FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

Sense of Freedom

There is almost no more kinesthetic holiday than Passover. It is a holiday that seeks to teach in almost every modality that exists. There is the auditory telling of the story; there are the olfactory and taste senses of smelling and eating the bitter herbs. There are the sights of the Seder plate and there is, of course, the synthesis of so many other senses through reading, reclining and, in some homes, puppeteering. One could write a pedagogic dissertation on why the mandate of our rabbis, "You shall teach this to your children" is both prescriptive and descriptive. The Seder is most certainly a master class in teaching and learning. Each of us learns differently and the Seder not only makes allowances for that but also encourages it.

I never imagined that we would arrive at a second Passover still under the weight of this pandemic. Passover is likely the most celebrated (perhaps apart from Yom Kippur) holiday in our faith, with many, many Jews observing it in some way or another. Yet health guidelines ask us not to be together again this year. The CDC asks us not to be "living room spreaders" which is likely to be very difficult for many. We feel your pain. So many have suffered this year from the isolation mandated by COVID. So many will not make it to our Sederim this year because they have passed away from COVID. Our hearts go out to all of you.

Each week when we celebrate Havdalah, we also use many of our senses. We see and feel the candle; we smell the spices; we taste the wine. Our senses are important to being alive and each week we remind ourselves that we have made it through another week. Our senses are so basic to our lives that-sometimes we take them for granted. Interestingly enough, there are those who first discover they have COVID because they lose their senses of smell and taste. For some that will be the only to know they have been infected. For some, like my daughter (thank God) it will be the only symptom they experience.


The loss of smell and taste was for my daughter a brief scare. Nothing lasting and certainly nothing lifethreatening. However, it was a brief reminder of the fragility of life. Losing one of our senses can change the way we interact with our world. Losing a loved one changes the way we see our world.

This year has been a year of confinement. It is a year of being imprisoned in our homes, sometimes by our own choosing, sometimes because of mandated lockdowns. Either way we have felt in a small way what it means to have our mobility hampered and our freedom curtailed. May this coming year permit us to emerge from the challenges that have kept us home and truly to appreciate greater freedom.

Pesach a Mano

It is now the month of Adar, when it is said that our joy and happiness increase - and we can certainly all use more joy these days! In Adar we celebrate Purim when the Jews were saved from destruction by the heroic Esther and Mordechai. This holiday reminds us that even when things seem darkest, there is still hope to overcome it and to harness the inner strength we didn't know that was in us.

Once Purim has come and gone, we all know what that means - Pesach is arriving soon!

We celebrate Rosh Hodesh Nisan on Sunday March 14th this year. In Nisan, Spring begins to show itself, bringing with it another chance for renewal - of plants and trees and flowers, and of our spirits. We prepare for Pesach - physically by ridding our houses of chametz (bread products), and emotionally, by letting go of thought patterns and behaviors that keep us from feeling fully free and ourselves.

There is a beautiful Ladino song about this moment between Purim and Pesach, by the wonderful Bosnian singer, composer and storyteller Flory Jagoda, who passed away just recently on January 29th, at the age of 97.

Jagoda was born in Sarajevo, and came to the US in 1946. Most well known for her Hanukkah song, "Ocho Kandelikas", she is one of the premier performers of Sephardic and Balkan music and was passionate about preserving Sephardic heritage and culture.

The song "Pesach a la Mano" (Passover is at Hand) is from her first CD, "Kantikas di mi Nona" (Songs of my Grandmother). The simple refrain, along with the mandolin and tambourine accompaniment, brings a sense of delight and almost childlike excitement about preparing for the upcoming festival. The food being cooked (the "japrakis" are a traditional dish of stuffed grape leaves), the corners being cleaned, and the Rabbis explaining the laws of Pesach, all paint a vivid picture of this special time leading up to the holiday.

I wish everyone a joyful, meaningful Pesach, and hope this song inspires you to take delight in preparing for it.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As President of the Greenburgh Hebrew Center I was delighted to have the opportunity to nominate Dr. Andrew Goldstein for the Julian Y. Bernstein Distinguished Service Award. Dr. Goldstein truly embodies the concept of AVODAH, service. I am grateful to the selection committee of the Westchester Jewish Council for recognizing what we at GHC already know. Please join me on March 16 at 7:30 pm as Andy Goldstein receives this most prestigious award.

