### FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

One of the markers of GHC is our willingness to try things and see what works and what does not, while we continue to strive to meet the needs of our community. One of the great programs that has found a wonderfully supportive and loving group is known as "Whine and Wine." Originally, it was meant to be a series for a variety of people in different life circumstances but the one that took hold is group for adults caring for aging parents.

So far, this is what I have learned:

There is a commandment to honor your mother and father and, although it is hard to observe that law, this does not let us off the hook.

When we cannot meet every need our parents have, that does not mean we have failed.

When we have to choose between our children, our family, ourselves and our parents, the decision is never easy and never right or wrong.

We all need people in our lives who listen and are sympathetic.

We would love to spend the last years of our parents' lives talking about the important life lessons they have learned, or reviewing wonderful memories. Yet, sometimes we get bogged down in the minutia of obtaining for them the best care possible and our interactions are often hijacked by aggravating conversations.

We have learned together how to have conversations about the big issues, not just the mundane ones, such as whether they have a DNR (do not resuscitate order or a living will). We have brainstormed about the conversations we want to have, such as what is their proudest accomplishment or what are the values they have lived by, or what is their favorite story about their growing up.

Together we share the challenges of care and proximity, sibling involvement or others' expectations as to our time and our attention. We talk about what we think is best for our parents and what others think. We share strategies of self-talk and how to change the conversation with our parents. We find the balance of what we should do and what can be done by others, including our siblings, if we have them. We talk ourselves off the ledge of frustration and the real grief of seeing our parents as less than they always were.

I invite you to join us. We meet on Zoom, Some have a beer, some a glass of wine, some water. Some are eating dinner. Some come with a spouse, some come alone. We have a hard stop after one hour and you deserve at least one hour a month to process this milestone. The meetings are at 8:00pm and the next ones are on March 2nd and May 4th. (There is no meeting in April because of Passover.)

Did you know that our Early Childhood program will be extended to 6:00pm? We are now offering a full day program for those parents who work and need those extra hours. ### **CANTOR**

For the past few months, Scott's and my yard has become something of a cat sanctuary. A couple of cats started visiting our yard, and when we saw them we would feed them. One, in particular, started coming around more and more, and we named her "Bobbie" because we thought she looked like a bobcat. Then when the weather got very cold, we were worried about Bobbie and we bought a heated outdoor house for her. Bobbie has now made the vard her home, and us her adopted caretakers. We take turns going out to feed her and play with her. At first, Bobbie was very scared and skittish, but as she began to trust us more, she is become friendly and playful and now enjoys being petted and playing with sticks. She has not shown any interest yet in coming indoors, and our indoor cat Cookie would probably not be very happy with another cat in the house.

In Judaism, we have several traditions of showing kindness to animals. The concept of "tzaar baalei chayim", pity for living creatures, is a commandment against causing unnecessary suffering to animals. While it is not clearly delineated in the Torah, in the Talmud (Baba Metzia 32B), it is accepted as a Biblical commandment. It is derived from the verse Exodus 23:5, "When you see the ass of your enemy lying under its burden and would refrain from raising it, you must nevertheless help raise it". If you see the donkey of someone you hate has collapsed under its load, you must help it, despite your feelings towards the owner.

The Talmud also teaches us that we must feed our animals before we feed ourselves. In Gittin 62A we learn: "So says Rav Yehuda that Rav says: It is prohibited for a person to taste anything until he gives food to his animal, as it is stated in the verse: "And I will give grass in the field for your animals" (Deuteronomy 11:15), and only after-

ward is it written in that verse: "And you shall eat and be satisfied."" Based on the order of the wording in Deuteronomy 11:15, the sages extrapolate that we should only . eat once we have fed our animals.

It says in Proverbs 12:10 that "The righteous person regards the life of his beast". It is clear how much animals enrich and add meaning to our lives. Judaism reminds us of this and of our responsibility to show compassion to other living creatures.

### **GREEN TEAM**

Editor's Note: The following was the "Dvar Torah" that was delivered on the occasion of Green Shabbat, held on February 4.

As you know, I am a professor of geography, but I promise not to lecture to you today.

Today's Parsha is Beshalah. It is a well-known tale about the parting of the Red Sea, helping the Israelites go free and engulfing the Egyptians. As a teacher of geography, I find it a fascinating illustration of how water can be both life-giving and destructive. It is obviously more pleasant to consider the ways in which water nurtures and sustains us. Adult humans' bodies are 60% water, and with almost all health magazines and doctors advising us to drink a certain number of ounces a day, I know many of us are constantly schlepping around heavy bottles to sip from. We would not be able to grow our food without water, and I do not think many of us would be happy to sit in the sanctuary together if it were not for the good hygiene that water allows us. Judaism even incorporates the ritual washing of the hands and ritual bathing in the Mikvah.

