He was older when we joined Congregation Gates of Heaven so he was tutored privately in Hebrew by Chana Chutz and he enjoyed working with her.

He had his Bar Mitzvah at the Congregation and had a big party in Brooklyn where many of his relatives lived. We were very proud of him. He graduated from Shaker High School and Siena College where he majored in accounting. He worked for Ash Trading Corporation in Menands for many years.

Todd bought a townhouse and furnished it beautifully. He was an avid sports fan and he decorated his townhouse with memorabilia from the Yankees, Islanders and Cowboys. We went to see the Yankees many times and traveled to seven other stadiums such as Chicago, Seattle, and Toronto.

We would go down to see the Islanders play in Long Island and we even saw a Dallas football game in Buffalo and Philadelphia. He enjoyed spending time with his nieces and nephews and he instilled a love of sports in them. His leisure activities included going bowling and playing golf.

Unfortunately, when Todd was thirty, he was diagnosed with diabetes. Three years ago, diabetes led to kidney disease and problems with his heart. The nurses at the dialysis center took care of him but he was too sick.

Todd was a devoted son. I do not drive so he would get up early in the morning and take me to Shaker High School where I worked as a substitute teacher. When my husband became ill, he would take me shopping and any place I had to go. We miss him and will always love him.

Tribute in memory of Bertram Bloch

Bertram Bloch was a proud son of Brooklyn. He absolutely adored his bride Roberta, and treasured the 72 years they shared. He was able to trace his Brooklyn heritage to his great grandparents who arrived from Germany in the 1840's.

A graduate of Brooklyn College and Brooklyn Law School, he and his family arrived in Niskayuna in 1969, and their first act was joining Temple Gates. They enjoyed the Havurah and the friendships they had. Bert worked for the State in many departments, but had an impact in helping from the beginning with the Office of Professional Medical Conduct.

He thoroughly enjoyed retirement as well. He loved walking his dog, or canoeing on the Mohawk, and was always available to be with his grandsons. He and Roberta did volunteer ushering, spending almost every evening at Saratoga Performing Arts during the summer. Those evenings were magical, and there were many special performances. They also traveled, spending a winter in Casa del Sol in Spain, as well as many European tours.

He taught us about extended family, and responsibility. We would drive to Brooklyn before a holiday (stopping at his favorite Chinatown restaurant) and literally pick up his parents in front of their house and drive back up. He and Roberta were caregivers for her aunt and uncle, and his parents, for many years. When the last of them passed in 2000, they loaded the car and drove to 'where the snowball melts' in Boynton Beach. They created a new life there, thoroughly exploring a new location and making many new friends. He found a group of those interested in history as well, and had many pleasant times there.

He is survived by his special Roberta- they were always holding hands and were inseparable, Karen and Gerry Hausler of Niskayuna, their three sons Andrew David and Theodore and his wife Jessica and their daughter Aviva (he always said she was the one who moved him up a generation), Michael and Denice of Colorado and their three sons and spouses- Logan and Ashley and son Link, Taylor and newly married Devon and Lauren. The grandsons will always remember the family cruises where they were able to spend time together, and they reciprocated by visiting in Florida as frequently as possible. All think of him with smiles, and the conversations and lessons will remain with us.

Tribute in memory of Maria Maisel

Maria Maisel was born on November 12, 1926 in what was called Czechoslovakia at the time to her parents Oskar and Anastacia. She was joined by her younger brother Roland in 1941.

After a beautiful childhood, Maria experienced the horrors of invasion by the Nazis and then the Russians before she fled to the United States in her early twenties.

In the States, Maria went to college and lived in New York City before meeting her future husband, Harvey, in Schenectady, New York, when she worked managing his dental practice. They were married in 1959, and Maria gave birth to her daughter Deborah that year and her son David in 1962.

In the 1960s and 1970s, Maria was very active in athletics like golf and skiing as well as the Sisterhood at Temple Gates of Heaven. She also traveled to Europe frequently with Debbie and David to visit her father and brother.

Unfortunately, Debbie came down with Lupus in her early teens, and Harvey and Maria were busy caring for Debbie until her passing in 1988. Harvey also became ill with cardiac issues in the 1980s and passed away in 1987.

Maria spent the last third of her life between Clifton Park, New York and the various places David lived, including Los Angeles since 2003. She also traveled with friends, relatives, and David to Hawaii and across the western United States including Las Vegas.

Her passions included gardening, Scrabble, and hummingbirds. The past ten years she wintered with David in LA and spent Covid there with him until her passing on September 10, 2022.

Maria was extremely intelligent and diligent in everything that was needed and had full faith in God and a love of the Jewish traditions. Since my father was always at his grocery store, Bernie became the male figure in Barry's life.