The Julian Y. Bernstein Distinguished Service Award

There are not enough superlatives in the English language to describe Dr. Andrew Goldstein. Aside from being an outstanding Pulmonologist with a practice in White Plains, a caring husband, devoted father to two children, one with special needs, a phenomenal Vice President of Religious Affairs at the Greenburgh Hebrew Center, his leadership in navigating the congregation through the COVID-19 pandemic was extraordinary. His dedication to the safety and security concerns of the congregation was paramount. From the inception of the pandemic to the everchanging landscape we are experiencing today, Dr. Goldstein has adeptly responded to the needs of our congregation, as a Physician and as an Officer of GHC.

The Greenburgh Hebrew Center was in the midst of a Congregational Search for a new Cantor when Covid-19 reared its ugly head. Without missing a beat, Dr. Goldstein arranged for the congregation to livestream each of the candidates, worked with a team of individuals to develop and disseminate an online survey eliciting congregational preferences after viewing each Cantor, reviewed the results with the Cantorial Search Committee via zoom and negotiated the contract to retain our amazing new Cantor.

Under the guidance of Dr. Goldstein and in collaboration with our Educational Director, the Early Childhood Center and Religious School pivoted to virtual learning in early March, prior to any of the Public Schools in the Rivertowns. On May 26, 2020 as President of GHC, I established a ten-member Planning for the Future Task Force. Due to his involvement on this task force, his establishing of Protocols, Procedures and his development of a COVID-19 Questionnaire, GHC opened its doors for in person Shabbat services on June 13, 2020, with twelve in attendance inclusive of the Rabbi and Cantor. He supervised the slow escalation of attendance which has been capped at thirty. This gave our congregation the ability to provide a meaningful spiritual experience for those attending in person and for those watching from home. At the same time we were able to hone our skills in providing a safe environment in preparation for the High Holidays. Presently, he oversees Shabbat morning attendance, by reaching out to those having a Yarhzeit and accepting RSVPs from those asking to attend. He sends each prospective attendee a copy of the Protocols, Procedures and Questionnaire. On Shabbat morning he screens each attendee by reviewing the questionnaires, collecting the index card needed for contact tracing, taking temperatures and providing hand sanitizer. He instructs the attendees on the appropriate way to wear a mask and how to safely don and doff the gloves that are provided for anyone approaching the Bimah. Unfortunately, as the positivity rate has increased in Westchester Count, in person services were suspended on December 19, as recommended by Dr. Goldstein.

Our Rabbi and Cantor provided eight unique, meaningful and inspiring High Holiday Services. Dr. Goldstein provided the Screeners, Greeters and Ushers to assist those

In December, our children were provided spaces within our building, as it became too cold to remain out of doors. He provided Micro Cluster information to our parents.

Because of Dr. Goldstein's hard work and the dedication of our clergy, GHC is one of the few, Conservative Synagogues that has offered in person, albeit significantly smaller High Holiday and Shabbat services. For this we owe a debt of gratitude to Dr. Andrew Goldstein.



CARING COMMUNITY

Excellent Service Rabbi Jay M. Stein, D.D.

I love dining at elegant restaurants, not only because of the food but also because of the service. Sometimes there are so many people waiting on us that I have the sense that the entire staff is taking care of just us. A host seats us; a busboy brings us water and bread; a waiter comes over to take our order; another person brings the food; another clears the empty plates. It is more than efficient; we feel taken care of.

That is the primary goal of the Caring Community. Some reach out to the new parents; some reach out to those who have lost a loved one; some reach out to those who struggle with illness; some deliver a shiva meal; some write cards; some make a call just to check in. That is teamwork.

This week I received a call asking for help in connecting someone with a home health aide. I—thought that someone in our community must have had some personal experience with this situation and might be able to offer some insight. I reached out to the Sheila Greenwald, head of the Caring Community, because I knew she had had such experience. She said, "I don't even know this family." I responded, "it doesn't matter, I'll make an introduction."

Afterwards, Sheila let me know that they had connected and noted: "I called and although the agency we used didn't fit with her needs, she felt heard and was able to begin to talk about the challenges that lay ahead. I didn't feel like I was much help." I reassured her that she had been. We don't always know what kind of help we will be offering. Sometimes listening is the greatest mitzvah.

The phrase, "it takes a village to raise a child" is important but has significant application for us as adults as well. It takes a community to care for the soul of each of us. The Rabbis teach in Pirkei Avot, "the task is great, the master is insistent, the day is short and there is much work to be done". Yet, I prefer the words of "Housework" from *Free To Be You and Me*.

Children, when you have a house of your own,
Make sure, when there's housework to do,
That you don't have to do it alone.
Little boys, little girls, when you're big husbands and wives,

If you want all the days of your lives
To seem sunny as summer weather,
Make sure, when there's housework to do,
That you do it together!


