Regenerative Agriculture Rooted in Jewish Tradition

August Farm Update

July and August start the big months of harvest that we have all been waiting so patiently for. Tomatoes of all kinds. Flavorful and plentiful. Different varieties of zucchini, crunchy cucumber, herbs and leafy greens, garlic and peppers. We will see about our eggplant this year. And we are trying a few new things - just for fun... like celery and brussel sprouts. The challenges of growing food means that every year will bring surprises - good and bad. All of our baby Apples and Pears were stripped off the trees except for one individual Bosc Pear. My theory is that squirrels got to the trees one night and made off with all the immature fruit. Trying to find a solution to that for next year will be tricky. So far the grape vines look wonderful so we remain cautiously optimistic! And did I mention the delicious tomatoes?

Happy to report that our group of high school and college interns has settled in nicely. The farm stand that they run is open every Tuesday from 11:00 to 1:00. The produce is picked fresh that morning and the shopping experience couldn't be easier and safer. The mini-greenhouse is near completion which will allow us to start some mid-season seeds in a more controlled environment. Thank you to David Levitt, farm manager supreme, for his patience and skill in organizing the team to assemble the greenhouse. Thank you to Emma Schiffrin (chicken whisperer) for taking time to stop in and talk to the interns about the joy and challenges of raising chickens. Thank you to Aaron Stern (grape/wine connoisseur) who stopped by to explain some of the fun in growing grapes and for teaching all of us how to properly prune the grape vines. Thank you to John Chambal (creativity with ingredients seems limitless) for encouraging the interns to come into the

kitchen, pickle green tomatoes, try out a tomato soup recipe, homemade pizza and develop other sauces and stocks using our own ingredients. Lastly I had a fun time teaching the interns about the benefits of using native or near native plants in the landscape. We planted a new pollinator friendly garden in the community garden area - just inside the gate. We hope to slowly, over the years, integrate the baby self-seeded plants into the existing beds throughout the CSI property. I think everyone enjoyed the variety of activities and learned a lot. So a BIG thank you to our interns for offering up their time this summer.

Looking forward:

We always could use help tying up the tomato plants!

Our bird houses need to be opened and cleaned and re-hung.

Any crafty people in the community? We have a few projects in mind and spaces in need of outdoor signage.

Hoping to have a video and/or still photographic journal of the farm as it changes throughout the year.

THERE ARE A NUMBER OF WAYS TO PAY CSI! MANY OF OUR MEMBERS DONATE STOCK OR USE DONOR ADVISED FUNDS.

This is not meant to be professional tax or legal advice. It is highly recommended that you consult your tax adviser, estate planner and investment advisor to determine if this is the right move for you.

Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) - Taxpayers over 70½ are required to withdraw IRA funds to meet a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). The money you contribute using a QCD is not included in your adjusted gross income on your tax return, a better option than listing the donation as a simple charitable contribution.

Donation of Stock - If you have stock in your investment portfolio that has greatly appreciated over time, you can donate it and get a deduction on your tax return for the fully appreciated value.

Donor Advised Fund (DAF) - A donor-advised fund (DAF) is a program of a public charity that allows donors to make contributions to the charity, become eligible to take an immediate tax deduction, and then make recommendations for distributing the funds to qualified nonprofit organizations on their own timetable. With charities that have donor-advised fund programs, you can make irrevocable contributions to the charity, which establishes a DAF on your behalf.

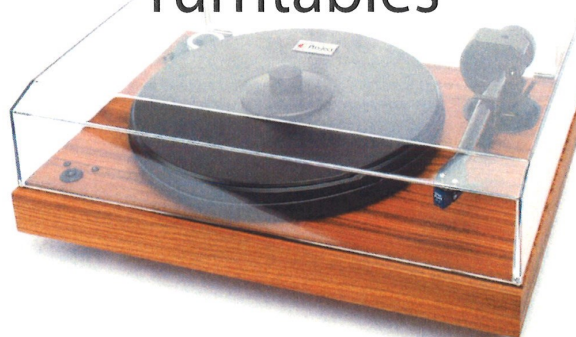

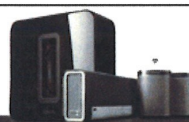