I can still see myself sitting on the carpeted steps of my parents' home, the coiled wire of the black wall phone coming through the banister to talk with Bernie. He called me at least once a day, sometimes more. Often, we were just sat quiet, listening to each other breathe until someone yelled, "Get off the phone already, why don't you?"

Knowing that I was deeply invested in art, Bernie, who knew nothing about art, began taking art books out of the library and studying them to have more in common with me. It was Bernie who looked through the Times each week to find what was showing in museums and galleries. I would watch him stand in front of a painting, staring at it with as much concentration as he watched the Yankees play.

Once when we were dating, we were at the beach when the sky darkened, and the birds began flapping madly away. "A storm's coming," I shouted, but Bernie refused to leave. The wind came on so strong that it lifted me inches from the sand. Bernie grabbed my hands and hung onto me and I knew then he would always hold onto me, and he proved it.

When we were engaged, we had a big argument. The next day, he drove to my college, Queens College, where it took at least an hour of circling Kissena Boulevard to get a parking spot. He stood on a footbridge overlooking the campus that was teeming with students, among them Simon & Garfunkel, and somehow, out of everyone milling along, he spotted me. He got down on one knee, proffering the ring, and asked, for the second time, "Will you marry me?" People stopped to watch. It was like a live rom-com.

"Yes," I said, and we were back in each other's arms. The onlookers applauded.

Bernie always held my hand as we walked, my lifeline pressed against his. As we got older, people would call out to us, "Good to see you are still in love."

And that love grew with the enjoyment of our grandchildren. Bernie would do anything to see them, drive in any weather, face any traffic snarls. Bernie was the left side of my brain, my NorthStar. Where would we have gotten without him?

Whenever I misplaced something, which was always, all I had to do was say, "Bernie, where is..." And before he answered, I saw it.

For 35 years, he worked at Campbell Plastics. People respected his strong work ethic, from production workers, to office staff, to fellow managers. Everyone liked Sid. He never left a job undone, and he always gave 100% to any of his projects.

Sidney enjoyed listening to Dixieland jazz and big band music. For decades he was a ham radio operator who enjoyed speaking with people near and far. Later in life, he traveled with Ann to National Parks and Civil War battlefields. Four months in Sarasota each winter became a special part of their lives. (Seeking out breakfast spots was always an important part of any trip.) He was proud to be the founder and organizer of a weekly lunch group called ROMEO – “Retired Old Men Eating Out.” It didn’t get any better than that!

Most of all, he loved his six grandchildren: Ilana, Talia, Lucas, Elazar, Yedidiah, and Yochanan. He texted each of them, requesting updates on their latest activities. Whenever he was lucky enough to speak with one of the grandchildren, he was sure to say: “How’s my *sheyne punim*?” And it goes without saying that he also cherished his two daughters-in-law, Cathy and Yoninah, and treated them as if they were his very own daughters.

Sidney was a good man, a simple soul. We miss him dearly, every day, and forever.

We had many laughs remembering how the older ladies, dangling their feet in the water, would yell at us "don't splash, I just had my hair set." That saying became our code for the times when one of us was reluctant to act on something. We had a great uncle who always said he had soup on the stove as his way of ending a phone conversation. Jonathan and I often ended our lengthy conversations with "gotta go, I have soup on the stove."

Even though Jonathan was 6 years older than me, every teacher I had remembered him as a stellar student, a tough legacy to follow. As we got older and after his divorce, our bond became stronger as I did what I could to support him and Seth. We used to laugh that he was a chick magnet at the local parks because he had the most adorable son and a cute lab mix. Jonathan was a single parent during a time when men didn't often have full custody and there were few supports that were male specific. Despite this, he was a great father who delighted in Seth's accomplishments. Jonathan was a doting grandfather who often spoke of "Emmaisms" that were both hilarious and endearing.

These past few years, Jonathan joined my family on the Cape during the summer. He enjoyed watching the many bird species that dotted the beaches and I suspect he may have been a “birder” in his old age. After dinner, Jonathan and my daughter, Elyse (an English major), would play scrabble where they would delight in challenging each other about whether a word was really a word.

In 2022, Jonathan came with us to New Orleans to celebrate my other daughter’s (Zoe) graduation. He had never been to NOLA, so we made sure he got to enjoy all of the highlights including the street musicians in the quarter, eating beignets and wonderful seafood, and participating in a second line. Jonathan made the intelligent choice not to imbibe in a hurricane.

It is hard to accept that I will never talk to my brother again. There is no one left to talk about our family folklore. There is both a presence of his absence and the absence of his presence that are heart wrenching.
