#### FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

The Stories We Tell Make Meaning of the Events in Our Lives

Sometimes a pattern unfolds before we are able to see it. Then circumstance makes it so obvious we realize that life is teaching us an important lesson. The light comes on and we find we are aware of the message.

Quite a few years ago a book by Mitch Albom skyrocketed to be a best seller because it spoke not just in form but in content that was undeniably universal in its message. *Tuesdays With Morrie* was so much about the important life lessons this insightful teacher had to offer after living a full life and offered the time and the listening ear to share what he learned. The message was perspective combined with sincere relationship produces meaning, understanding and unconditional love. In this case it was between teacher and student.

About a year ago I came across an author that I just now had the opportunity to read as I have a little more time than I usually have. Fredrik Backman has a wonderful loving way of telling stories of significant relationships like a quirky man and his neighbors in A Man Named Ove, or in describing the relationship between a coach, a hockey player and their team in Beartown or in relating a story about the connection between an eccentric grandmother and her precocious seven year granddaughter in My Grandmother Told Me to Tell You She is Sorry. Backman treats us to the inner life of how people come together.

This month we read for the GHC Book Club a wonderfully imagined biography about a WWII vet, entrepreneur, excon, NASA scientist wannabe, retiree and the stories he tells to his grandson in an incredibly creative quasi-memoir by Michael Chabon entitled *Moonglow*.

All four books lead me to the same place each time and that was the relationship I had with my grandmothers. I was named after one of my grandfathers and the other passed when I was too young to remember, so my memories are only of my grandmothers. Every one of the stories I recall, is funny, inventive, meaning-filled, and evocative. With this time on my hands, I enjoy looking out the window of my home and just thinking about them. I recall the towns they came from and their idiosyncrasies. I recall the games we played and the rules for life we all learned from our grandparents. For example, decide what you want to eat before you open the "Frigidaire" (because that is what one grandmother called it, much like some call making copies xeroxing and others use only Kleenex when any tissue will do) so you don't waste electricity looking for something to eat. Or the other grandmother who insisted we sit for a half hour by the pool after we have eaten, so we do not get a cramp and drown.

I can only imagine how they would have fared during this crisis, but thankfully they did not have to endure it for they most certainly would have been in the category of most vulnerable given their advanced years when I knew them. They both were in nursing homes, one having struggled with dementia near the end of her life, the other with cancer.

There are many vulnerable populations whose lives have become more precarious given the dangers of COVID. The homeless are even more food insecure. Those whose livelihood demand in-person contact now find themselves without a source of income. People living in dangerous family circumstances are more prone to be a victim of domestic violence. Those who suffer addiction have less of the human support they need to overcome their addiction.

Those suffering from a variety of emotional challenges may find life even more difficult to negotiate. Those who need to go centers or hospitals for life sustaining treatments such as chemotherapy are taking incredible risks going out as are the health careprofessionals who are there all the time. And the list goes on Many of those people may not be defined as essential but mostcertainly are valuable and necessary to a robust and purposeful society.

Yet, I think about my grandmothers and the elderly in general. Our tradition reminds us *Minei Zakayn Takum*, before the elderly we must rise. It is a twofold commandment. 1. Showing respect by standing is one of the ways we show respect. 2. Give them your seat. They may need a little extra help because life may have worn them down. I ask you to do the same. Try to show those in our community who are more isolated, if that is even possible, they are not forgotten. Check on your neighbors who may be more advanced in years. Call them. Offer to shop for them. If you have little ones at home, have them make cards. If your grandparents are alive, ask them to tell you some stories. If you need to borrow a grandparent for this exercise find one. Their stories are amazing, inspiring, life affirming and connective.

If you are a grandparent or just the age of a grandparent and have not been blessed with biological grandchildren, find a couple of "adoptive grandchildren," and tell them your story. Read them a story.

You are valued and we have not forgotten you. We have just finished the holiday of Passover that commands us to tell our story. It instructs the children to ask questions to spark the conversation and if the child does not even know how to ask, the adult is required to jump in even without being prompted. The stories we tell are the way we make the meaning of the events in our lives. I cannot wait to hear the stories that emerge from this challenge which affects every aspect of our lives. It will most certainly be the context of the stories we tell our grandchildren it will certainly begin with, ""When I lived through

Our parents are thrilled and have shared their satisfaction with our ability to educate their children via distance Many have shared that GHC's outreach have exceeded expectations and often surpasses what has being provided by the public schools.

Every member of the congregation, who has supplied updated phone information to the office, should have received Check-in calls and Passover greetings from an amazing team of individuals who reached out not once, but twice and have agreed to continue to do so. Our Caring Community and Sato Committee have stepped up to provide assistance to those in need, when possible.

I have heard much praise for all that Amy Kessler and GHC's Religious School and Early Childhood Center teachers, as well as Rabbi and Cantor, are doing to continue teaching and engaging the children of our community. And although I am a member of the GHC Board, I have still appreciated receiving check-in phone calls from the Board representative who calls me.

