to admit that he's loquacious. He was born in Baldwin Harbor, Long Island, youngest of 4 children. His day school education began in an unexpected manner. He started out by attending Hebrew school after his secular classes. One day Miles had to stay after school for detention. While helping his teacher, she told him that there are schools where ½ day is devoted to Judaic studies and ½ day is reserved for secular studies. At an early age the dual curriculum appealed to Miles and his parents. Of course visiting HANC on a Rosh Chodesh helped to close the deal since there were lots of treats and fun activities. In 3<sup>rd</sup> grade Miles began the Hebrew Academy of Nassau County (HANC) and completed the program through 11<sup>th</sup> grade. He applied to Columbia early decision and became a biochemistry major. Miles chose medicine as his career path because in the 1970's he felt that it was more of a meritocracy than any of the other professions. After Columbia it was off to Downstate Medical School near East Flatbush in Brooklyn. Miles completed his residency at Hahnemann 1987-1991. Location is everything because shortly after starting his residency, Miles met Beth and then we all know what happened. Although Miles was interested in science, he always wanted to be a lawyer. Miles is a good test taker and doesn't require much sleep so he applied to Temple Law and was admitted. While working as a psychiatrist during the day, he attended law school at night from 1991-1995. Miles found law school intellectually stimulating and thrived in the classroom while working at the Girard Medical Center. He has continued to work as a psychiatrist, and only practices law for family and friends. Miles and Beth are the very proud parents to Lena, a nurse in New York, Brock, who made aliyah and serves in the Nahal unit of the IDF, and Ezra, who graduated Barrack Academy and attends college at the University of Miami. Currently Miles works as a psychiatrist in the Philadelphia Prison System in order to determine whether or not an individual is competent to stand trial and he also testifies at civil commitment hearings. Miles hopes one day to retire and move to Israel with Beth and Reagan, their intellectually gifted dog. Miles joined CBH in 2010 and his only regret is not having joined sooner.