But it is possible to have either too much, or not enough, of a good thing. We cannot survive at either extreme. At this very moment, seven western states compete for the water available to them from the Colorado River.

The threat of that river running dry is very real right now because of overuse! The Hoover Dam was built on the Colorado by WPA workers in the 1930's, before there was any significant population in the southwest, in a prescient attempt to control flooding and drought, to provide water for the growing agricultural economy and food for the nation, and to be a source of electricity for the growing population. Last month, the seven states were required by the federal government to come up with a plan for how they are going to conserve the dwindling water that is available, so it will be interesting to see how that story develops.

On the other side of the spectrum, let us think about California's deluge in recent weeks. A "series of atmospheric rivers" have hit that state hard, affecting people from Sacramento to Santa Barbara. Over 13.5 inches of rain fell in several weeks with more to come. California residents are dealing with massive damages and some loss of life. Adding to the problem is the fact that two decades of drought plus wildfires make California vulnerable to mudslides following heavy rains. The rains brought some relief for California's agricultural industry, which is the nation's largest domestic source of fresh food, but at what cost?

Looking further afield for another example, in Pakistan, in the summer of 2022, after heavy rains associated with summer monsoons, flood waters burst through dams on the Indus River, destroying life and property. Millions of people were left homeless. The monsoons are a regular occurrence, but they were made worse by rising sea levels caused by climate change. Climate change makes the flooding from the monsoons more intense. The floodwaters do not recede quickly, which means farmers cannot plant their wheat in autumn. Wheat is a staple in South Asia. If farmers do not plant wheat in time, they will not have a harvest to sell in the spring. Pakistan's reliance on dams also creates a false sense of safety as to the dams' protection of nearby areas. However, the dams can only protect the dam height. After that, the risks increase greatly that the dam will fail. Climate change has increased the intensity of these storm events.

According to news reports during the floods, Pakistan experienced the most rain in recorded history. With floods occurring both in the cities and rural areas, engineers and government managers found themselves having to make decisions about where they could control flooding, which geographic areas they could save and who might perish as a result. This demonstrates the devastating impact of climate change on a country that contributes little to the causes of climate change.

It is not only a matter of too much or too little water: Sometimes the available water is simply not fit for human use. Accessing clean water can still be a challenge in developing, emerging, and even developed, countries. There are 771 million people around the globe without clean water today, and in many regions of the world, the mortality rate of children under five is climbing because of it.

Poor communities do not necessarily have the economic, organizational and political resources to fight against the big corporations controlling water resources. And we do not have to look overseas for an example. One area in Louisiana is actually referred to as Cancer Alley, because the manufacturing of a material for scuba diving suits pollutes the water and soil, and has sickened many people in the adjacent community of poor Black residents.

So what can we, as individuals do? The EPA recommends fixing your leaks to conserve water in the bathroom, kitchen and laundry. Of the estimated 29 billion gallons of water used daily by households in the United States, nearly 9 billion gallons, or 30 percent, is devoted to outdoor water use. In the hot summer months, or in dry climates, a household's outdoor water use can be as high as 70 percent. The average family spends \$1,100 per year in water costs, but can save \$350 from retrofitting with WaterSense labeled fixtures and ENERGY STAR® qualified appliances. It might not seem like much, but it is a good start.

I would like to conclude by reading a quote from Rachel Carson, a celebrated environmentalist, from *The Sea Around Us*:

"It is a curious situation that the sea, from which life first arose, should now be threatened by the activities of one form of that life. But the sea, though changed in a sinister way, will continue to exist; the threat is rather to life itself."

This is a call to action written in the 1960's that still holds truth today. Shabbat Shalom.

### Ingredients

2 cups old fashioned oats

1/4 cup brown sugar

1/4 cup maple syrup

1 1/2 tsp baking powder

1/4 tsp salt

1/4 cup flax meal

1/2 tsp cinnamon

1/2 cup peanut butter

1/4 cup applesauce

1/2 cup non-dairy milk

1 tsp vanilla

### Instructions

Preheat your oven to 350 degrees F. Take an 8×8 pan and spray it with cooking spray and set it aside.

Take a medium bowl and add all your dry ingredients; oats, brown sugar, salt, baking powder, cinnamon, and flaxseed.

Take a liquid measuring cup and add your wet ingredients; maple syrup, plant milk, applesauce, peanut butter, and vanilla.

Now mix the dry and wet ingredients plus any mix-ins\* you want until combined and then let sit for 20 minutes.

Let these cool before cutting or they will fall apart.

After the 20 minutes pour your mixture into your prepared pan and spread until even.

Bake in the preheated oven for 25-30 minutes.