The GHC office staff too have continued working diligently to keep us functioning. Despite the stress of the current situation, Madaline Bruno, Nalini Addanki and Jacquelyn Walker have remained in constant contact with one another and with me from their homes, helping one another as needed by email, text message and phone in order to get done everything that needs to be done administratively to support GHC. In addition to doing everything they can remotely, consistent with New York State's guidance, from time to time one member of the office staff goes over to GHC (without being in physical contact with anyone else) to handle those important functions that can't be done remotely. Thanks to their hard work and dedication and coordination with one another:


- If you call GHC and leave a voice mail message, your message will be promptly attended to. Madaline Bruno, Director of Office Services, will either call you back herself, or will forward your message to the appropriate person for a response.
- All mail being sent to GHC is being sorted and disseminated (usually scanned and e-mailed) to the appropriate recipient. Madaline is going over to GHC a couple of times per week to handle this; Nalini Addanki, Bookkeeper, is also going over to GHC at least once per week and sorting mail while she's there.
- All payments and donations being received by GHC are being deposited, and donations are being acknowledged. Please continue paying your balances and sending in donations! All payroll is being processed on time, and all payments that GHC needs to make are being made. Monthly financial statements are being

prepared, and all of the financial data that has been needed by our officers has been provided. Nalini has been doing as much as she can remotely, and comes to GHC as needed to do the rest. Madaline has pitched in as well to work on the preparation and processing of donation acknowledgements and the receipt and dissemination of payroll materials. GHC President, Naomi Feinkind, has been approving the letters and documents she need to approve electronically, as have the various officers who need to approve invoices, and Craig Mondschein has been keeping our payroll and financial systems functioning.

- Jacquelyn Walker, Administrative Assistant, set up GHC's computer systems so that they would work remotely, and she has worked with Madaline and Nalini to make sure that their remote computer access continues to function. She has continued to troubleshoot our remote setup as needed, and Rabbi Stein himself pitched in to help on an occasion when a computer needed to be physically restarted at GHC. Jacqui is also continuing to work on several technology systems projects that will improve how we do things going forward.
- Although a great deal of GHC communication is still being done by e-mail, phone calls, and Zoom, mail via the U.S. Postal Service still needs to be sent out, and is being sent out. Madaline has been making sure that this gets done, doing much of the work herself and coordinating with Nalini as to the bookkeepingrelating mailings. In addition, GHC directories are being updated, needs for supplies are being attending, and all of the other administrative tasks that need to get done are being done. And working with our wonderful Hamvaser editor, Allyn Salpeter, Madaline will have done the layout for this issue Hamvaser, and handled the printing of all copies that are being sent out by mail.

Thank you to Madaline, Jacqui and Nalini for keeping GHC's administrative functions functioning! Thank you as well to: Rene and Andrew, VP of Management Andy Weiss, and everyone else on the Management team for keeping our building in good order; Rabbi Jay Stein and Cantor Janet Leuchter, for attending to our spiritual needs even when we can't be together in person; Amy Kessler and our teachers for taking care of GHC's children; Naomi Feinkind for her loving, warm attention to all that needs to be attended to at this difficult time; Jeff Liss for the hard

#### **RELIGIOUS SCHOOL AND EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER**

On Wednesday, March 11<sup>th</sup>, we temporarily closed both our Religious School and Early Childhood Center quickly, and rather abruptly, due to concerns about the coronavirus. Perhaps this was a blessing in disguise, as we did this a few days before many full-day schools did so, and potentially limited some spread of the virus.

By that Sunday, less than four days later, our Religious School was completely up and running virtually. Every class is meeting on every day that religious school is scheduled, homework is assigned, and the faculty is prepared with complete lessons. We have also had a schoolwide virtual Pesach celebration, led by Rabbi Stein and Cantor Janet, which grandparents (many very isolated during this time) attended. We have a Yom Ha'Atzmaut virtual event planned for this coming Sunday, and the older students will even be able to join in on a Zoom video call with a second generation Holocaust speaker. Cantor Janet is working with every grade, and both Rabbi Stein and I have visited every class as well.

Our Early Childhood Center was up and running that Monday. Our teachers are doing individual FaceTime calls with our littlest students, class Zoom video calls, and sending home easy, accessible activities parents can try with their children. Our extended day program has continued virtually, and includes both activities, snack time, and time to just "hang" and socialize. Families and faculty have sent videos of read-a-louds, the children have virtual sessions of sign language, music, and even soccer. Every week we do a Shabbat celebration virtually with both Rabbi Stein and Cantor Janet.

This doesn't even cover all of what our schools are doing, and we have many fun virtual events planned for both schools in May. These will include a celebration for Cantor Janet's retirement and End of the Year Ceremonies!

The most important thing though, is the stability, continuity and CONNECTION our schools are providing to GHC families and students at this time. It is truly beautiful to see kids' faces light up when they see their classmates on a Zoom call. We give the students time to just talk, vent, show us something special from their home, tell jokes... These are some of the same children who complained (often!) about attending religious school every week. Maybe this time of being homebound will show them that COMMUNITY is what Judaism and GHC is about. It's not just about the history or Hebrew or holidays we teach tirelessly... It's about being there for each other, in times of crisis and fear, and hopefully soon, together again in

person for times of celebrations and joy.

The faculty has been especially extraordinary during this time. They have adjusted quickly, learned how to use technology that's new to them, and done so with complete professionalism. Our faculty has been flexible and dedicated, going well beyond the hours they anticipated for their part time positions. Teachers are helping their colleagues with the intricacies of Zoom features, collaborating on lessons, and supporting each other in countless ways. Our teachers have not only risen to the occasion, but have exceeded my hopes in this difficult situation.

Our schools will re-open as soon as it is safe. We miss you and your children so much! In the meantime, please register for our Early Childhood Center and spread the word about our amazing program and staff! We need to keep our program open! We offer a tuition discount for those who refer a family that enrolls. Our Religious School application will be out to all of you soon, and there will be a discount for those who enroll during the Early Bird period, so please be on the lookout in your email.

We've had several virtual staff meetings now for both the Religious School and Early Childhood Center. As it is when I join our schools' Zoom classes, it's wonderful to see our faculties' faces! At every faculty meeting I check in with our teachers, who are juggling the demands of home, parenting, other jobs, and the fear and worry inherent in this situation. Like I do at every staff meeting, I want to say THANK YOU/TODAH RABAH to our faculty, and recognize them here individually by name.
