Riddle for Acharei- Mot Kedoshim

In the case of one particular sin punishable by "karet", a word is used to describe G-d's response that is not found in any other sin punishable by "karet". What is the sin, and what is the word?

Riddle for last week (Tazria Metzora)

In Parshas Tazria, find a verse that begins with a verb and ends with a verb, both of them having the same root.

Answer:

וְשָׂרַף אֶת־הַבְּגָד אוֹ אֶת־הַשֵּׂתִי אוֹ אֶת־הָעֶרְבַּב בְּצִמּוֹר אוֹ בַּפְּשָׁתִים אוֹ אֶת־כָּל־כְּלֵי הָעוֹר אֲשֶׁר־יְהִיָּה בּוֹ הִנָּעַ כִּי־צָרַעַת מִמֵּאֲרָתָהּ הוּא בָּאֵשׁ תִּשְׂרָף: (יג:גב)

"He shall burn the garment or the warp or the woof, of the wool or of the linen, or any leather article in which the lesion may be, for it is a malignant tzaraas, in fire it shall be burnt"
The Baal HaTurim explains that the verse begins and

ends with verbs of the root "שרף- to burn" as an indication that all items from which we are forbidden to derive benefit, must be burnt.

The commentaries explain that the implication of "מֵאֲרָתָהּ – a malignant tzaraas" is that "מֵאֲרָה – a curse" shall be placed upon it, and no benefit to be had from it. In his longer work on the Torah, the Baal haTurim explains this to mean that a curse has been placed on the garment and will eventually spread. Therefore it must be burnt.

The Ittur Bikkurim points out that this statement seems to contradict the Gemara (Temurah 32) which prescribes burial as the proper way to dispose of items from which we are forbidden to derive benefit. He suggests that the Baal haTurim does not mean literally all. (For further comment refer the Davis edition of the Baal Haturim p.1134)

Chill n Cholent in the Beit Midrash Shoval Malachi, Hesder Tzevet

Every Thursday night we, the tzevet, organize an event which is called Chill n Chulent.

We start the event straight after the 9:30pm ma'ariv in the Beit Midrash.



We begin with eating the food and a bit of free time to chill, and then we share a short dvar torah about "Parshat HaShavua".

After our stomachs are satisfied, we sing "ya echsof" accompanied by a guitar together with other Jewish songs and enjoy the company of each other.

Yom Hazikaron Exhibition Yotam Brandler, Hesder Tzevet

Two months ago, we were approached about creating the tzevet's annual Yom Hazikaron exhibition for all Yavneh secondary students and the wider community.

We immediately started to brainstorm and we thought how we could best make people connect to Israelis whom they have never met that have died for country they don't live in.

It first it seemed like an impossible mission: how could we be sure that the students could connect to the sense of loss, when for the majority of them the notion of an IDF soldier is something a bit distant - after all, most of them do not have siblings that served in IDF and most of them have never met someone who has actually died protecting Israel.

We decided to choose characters that we personally have some sort of connection with, and to find a way to pass these emotions on to audience.



We choose to study 3 people for the exhibition: Moshiko Dovino, a soldier who served in the same unit where Dov served 5 years later; Dafna Meir, with whom Ori had many mutual friends; and Ben Zion Brandler, my (Yotam's) uncle.

After a couple of days we were still unsure about the format of the exhibition. We had a couple of ideas but we didn't know which one would work best. We thought a bit more and we realised that we were not so different from the Yavneh students when it came to these 3 personalities: we had never met them either. We understood that the connection the Jewish people have with this day is far stronger than a physical connection; this connection comes from the understanding that they are the reason that our lives today, as proud Zionist Jews, are possible. We as the Jewish people know that the main thing in one's life is not material success. It's not about whether they are good at footy or how much money they earn; it's about their NESHAMAH, the light that each one of us is carrying. Our exhibition gave space for the light of each one of these characters to shine, to tell his/her story and what he/she fought for.

The exhibition tried to tell us their story through lights and darkness. But at the end of the exhibition we all sang Hatikva and Ani Maamin in the light, with the understanding that their death commanded our life and with the realisation that their light never really fades - we are here and our mission it to carry their light.

I have to share with you that before we did the first run of the exhibition, I didn't know what to think; I just knew that we had put a lot of effort and worked day and night for it, but I didn't know if it would touch people. Throughout the week there was one feeling that became stronger and stronger: to see people here, thousands of kilometres from Israel, feeling the same thing that we feel on this day was

outstanding. We, the Jewish people, are something special, and our connection to one another through our neshama is stronger than everything.
